<b><u>anatomy</u></b>	A study of the structure or internal workings of something. <i>He studied the <b>anatomy</b> of crimes.</i>
<b>arousal</b>	Mutual sexual fondling prior to sexual intercourse. <i>Sexual <b>arousal</b> in dreams is common.</i>
<b>biochemical</b>	A biochemical substance.
<b>biologic</b>	Relating to biology biological. <i>These natural <b>biologics</b> can be as potent as manufactured drugs.</i>
<b>biology</b>	The science that studies living organisms. <i>The <b>biology</b> of viruses.</i>
<b><u>body</u></b>	Build the bodywork of a motor vehicle. <i>The main <b>body</b> of the house was built in 1625.</i>

<b>cadaver</b>	A corpse. <i>The <b>cadaver</b> was intended for dissection.</i>
<b>catalyze</b>	Change by catalysis or cause to catalyze. Relating to cells.
<b>cellular</b>	<i>Any effective opposition to a totalitarian regime must be secretive and <b>cellular</b>.</i>
<b>clinical</b>	(of a disease or condition) causing observable and recognizable symptoms. <i><b>Clinical</b> depression.</i>
<b>corpse</b>	The dead body of a human being. <i>He believed that fascism would revive the <b>corpse</b> of Europe.</i>
<b>dissection</b>	Detailed critical analysis or examination one part at a time (as of a literary work). <i>This <b>dissection</b> of modern relationships.</i>
<b>ergonomic</b>	Of or relating to ergonomics. <i>The <b>ergonomic</b> hazards of computer use.</i>
<b>exercise</b>	Do physical exercise. <i>There are <b>exercises</b> at the end of each book to check comprehension.</i>
<b>fitness</b>	Fitness to traverse the seas. <i>They had to prove their <b>fitness</b> for the position.</i>
<b>function</b>	A mathematical relation such that each element of a given set the domain of the function is associated with an element of another set the range of the function. <i>Her liver is <b>functioning</b> normally.</i>
<b>metabolic</b>	Undergoing metamorphosis. <i>A <b>metabolic</b> disorder.</i>
<b>microbiology</b>	The branch of science that deals with microorganisms.
<b>motivate</b>	Cause (someone) to have interest in or enthusiasm for something. <i>He was primarily <b>motivated</b> by the desire for profit.</i>
<b>pathology</b>	The branch of medical science that studies the causes and nature and effects of diseases. <i>The <b>pathology</b> of Huntington s disease.</i>
<b>pharmacology</b>	The branch of medicine concerned with the uses, effects, and modes of action of drugs.
<b>physically</b>	In a manner relating to the body as opposed to the mind. <i>Cyberspace is a virtual place it does not <b>physically</b> exist.</i>

<b>physiology</b>	The branch of biology that deals with the normal functions of living organisms and their parts. <i>The <b>physiology</b> of the brain.</i>
<b>stimulate</b>	Encourage development of or increased activity in (a state or process). <i>The women are given fertility drugs to <b>stimulate</b> their ovaries.</i>
<b>stimulation</b>	The action of arousing interest, enthusiasm, or excitement. <i>The child needs plenty of <b>stimulation</b> as bored hands can make mischief.</i>
<b>tendinous</b>	Consisting of tendons or resembling a tendon. <i>The <b>tendinous</b> portion of the hamstring.</i>
<b>tissue</b>	Tissue paper. <i>A box of <b>tissues</b>.</i>
<b>vivisection</b>	The act of operating on living animals (especially in scientific research). <i>The <b>vivisection</b> of America s seamy underbelly.</i>
