| ascend | Slope upwards. <i>Carolyn s voice had ascended into high pitched giggles.</i> |
| ascending | The act of changing location in an upward direction. <i>The ascending plane.</i> |
| ascent | An upward slope or path that one may walk or climb. <i>His ascent to power.</i> |
| boost | Give a boost to be beneficial to. <i>A boost in exports.</i> |
| <u>climb</u> | A mountain hill or slope that is climbed. <i>The rate of climb can be set by the pilot.</i> |
| <u>climbing</u> | The sport or activity of climbing mountains or cliffs. <i>His other great interest was climbing especially in the Alps.</i> |
| <u>elevate</u> | Increase the level of (something). <i>She ordered the bishop celebrating Mass in her chapel not to elevate the Host.</i> |
| elevator | The airfoil on the tailplane of an aircraft that makes it ascend or descend. <i>First you trim the rudder then the ailerons and finally the elevator.</i> |
| escalator | A clause in a contract that provides for an increase or a decrease in wages or prices or benefits etc. depending on certain conditions (as a change in the cost of living index). |
| high | Of a sound at or to a high pitch. <i>Golf provides him with an adrenalin high.</i> |
| <u>hoist</u> | Raise or haul up with or as if with mechanical help. <i>A white flag was hoisted.</i> |
| ladder | With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. <i>One of Sally s stockings developed a ladder.</i> |

| lift | A wave that lifts the surface of the water or ground. <i>Lift a ban.</i> |
| mounting | The action of mounting something. <i>He pulled the curtain rail from its mounting.</i> |
| precipitate | A substance precipitated from a solution. <i>Excess moisture is precipitated as rain fog mist or dew.</i> |
| promote | Of an additive act as a promoter of a catalyst. <i>They are using famous personalities to promote the library nationally.</i> |
| raise | Multiply a number by itself a specified number of times 8 is 2 raised to the power 3. <i>Raise the roof.</i> |
| rise | Rise in rank or status. <i>He didn't rise to my teasing.</i> |
| risen | (of e.g. celestial bodies) above the horizon. <i>The risen sun.</i> |
| rising | Approaching (a specified age). <i>A rising market.</i> |
| scale | Especially of the skin form scales. <i>The skin may scale and peel away with itching stinging or burning sensations in the infected area.</i> |
| soar | Rise rapidly. <i>The bird spread its wings and soared into the air.</i> |
| soaring | (of a bird) maintaining height in the air without flapping its wings. <i>The soaring spires of the cathedral.</i> |
| stairs | A flight of stairs or a flight of steps. |
| stepladder | A short folding ladder with flat steps and a small platform. |
| underpin | Support, justify, or form the basis for. <i>The theme of honour underpinning the two books.</i> |
| uphill | Against difficulties. <i>He gave mountain biking clinics on handling steep uphills.</i> |
| upstairs | On or to an upper floor of a building. <i>No one was allowed to see the upstairs.</i> |
| upward | Spatially or metaphorically from a lower to a higher position. <i>From childhood upward.</i> |
| zoom | Cause a lens or camera to zoom in or out. <i>The value of these stocks is zooming.</i> |
