## Associations of "Pick up" (30 Words)

<b>ascend</b>	Slope upwards. <i>Carolyn s voice had <b>ascended</b> into high pitched giggles.</i>
<b>ascending</b>	The act of changing location in an upward direction. <i>The <b>ascending</b> plane.</i>
<b>ascent</b>	An upward slope or path that one may walk or climb. <i>His <b>ascent</b> to power.</i>
<b>boost</b>	Give a boost to be beneficial to. <i>A <b>boost</b> in exports.</i>
<b><u>climb</u></b>	A mountain hill or slope that is climbed. <i>The rate of <b>climb</b> can be set by the pilot.</i>
<b><u>climbing</u></b>	The sport or activity of climbing mountains or cliffs. <i>His other great interest was <b>climbing</b> especially in the Alps.</i>
<b><u>elevate</u></b>	Increase the level of (something). <i>She ordered the bishop celebrating Mass in her chapel not to <b>elevate</b> the Host.</i>
<b>elevator</b>	The airfoil on the tailplane of an aircraft that makes it ascend or descend. <i>First you trim the rudder then the ailerons and finally the <b>elevator</b>.</i>
<b>escalator</b>	A clause in a contract that provides for an increase or a decrease in wages or prices or benefits etc. depending on certain conditions (as a change in the cost of living index).
<b>high</b>	Of a sound at or to a high pitch. <i>Golf provides him with an adrenalin <b>high</b>.</i>
<b><u>hoist</u></b>	Raise or haul up with or as if with mechanical help. <i>A white flag was <b>hoisted</b>.</i>
<b>ladder</b>	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. <i>One of Sally s stockings developed a <b>ladder</b>.</i>

<b>lift</b>	A wave that lifts the surface of the water or ground. <i><b>Lift</b> a ban.</i>
<b>mounting</b>	The action of mounting something. <i>He pulled the curtain rail from its <b>mounting</b>.</i>
<b><u>precipitate</u></b>	A substance precipitated from a solution. <i>Excess moisture is <b>precipitated</b> as rain fog mist or dew.</i>
<b>promote</b>	Of an additive act as a promoter of a catalyst. <i>They are using famous personalities to <b>promote</b> the library nationally.</i>
<b>raise</b>	Multiply a number by itself a specified number of times 8 is 2 raised to the power 3. <i><b>Raise</b> the roof.</i>
<b>rise</b>	Rise in rank or status. <i>He didn't <b>rise</b> to my teasing.</i>
<b>risen</b>	(of e.g. celestial bodies) above the horizon. <i>The <b>risen</b> sun.</i>
<b>rising</b>	Approaching (a specified age). <i>A <b>rising</b> market.</i>
<b>scale</b>	Especially of the skin form scales. <i>The skin may <b>scale</b> and peel away with itching stinging or burning sensations in the infected area.</i>
<b><u>soar</u></b>	Rise rapidly. <i>The bird spread its wings and <b>soared</b> into the air.</i>
<b><u>soaring</u></b>	(of a bird) maintaining height in the air without flapping its wings. <i>The <b>soaring</b> spires of the cathedral.</i>
<b>stairs</b>	A flight of stairs or a flight of steps.
<b>stepladder</b>	A short folding ladder with flat steps and a small platform.
<b><u>underpin</u></b>	Support, justify, or form the basis for. <i>The theme of honour <b>underpinning</b> the two books.</i>
<b>uphill</b>	Against difficulties. <i>He gave mountain biking clinics on handling steep <b>uphills</b>.</i>
<b>upstairs</b>	On or to an upper floor of a building. <i>No one was allowed to see the <b>upstairs</b>.</i>
<b>upward</b>	Spatially or metaphorically from a lower to a higher position. <i>From childhood <b>upward</b>.</i>
<b><u>zoom</u></b>	Cause a lens or camera to zoom in or out. <i>The value of these stocks is <b>zooming</b>.</i>
