- *The flesh of a pig as food.*
- *Mold consisting of a bed of sand in which pig iron is cast.*
- *A greedy, dirty, or unpleasant person.*
- *An oblong mass of iron or lead from a smelting furnace.*

- *Domestic swine.*
- *A wild animal of the pig family; a hog.*
- *A young pig; a piglet.*
- *Uncomplimentary terms for a policeman.*
- *An omnivorous domesticated hoofed mammal with sparse bristly hair and a flat snout for rooting in the soil, kept for its meat.*

- brute**            A cruelly rapacious person.  
*He was a cold blooded **brute**.*
- bull**             A bullseye.

<b>cop</b>	Uncomplimentary terms for a policeman. <i>He had the <b>cop</b> on to stay clear of Hugh Thornley.</i>
<b>copper</b>	A reddish brown color resembling the color of polished copper. <i>She had <b>copper</b> coloured hair.</i>
<b>devil</b>	Expressing surprise or annoyance in various questions or exclamations. <i>The work of the <b>devil</b>.</i>
<b>fuzz</b>	A frizzy mass of hair or fibre. <i>His face was covered with white <b>fuzz</b>.</i>
<b>glutton</b>	Musteline mammal of northern Eurasia. <i>He s a <b>glutton</b> for adventure.</i>
<b>gobbler</b>	Male turkey. <i>Filling his mouth with rice and peas he really was a greedy <b>gobbler</b>.</i>
<b>gorger</b>	Someone who eats food rapidly and greedily.
<b>gourmand</b>	A person who enjoys eating and often eats too much.
<b>gourmandizer</b>	A person who is devoted to eating and drinking to excess.
<b>grunter</b>	A fish that makes a grunting noise, especially when caught.
<b>guzzler</b>	A person who eats or drinks something greedily. <i>He is a noted soft drink <b>guzzler</b>.</i>
<b>hog</b>	A wild animal of the pig family for example a warthog.
<b>monster</b>	A grossly malformed and usually nonviable fetus. <i>He was an unfeeling treacherous <b>monster</b>.</i>
<b>pig bed</b>	A coarse obnoxious person.
<b>piglet</b>	A young pig.
<b>porker</b>	A fat person.
<b>slob</b>	Muddy land. <i>He s a <b>slob</b> and expects others to clean up after him.</i>
<b>sloven</b>	A coarse obnoxious person.
<b>sow</b>	An adult female hog.
<b>squealer</b>	One who reveals confidential information in return for money. <i>His chances of further employment have been damaged because some will view him as a <b>squealer</b>.</i>
<b>sus scrofa</b>	Old World wild swine having a narrow body and prominent tusks from which most domestic swine come; introduced in United States.
<b>swine</b>	Something that is very difficult or unpleasant to deal with. <i>A contagious viral disease of animals that primarily affects <b>swine</b>.</i>

### Definitions of "Pig" as a verb

- *Gorge oneself with food.*
- *Live like a pig, in squalor.*
- *Give birth.*
- *Give birth to (piglets).*
- *Eat greedily.*
- *(of a sow) give birth to piglets; farrow.*
- *Operate a pig within an oil or gas pipeline.*



## Synonyms of "Pig" as a verb (8 Words)

- cram** Prepare (students) hastily for an impending exam.  
*They all **crammed** into the car.*
- devour** (of fire or a similar force) destroy completely.  
*He **devoured** three sandwiches.*
- farrow** (of a sow) give birth to (piglets).  
*Sows **farrow**.*
- fill** Fill to satisfaction.  
***Fill** the child with pride.*
- guttle** Eat greedily.
- pig it** Eat greedily.
- raven** Feed greedily.  
*The lions **ravened** the bodies.*
- stuff** Fill with a stuffing while cooking.  
*An old teapot **stuffed** full of cash.*

- *We've been pigging ourselves on all the cuisines in LA.*



## Associations of "Pig" (30 Words)

<b>animal</b>	An animal as opposed to a human being. <i>Tissues of <b>animal</b> and vegetable protein.</i>
<b>boar</b>	The flesh of the wild boar as food.
<b>camel</b>	A yellowish fawn colour like that of camel hair. <i>A <b>camel</b> coat.</i>
<b>carnivore</b>	A mammal of the order Carnivora. <i>Terrestrial <b>carnivores</b> have four or five clawed digits on each limb.</i>
<b>cat</b>	Used in names of catlike animals of other families e g native cat ring tailed cat. <i>This West Coast <b>cat</b> had managed him since the early 80s.</i>
<b>cattle</b>	Animals of a group related to domestic cattle including yak bison and buffaloes. <i>So many head of <b>cattle</b>.</i>



<b>deer</b>	A hoofed grazing or browsing animal, with branched bony antlers that are shed annually and typically borne only by the male.
<b>domesticate</b>	Make (someone) fond of and good at home life and the tasks that it involves. <i>The potato was first <b>domesticated</b> on Andean slopes.</i>
<b>domesticated</b>	Fond of home life and housework. <i><b>Domesticated</b> plants like maize.</i>
<b>equine</b>	A horse or other member of the horse family. <i><b>Equine</b> infectious anaemia.</i>
<b>fox</b>	The grey or reddish brown fur of a fox. <i>To his mind everybody was dodging and <b>foxing</b>.</i>
<b>goat</b>	A wild mammal related to the goat such as the ibex. <i>Just for once stop acting the <b>goat</b>.</i>
<b>graze</b>	(of an animal) feed on (grass or grassland). <i>Advertisers should not encourage children to <b>graze</b> on snacks or sweets.</i>
<b>herbivore</b>	An animal that feeds on plants. <i>Predatory carnivores and their <b>herbivore</b> prey.</i>
<b>livestock</b>	Farm animals regarded as an asset. <i>Markets for the trading of <b>livestock</b>.</i>
<b>mutton</b>	Meat from a mature domestic sheep. <i>A leg of <b>mutton</b>.</i>
<b>omnivore</b>	An animal or person that eats a variety of food of both plant and animal origin.
<b>piggy</b>	A child's word for a pig or piglet. <i>The <b>piggy</b> fat cheeked little boy and his porcine pot bellied father.</i>
<b>porcine</b>	Resembling swine; coarsely gluttonous or greedy. <i>His flushed <b>porcine</b> features.</i>
<b>pork</b>	A legislative appropriation designed to ingratiate legislators with their constituents. <i>Roast <b>pork</b>.</i>
<b>raven</b>	Large black bird with a straight bill and long wedge-shaped tail. <i>Thick <b>raven</b> hair.</i>
<b>ruminant</b>	Of or belonging to ruminants. <i>A <b>ruminant</b> animal.</i>
<b>sheep</b>	A member of a minister's congregation. <i>Party members should not follow their leader like <b>sheep</b>.</i>
<b>sloven</b>	A coarse obnoxious person.

<b>sow</b>	Place (seeds) in or on the ground for future growth. <i>The field used to be <b>sown</b> with oats.</i>
<b>squint</b>	Be cross eyed have a squint or strabismus. <i>Her left eye <b>squinted</b> slightly.</i>
<b>sty</b>	A pigsty. <i>The place is a real <b>sty</b> beer and wine bottles all over the place.</i>
<b>swine</b>	Stout-bodied short-legged omnivorous animals. <i>What an arrogant unfeeling <b>swine</b>.</i>
<b>venison</b>	Meat from a deer used as food. <i><b>Venison</b> steaks.</i>
<b>wildlife</b>	All living things (except people) that are undomesticated. <i>Chemicals could kill all the <b>wildlife</b>.</i>
