- *Shear (a sheep) so closely that the colour of the skin is visible.*
- *Become pink.*
- *Make light, repeated taps on a surface.*

<b>pigmentation</b>	The natural colouring of animal or plant tissue.
<b>pimpernel</b>	European garden herb with purple-tinged flowers and leaves that are sometimes used for salads.
<b>purple</b>	Roman Catholic Church official dress of a cardinal so named after the Tyrial purple color of the robes. <i>He was born to the <b>purple</b>.</i>
<b>red</b>	Red color or pigment the chromatic color resembling the hue of blood. <i>Moving the health authority out of the <b>red</b> will be a huge challenge.</i>
<b>rib</b>	A rib of an animal with meat adhering to it used as food a joint consisting of animal ribs. <i>The road was <b>ribbed</b> with furrows of slush.</i>

<b>rose</b>	A rose regarded as an emblem of beauty delicacy or purity. <i>Leaves with <b>rose</b> red margins.</i>
<b>roseate</b>	Used in names of birds with partly pink plumage e g roseate tern. <i>The <b>roseate</b> glow of dawn.</i>
<b>technicolor</b>	A trademarked method of making color motion pictures.
<b>tulip</b>	A bulbous spring-flowering plant of the lily family, with boldly coloured cup-shaped flowers.
<b>tusk</b>	Remove the tusks of animals. <i>A <b>tusk</b> tenon joint.</i>
<b>walrus</b>	Either of two large northern marine mammals having ivory tusks and tough hide over thick blubber.
