ascendancy	The state that exists when one person or group has power over another. The <b>ascendancy</b> of good over evil.




belfry	A bell tower; usually stands alone unattached to a building.
cone	Cone shaped mass of ovule or spore bearing scales or bracts. A <b>cone</b> of acrylic yarn.
crag	A shelly sandstone occurring in eastern England.
crest	The top or extreme point of something (usually a mountain or hill. A large game bird with a conspicuous erect red <b>crest</b> .
crowning point	The upper branches and leaves of a tree or other plant.
<u>elevation</u>	The height of a dancer's leap or jump. <i>Her sudden <b>elevation</b> to the cabinet.</i>
finial	An ornament at the top of a spire or gable; usually a foliated fleur-de- lis. <i>Curving gables topped by sculptured finials</i> .
<u>height</u>	Elevation above ground or a recognized level (typically sea level. <i>The glider is gaining height</i> .
high point	A state of sustained elation.
high spot	A state of altered consciousness induced by alcohol or narcotics.
highest level	A state of sustained elation.
meridian	A town in eastern Mississippi. At the end of February Jupiter transits the <b>meridian</b> due south at 6 15 a m.
minaret	Slender tower with balconies.
mirador	A turret or tower attached to a building and providing an extensive view.
mountaintop	The area at the top of a mountain. A snow covered <b>mountaintop</b> .
needle	A stylus that formerly made sound by following a groove in a phonograph record. There is already a little bit of <b>needle</b> between the sides.
obelisk	A mountain tree or other natural object resembling an obelisk in shape.
<u>peak</u>	The upper, outer corner of a sail extended by a gaff. The <b>peak</b> of perfection.
peak of perfection	The period of greatest prosperity or productivity.
pyramid	An object shape or arrangement in the form of a pyramid. <i>The lowest strata of the social <b>pyramid</b>.</i>
shikara	(in Kashmir) a houseboat.



<u>spire</u>	A tall tower that forms the superstructure of a building (usually a church or temple) and that tapers to a point at the top. <i>Spires of delphiniums.</i>
<u>summit</u>	The top or extreme point of something (usually a mountain or hill. <i>The summit of his ambition.</i>
superlative	The superlative form of an adjective or adverb. The critics lavished <b>superlative</b> s on it.
tip	A V shape. The northern <b>tip</b> of Scotland.
tiptop	The extreme top or summit.
top	The top or extreme point of something usually a mountain or hill. <i>Put your books on <b>top</b> of the desk.</i>
tor	A high rocky hill. Glastonbury <b>Tor</b> .
turret	A low armoured tower, typically one that revolves, for a gun and gunners in a ship, aircraft, fort, or tank. A castle with fairy tale <b>turret</b> s.
upper limit	The higher of two berths.
vertex	The highest point; the top or apex.
<u>zenith</u>	The point in the sky or celestial sphere directly above an observer. In 1977 punk was at its <b>zenith</b> .

<u>acme</u>	The highest point (of something. <i>His landscapes were deemed the <b>acme</b> of beauty.</i>
altitude	The apparent height of a celestial object above the horizon, measured in angular distance. <i>Flight data including airspeed and <b>altitude</b>.</i>
<u>apex</u>	The point on the celestial sphere toward which the sun and solar system appear to be moving relative to the fixed stars. The <b>apex</b> of his career was in 1966 when he hoisted aloft the World Cup for England.
apogee	The highest point in the development of something; a climax or culmination. <i>A film which was the <b>apogee</b> of German expressionist cinema.</i>



crest	The center of a cambered road. She <b>crest</b> ed a hill and saw the valley spread out before her.
edge	Provide with an edge. <i>The water s <b>edge</b>.</i>
elevated	Of high moral or intellectual value elevated in nature or style. <i>The <b>elevated</b> canon of great literary texts.</i>
<u>elevation</u>	A particular side of a building. As every gunner knows increasing the <b>elevation</b> beyond five degrees can be a risky business.
excrescence	An abnormal outgrowth or enlargement of some part of the body. The males often have a strange <b>excrescence</b> on the tip of the snout.
jag	Cut teeth into make a jagged cutting edge. <i>He clutched a <b>jag</b> of the rock.</i>
jut	Something that bulges out or is protuberant or projects from its surroundings. <i>His sharp nose jut</i> ted out.
ladder	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. One of Sally s stockings developed a <b>ladder</b> .
<u>lofty</u>	Haughty and aloof. <i>Lofty</i> intellectual disdain.
meridian	Relating to or situated at a meridian. All points on the same <b>meridian</b> have the same longitude.
minaret	Slender tower with balconies.
nadir	An extreme state of adversity; the lowest point of anything. Asking that question was the <b>nadir</b> of my career.
<u>peak</u>	The highest level or degree attainable; the highest stage of development. <i>The canal was restored to <b>peak</b> condition.</i>
<u>plateau</u>	A state of little or no change following a period of activity or progress. <i>The industry s problems have <b>plateau</b>ed out.</i>
projection	The projection of an image from a film onto a screen. <i>Quality illustrations for overhead <b>projection</b>.</i>
protrusion	Something that bulges out or is protuberant or projects from its surroundings. A <b>protrusion</b> of rock jutted from the mountainside.
raised	Embellished with a raised pattern created by pressure or embroidery. <i>Raised</i> needlework.



rung	A strengthening crosspiece in the structure of a chair. We must ensure that the low skilled do not get trapped on the bottom <b>rung</b> .
<u>summit</u>	Reach the summit of a mountain. In 2013 658 climbers <b>summit</b> ed Everest.
superlative	A superlative adjective or adverb. A <b>superlative</b> piece of skill.
top	Strike the top part of a ball in golf baseball or pool giving it a forward spin. <i>He couldn t get the top off of the bottle.</i>
towering	Of great intensity. Hari looked up at the <b>towering</b> buildings.
uppermost	At or to the highest or most important position. Investors put environmental concerns <b>uppermost</b> on their list.
vertex	The highest point; the top or apex.
wart	An imperfection in someone or something that is suggestive of a wart especially in smallness or unattractiveness. What a bunch of nauseating little <b>wart</b> s you are.
<u>zenith</u>	The time at which something is most powerful or successful. <i>The sun was well past the <b>zenith</b></i> .
