<b>amphibious</b>	Relating to or characteristic of animals of the class Amphibia. <i>Frogs are <b>amphibious</b> animals.</i>
<b>battlefield</b>	A region where a battle is being (or has been) fought. <i>The <b>battlefields</b> of the Great War.</i>
<b>belligerence</b>	A natural disposition to be hostile. <i>Mortimer was eyeing Guy with <b>belligerence</b>.</i>
<b>belligerent</b>	Engaged in a war or conflict, as recognized by international law. <i>A conference of socialists from all <b>belligerent</b> countries.</i>
<b>brunt</b>	Main force of a blow etc. <i>Bore the <b>brunt</b> of the attack.</i>
<a href="#"><u>combat</u></a>	An engagement fought between two military forces. <i>Electoral <b>combat</b>.</i>
<b>combative</b>	Inclined or showing an inclination to dispute or disagree, even to engage in law suits. <i>A <b>combative</b> impulse.</i>
<a href="#"><u>compete</u></a>	Compete for something engage in a contest measure oneself against others. <i>He <b>competed</b> in numerous track meets as a child.</i>
<b>conflict</b>	Be in conflict. <i>Doctors often come into <b>conflict</b> with politicians.</i>
<a href="#"><u>contend</u></a>	Be engaged in a fight; carry on a fight. <i>Militant groups are <b>contending</b> for control of the country.</i>
<b>crossfire</b>	A lively or heated interchange of ideas and opinions. <i>A photographer was killed in <b>crossfire</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>enemy</u></a>	A personal enemy. <i>He viewed lawyers as the real <b>enemy</b>.</i>
<b>fight</b>	Fight against or resist strongly. <i>Don t <b>fight</b> it.</i>

<b>fighting</b>	The action of fighting violence or conflict. <i>Review the <b>fighting</b> forces.</i>
<b>gamely</b>	In a brave, spirited way. <i>He battled <b>gamely</b> but was outclassed by his more experienced opponent.</i>
<b>hostile</b>	(of a takeover bid) opposed by the company to be bought. <i><b>Hostile</b> factions.</i>
<b>militant</b>	A militant reformer. <i><b>Militant</b> in fighting for better wages for workers.</i>
<b>naval</b>	Relating to a navy or navies. <i>A <b>naval</b> officer.</i>
<b>opponent</b>	Someone who competes with or opposes another in a contest, game, or argument. <i>An <b>opponent</b> of the economic reforms.</i>
<b>oppose</b>	Contrast with equal weight or force. <i>The senator said he would <b>oppose</b> the bill.</i>
<b>opposing</b>	(of two or more subjects) differing from or in conflict with each other. <i>Opponent or <b>opposing</b> armies.</i>
<b>outmaneuver</b>	Defeat by more skillful maneuvering. <i>The English troops <b>outmaneuvered</b> the Germans.</i>
<b>rival</b>	Be the rival of be in competition with. <i>Nothing can <b>rival</b> cotton for durability.</i>
<b>soldier</b>	Serve as a soldier. <i>I <b>soldiered</b> with your father on his last four campaigns.</i>
<b>tackle</b>	Grasping an opposing player with the intention of stopping by throwing to the ground. <i>I ll <b>tackle</b> this difficult task.</i>
<b>unbeatable</b>	Extremely good; outstanding. <i>An <b>unbeatable</b> ball team.</i>
<b>vie</b>	Compete eagerly with someone in order to do or achieve something. <i>The athletes were vying for a place in the British team.</i>
<b>warfare</b>	The waging of armed conflict against an enemy. <i>Guerrilla <b>warfare</b>.</i>
<b>warmonger</b>	A person who advocates war or warlike policies.
<b>win</b>	Be the winner in a contest or competition be victorious. <i>He was happy to get the <b>win</b>.</i>
