Associations of "Pitched battle" (30 Words)

amphibious	Relating to or characteristic of animals of the class Amphibia. <i>Frogs are amphibious animals.</i>
battlefield	A region where a battle is being (or has been) fought. <i>The battlefields of the Great War.</i>
belligerence	A natural disposition to be hostile. <i>Mortimer was eyeing Guy with belligerence.</i>
belligerent	Engaged in a war or conflict, as recognized by international law. <i>A conference of socialists from all belligerent countries.</i>
brunt	Main force of a blow etc. <i>Bore the brunt of the attack.</i>
combat	An engagement fought between two military forces. <i>Electoral combat.</i>
combative	Inclined or showing an inclination to dispute or disagree, even to engage in law suits. <i>A combative impulse.</i>
compete	Compete for something engage in a contest measure oneself against others. <i>He competed in numerous track meets as a child.</i>
conflict	Be in conflict. <i>Doctors often come into conflict with politicians.</i>
contend	Be engaged in a fight; carry on a fight. <i>Militant groups are contending for control of the country.</i>
crossfire	A lively or heated interchange of ideas and opinions. <i>A photographer was killed in crossfire.</i>
enemy	A personal enemy. <i>He viewed lawyers as the real enemy.</i>
fight	Fight against or resist strongly. <i>Don t fight it.</i>

fighting	The action of fighting violence or conflict. <i>Review the fighting forces.</i>
gamely	In a brave, spirited way. <i>He battled gamely but was outclassed by his more experienced opponent.</i>
hostile	(of a takeover bid) opposed by the company to be bought. <i>Hostile factions.</i>
militant	A militant reformer. <i>Militant in fighting for better wages for workers.</i>
naval	Relating to a navy or navies. <i>A naval officer.</i>
opponent	Someone who competes with or opposes another in a contest, game, or argument. <i>An opponent of the economic reforms.</i>
oppose	Contrast with equal weight or force. <i>The senator said he would oppose the bill.</i>
opposing	(of two or more subjects) differing from or in conflict with each other. <i>Opponent or opposing armies.</i>
outmaneuver	Defeat by more skillful maneuvering. <i>The English troops outmaneuvered the Germans.</i>
rival	Be the rival of be in competition with. <i>Nothing can rival cotton for durability.</i>
soldier	Serve as a soldier. <i>I soldiered with your father on his last four campaigns.</i>
tackle	Grasping an opposing player with the intention of stopping by throwing to the ground. <i>I ll tackle this difficult task.</i>
unbeatable	Extremely good; outstanding. <i>An unbeatable ball team.</i>
vie	Compete eagerly with someone in order to do or achieve something. <i>The athletes were vying for a place in the British team.</i>
warfare	The waging of armed conflict against an enemy. <i>Guerrilla warfare.</i>
warmonger	A person who advocates war or warlike policies.
win	Be the winner in a contest or competition be victorious. <i>He was happy to get the win.</i>
