
### Pitfall as a Noun

booby trap	Drain consisting of a U-shaped section of drainpipe that holds liquid and so prevents a return flow of sewer gas.
catch	Anything that is caught especially if it is worth catching. It sounds good but what s the <b>catch</b> .
danger	A dangerous place. <i>He moved out of <b>danger</b>.</i>
difficulty	A factor causing trouble in achieving a positive result or tending to produce a negative result. I managed with <b>difficulty</b> to struggle upright.
<u>drawback</u>	The quality of being a hindrance. They had been complaining of difficulties in getting quick reimbursement of duty <b>drawback</b> .
<u>hazard</u>	An obstacle on a golf course. We can form no calculation concerning the laws of <b>hazard</b> .



issue	Supplies as food or clothing or ammunition issued by the government. She found an old <b>issue</b> of the magazine in her dentist s waiting room.	
peril	A state of danger involving risk. You could well place us both in <b>peril</b> .	
<u>pit</u>	A person s armpit. <i>Pooled commodity funds liquidated positions in the corn and soybean</i> <b>pit</b> s.	
problem	A matter or situation regarded as unwelcome or harmful and needing to be dealt with and overcome. <i>She and her husband are having problems.</i>	
risk	A person or thing regarded as likely to turn out well or badly in a particular context or respect. <i>Western banks regarded Romania as a good <b>risk</b>.</i>	
snag	A rent or tear in fabric caused by a snag. <i>There s one small <b>snag</b>.</i>	
stumbling block An unintentional but embarrassing blunder.

# Associations of "Pitfall" (30 Words)

barrier	A structure or object that impedes free movement. Intolerance is a <b>barrier</b> to understanding.
block	The length of one side of a block especially as a measure of distance. <i>A family <b>block</b> of ice cream.</i>
dangerous	Able or likely to cause harm or injury. It is <b>dangerous</b> to convict on his evidence.
deterrent	Something immaterial that interferes with or delays action or progress. The <b>deterrent</b> effect of heavy prison sentences.



difficulty	A factor causing trouble in achieving a positive result or tending to produce a negative result. I managed with <b>difficulty</b> to struggle upright.
<u>disability</u>	A disadvantage or handicap, especially one imposed or recognized by the law. <i>Reading disability.</i>
<u>disrupt</u>	Drastically alter or destroy the structure of. <i>Our 3D printing technology is <b>disrupt</b>ing the traditional manufacturing industry.</i>
<u>distraction</u>	Mental turmoil. <i>He drives me to <b>distraction</b>.</i>
hinderance	The act of hindering or obstructing or impeding.
<u>hindrance</u>	The act of hindering or obstructing or impeding. A <b>hindrance</b> to the development process.
<u>hurdle</u>	Enclose or fence off with hurdles. All 450 runners had <b>hurdle</b> d the barriers.
<u>impediment</u>	A hindrance or obstruction in doing something. A serious <b>impediment</b> to scientific progress.
inconvenience	To cause inconvenience or discomfort to. The <b>inconvenience</b> of having to change trains.
incubus	A male demon believed to lie on sleeping persons and to have sexual intercourse with sleeping women. Debt is a big <b>incubus</b> in developing countries.
insuperable	(of a difficulty or obstacle) impossible to overcome. <i>Insuperable</i> heroes.
interference	Electrical or acoustic activity that can disturb communication. An unwarranted <b>interference</b> with personal liberty.
nuisance	A bothersome annoying person. I hope you re not going to make a <b>nuisance</b> of yourself.
obstacle	A thing that blocks one's way or prevents or hinders progress. Lack of imagination is an <b>obstacle</b> to one s advancement.
obstruction	The physical condition of blocking or filling a passage with an obstruction. <i>He was charged with obstruction of a police officer in the execution of his duty.</i>
parlous	Full of danger or uncertainty; precarious. She is <b>parlous</b> handsome.



<u>perilous</u>	Exposed to imminent risk of disaster or ruin. A <b>perilous</b> journey south.
retardation	The action of delaying or slowing the progress or development of something. The goals of treatment include <b>retardation</b> of disease progression.
risk	Take a risk in the hope of a favorable outcome. Why <b>risk</b> your life.
<u>risky</u>	Risqu. Extremely <b>risky</b> going out in the tide and fog.
snag	Catch on a snag. I <b>snag</b> ged my stocking.
stumble	Trip or momentarily lose one's balance; almost fall. <i>Her foot caught in the rug and she <b>stumble</b>d.</i>
threatened	Likely in the near future to become endangered. The spotted owl is a <b>threatened</b> species not yet an endangered one.
<u>trap</u>	Catch an animal in a trap. By keeping quiet I was walking into a <b>trap</b> .
unsafe	Lacking in security or safety. Drinking water in some areas may be <b>unsafe</b> .
