## Associations of "Pitied" (30 Words)

<b>compassion</b>	Sympathetic pity and concern for the sufferings or misfortunes of others. <i>The victims should be treated with <b>compassion</b>.</i>
<b>compassionate</b>	Feeling or showing sympathy and concern for others. <i>Heard the soft and <b>compassionate</b> voices of women.</i>
<b>deplorable</b>	Shockingly bad in quality. <i>A <b>deplorable</b> act of violence.</i>
<a href="#">disastrous</a>	Highly unsuccessful. <i>United made a <b>disastrous</b> start to the season.</i>
<a href="#">empathetic</a>	Showing empathy or ready comprehension of others' states. <i>A sensitive and <b>empathetic</b> school counselor.</i>
<b>empathy</b>	Understanding and entering into another's feelings.
<b>frivolousness</b>	The trait of being frivolous; not serious or sensible.
<b>goodwill</b>	The friendly hope that something will succeed. <i>A <b>goodwill</b> gesture.</i>
<b>hangdog</b>	Frightened into submission or compliance. <i>The <b>hangdog</b> look of a condemned man.</i>
<b>hapless</b>	Deserving or inciting pity. <i>The <b>hapless</b> victims of the disaster.</i>
<b>lamentable</b>	Bad; unfortunate. <i>The <b>lamentable</b> friends trailing their long black garments.</i>
<a href="#">loser</a>	A person who fails frequently or is generally unsuccessful in life. <i>They should concede that we won and be good <b>losers</b>.</i>
<b>merciful</b>	(of an event) coming as a mercy; bringing someone relief from something unpleasant. <i>A <b>merciful</b> god.</i>

<u>mercy</u>	(especially of a journey or mission) performed out of a desire to relieve suffering. <i>He threw himself on the <b>mercy</b> of the court.</i>
<b>moving</b>	In motion. <i>The <b>moving</b> parts of the machine.</i>
<u>pathetic</u>	Inspiring mixed contempt and pity. <i>She looked so <b>pathetic</b> that I bent down to comfort her.</i>
<u>pathos</u>	A feeling of sympathy and sorrow for the misfortunes of others. <i>The film captured all the <b>pathos</b> of their situation.</i>
<b>piteous</b>	Deserving or arousing pity. <i><b>Piteous</b> appeals for help.</i>
<b>pitiable</b>	Deserving or inciting pity. <i><b>Pitiable</b> homeless children.</i>
<u>pitiful</u>	Deserving or inciting pity. <i>A <b>pitiful</b> attempt to impress her.</i>
<b>poignancy</b>	A quality that arouses emotions (especially pity or sorrow). <i>A moment of extraordinary <b>poignancy</b>.</i>
<b>regretful</b>	Feeling or showing regret. <i>Felt <b>regretful</b> over his vanished youth.</i>
<b>regrettable</b>	(of conduct or an event) giving rise to regret; undesirable; unwelcome. <i><b>Regrettable</b> remarks.</i>
<b>ruth</b>	United States professional baseball player famous for hitting home runs (1895-1948).
<u>sorry</u>	Causing dejection. <i>I m <b>sorry</b> if I was a bit brusque.</i>
<u>sympathetic</u>	Of or relating to the sympathetic nervous system. <i>Buildings that were <b>sympathetic</b> to their surroundings.</i>
<u>sympathy</u>	Feelings of pity and sorrow for someone else's misfortune. <i>The special <b>sympathy</b> between the two boys was obvious to all.</i>
<b>touching</b>	The act of putting two things together with no space between them. <i>Your loyalty is very <b>touching</b>.</i>
<u>tragic</u>	Very sad; especially involving grief or death or destruction. <i><b>Tragic</b> hero.</i>
<u>unfortunate</u>	Not auspicious; boding ill. <i>His <b>unfortunate</b> remark silenced the gathering.</i>
