Associations of "Pitied" (30 Words)

compassion	Sympathetic pity and concern for the sufferings or misfortunes of others. <i>The victims should be treated with compassion.</i>
compassionate	Feeling or showing sympathy and concern for others. <i>Heard the soft and compassionate voices of women.</i>
deplorable	Shockingly bad in quality. <i>A deplorable act of violence.</i>
disastrous	Highly unsuccessful. <i>United made a disastrous start to the season.</i>
empathetic	Showing empathy or ready comprehension of others' states. <i>A sensitive and empathetic school counselor.</i>
empathy	Understanding and entering into another's feelings.
frivolousness	The trait of being frivolous; not serious or sensible.
goodwill	The friendly hope that something will succeed. <i>A goodwill gesture.</i>
hangdog	Frightened into submission or compliance. <i>The hangdog look of a condemned man.</i>
hapless	Deserving or inciting pity. <i>The hapless victims of the disaster.</i>
lamentable	Bad; unfortunate. <i>The lamentable friends trailing their long black garments.</i>
loser	A person who fails frequently or is generally unsuccessful in life. <i>They should concede that we won and be good losers.</i>
merciful	(of an event) coming as a mercy; bringing someone relief from something unpleasant. <i>A merciful god.</i>

<u>mercy</u>	(especially of a journey or mission) performed out of a desire to relieve suffering. <i>He threw himself on the mercy of the court.</i>
moving	In motion. <i>The moving parts of the machine.</i>
<u>pathetic</u>	Inspiring mixed contempt and pity. <i>She looked so pathetic that I bent down to comfort her.</i>
<u>pathos</u>	A feeling of sympathy and sorrow for the misfortunes of others. <i>The film captured all the pathos of their situation.</i>
piteous	Deserving or arousing pity. <i>Piteous appeals for help.</i>
pitiable	Deserving or inciting pity. <i>Pitiable homeless children.</i>
<u>pitiful</u>	Deserving or inciting pity. <i>A pitiful attempt to impress her.</i>
poignancy	A quality that arouses emotions (especially pity or sorrow). <i>A moment of extraordinary poignancy.</i>
regretful	Feeling or showing regret. <i>Felt regretful over his vanished youth.</i>
regrettable	(of conduct or an event) giving rise to regret; undesirable; unwelcome. <i>Regrettable remarks.</i>
ruth	United States professional baseball player famous for hitting home runs (1895-1948).
<u>sorry</u>	Causing dejection. <i>I m sorry if I was a bit brusque.</i>
<u>sympathetic</u>	Of or relating to the sympathetic nervous system. <i>Buildings that were sympathetic to their surroundings.</i>
<u>sympathy</u>	Feelings of pity and sorrow for someone else's misfortune. <i>The special sympathy between the two boys was obvious to all.</i>
touching	The act of putting two things together with no space between them. <i>Your loyalty is very touching.</i>
<u>tragic</u>	Very sad; especially involving grief or death or destruction. <i>Tragic hero.</i>
<u>unfortunate</u>	Not auspicious; boding ill. <i>His unfortunate remark silenced the gathering.</i>
