*A **calculated** insult.*
- concoct** Make a concoction of by mixing.
*His cronies **concocted** a simple plan.*
- deliberate** Unhurried and with care and dignity.
*A **deliberate** attempt to provoke a response.*
- deliberately** In a careful and unhurried way.
*She was working **deliberately**.*

designed	Planned or conceived in detail or for a specific purpose. <i>Games designed for all ages.</i>
headed	Having a tip, end, or top part of a specified kind. <i>A cool headed fighter pilot.</i>
intended	Planned or meant. <i>The intended victim escaped.</i>
intentionality	Expressive of intentions.
knowingly	In full awareness or consciousness; deliberately. <i>When a journalist knowingly misleads their readers.</i>
measured	(of speech or writing) carefully considered and restrained. <i>His measured prose.</i>
methodical	(of a person) orderly or systematic in thought or behaviour. <i>A methodical man he assembled all the papers into a huge pile.</i>
motivated	Provided with a motive or given incentive for action. <i>A highly motivated child can learn almost anything.</i>
musicology	The scholarly and scientific study of music.
object	Express or raise an objection or protest or criticism or express dissent. <i>When asked to drive the truck she objected that she did not have a driver's license.</i>
ordered	Marked by an orderly, logical, and aesthetically consistent relation of parts. <i>An ordered sequence.</i>
organized	Formed into a structured or coherent whole. <i>A repressive regime which crushed organized labour.</i>
plan	Make a design of plan out in systematic often graphic form. <i>They drew up a six step plan.</i>
premeditated	(of an action, especially a crime) thought out or planned beforehand. <i>Premeditated murder.</i>
purpose	The quality of being determined to do or achieve something; firmness of purpose. <i>The building is no longer needed for its original purpose.</i>
purposefully	With a useful purpose. <i>Purposefully vague answers.</i>
purposely	On purpose; intentionally. <i>She had purposely made it difficult.</i>
ruse	An action intended to deceive someone; a trick. <i>Emma tried to think of a ruse to get Paul out of the house.</i>

scheme	Devise a system or form a scheme for. <i>He schemed to bring about the collapse of the government.</i>
setup	An act that incriminates someone on a false charge. <i>It takes time to learn the setup around here.</i>
skillfully	With skill. <i>Fragments of a nearly complete jug skillfully restored at the institute of archaeology.</i>
studied	Produced or marked by conscious design or premeditation. <i>He treated them with studied politeness.</i>
systematic	Done or acting according to a fixed plan or system; methodical. <i>A systematic search of the whole city.</i>
thorough	Performed comprehensively and completely; not superficial or partial. <i>Thorough research.</i>
