- artifice** A deceptive maneuver (especially to avoid capture).  
*An industry dominated by **artifice**.*
- calculated** Carefully thought out in advance.  
*A **calculated** insult.*
- concoct** Make a concoction of by mixing.  
*His cronies **concocted** a simple plan.*
- deliberate** Unhurried and with care and dignity.  
*A **deliberate** attempt to provoke a response.*
- deliberately** In a careful and unhurried way.  
*She was working **deliberately**.*

<b>designed</b>	Planned or conceived in detail or for a specific purpose. <i>Games <b>designed</b> for all ages.</i>
<b>headed</b>	Having a tip, end, or top part of a specified kind. <i>A cool <b>headed</b> fighter pilot.</i>
<b>intended</b>	Planned or meant. <i>The <b>intended</b> victim escaped.</i>
<b>intentionality</b>	Expressive of intentions.
<b>knowingly</b>	In full awareness or consciousness; deliberately. <i>When a journalist <b>knowingly</b> misleads their readers.</i>
<b>measured</b>	(of speech or writing) carefully considered and restrained. <i>His <b>measured</b> prose.</i>
<b>methodical</b>	(of a person) orderly or systematic in thought or behaviour. <i>A <b>methodical</b> man he assembled all the papers into a huge pile.</i>
<b>motivated</b>	Provided with a motive or given incentive for action. <i>A highly <b>motivated</b> child can learn almost anything.</i>
<b>musicology</b>	The scholarly and scientific study of music.
<b>object</b>	Express or raise an objection or protest or criticism or express dissent. <i>When asked to drive the truck she <b>objected</b> that she did not have a driver's license.</i>
<b>ordered</b>	Marked by an orderly, logical, and aesthetically consistent relation of parts. <i>An <b>ordered</b> sequence.</i>
<b>organized</b>	Formed into a structured or coherent whole. <i>A repressive regime which crushed <b>organized</b> labour.</i>
<b>plan</b>	Make a design of plan out in systematic often graphic form. <i>They drew up a six step <b>plan</b>.</i>
<b>premeditated</b>	(of an action, especially a crime) thought out or planned beforehand. <i><b>Premeditated</b> murder.</i>
<b>purpose</b>	The quality of being determined to do or achieve something; firmness of purpose. <i>The building is no longer needed for its original <b>purpose</b>.</i>
<b>purposefully</b>	With a useful purpose. <i><b>Purposefully</b> vague answers.</i>
<b>purposely</b>	On purpose; intentionally. <i>She had <b>purposely</b> made it difficult.</i>
<b>ruse</b>	An action intended to deceive someone; a trick. <i>Emma tried to think of a <b>ruse</b> to get Paul out of the house.</i>

<b>scheme</b>	Devise a system or form a scheme for. <i>He <b>schemed</b> to bring about the collapse of the government.</i>
<b>setup</b>	An act that incriminates someone on a false charge. <i>It takes time to learn the <b>setup</b> around here.</i>
<b>skillfully</b>	With skill. <i>Fragments of a nearly complete jug <b>skillfully</b> restored at the institute of archaeology.</i>
<b>studied</b>	Produced or marked by conscious design or premeditation. <i>He treated them with <b>studied</b> politeness.</i>
<b>systematic</b>	Done or acting according to a fixed plan or system; methodical. <i>A <b>systematic</b> search of the whole city.</i>
<b>thorough</b>	Performed comprehensively and completely; not superficial or partial. <i><b>Thorough</b> research.</i>
