- *Garden consisting of a small cultivated wood without undergrowth.*
- *Colonization or settlement of emigrants, especially of English and then Scottish families in Ireland in the 16th–17th centuries under government sponsorship.*
- *A newly established colony (especially in the colonization of North America.*
- *An area in which trees have been planted, especially for commercial purposes.*

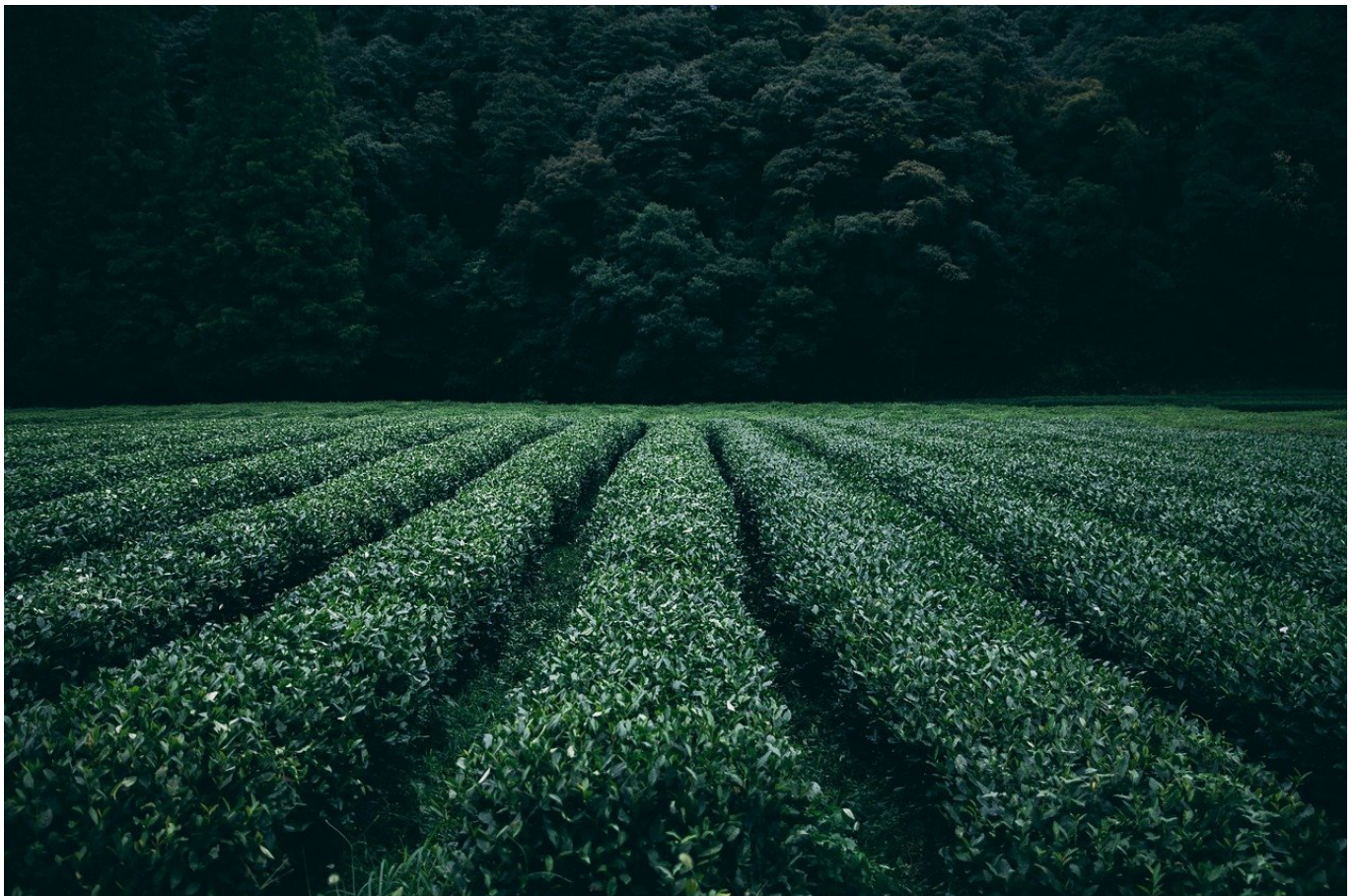


## Synonyms of "Plantation" as a noun (15 Words)

<b>colonization</b>	The action of appropriating a place or domain for one's own use. <i>Suitable sites for <b>colonization</b> by Asian crabs.</i>
<a href="#"><u>colony</u></a>	A group of people living in a colony consisting of the original settlers and their descendants and successors. <i>A large housing <b>colony</b> has already been built.</i>
<b>community</b>	A particular area or place considered together with its inhabitants. <i>They shared a <b>community</b> of possessions.</i>
<b>encampment</b>	The act of encamping and living in tents in a camp. <i>A Bedouin <b>encampment</b>.</i>
<b>farm</b>	A farmhouse. <i>A fish <b>farm</b>.</i>
<b>forest</b>	Denoting an area that was formerly a royal forest. <i>A large tract of <b>forest</b>.</i>



<b>grove</b>	A small growth of trees without underbrush. <i>An olive <b>grove</b>.</i>
<b>holding</b>	The tenure of land held by lease. <i>Commercial property <b>holdings</b>.</i>
<b>orchard</b>	Garden consisting of a small cultivated wood without undergrowth. <i>An apple <b>orchard</b>.</i>
<b>outpost</b>	A station in a remote or sparsely populated location. <i>A few scattered <b>outposts</b> along the west coast.</i>
<b>peopling</b>	Members of a family line.
<b>settling</b>	A long wooden bench with a back.
<b>trees</b>	English actor and theatrical producer noted for his lavish productions of Shakespeare (1853-1917). <i>Genealogical <b>tree</b>.</i>
<b>woodland</b>	Land covered with trees. <i>Large areas of ancient <b>woodland</b>.</i>
<b>woodlet</b>	Garden consisting of a small cultivated wood without undergrowth.

<b>agricultural</b>	Relating to rural matters. <i>An agrarian or <b>agricultural</b> society.</i>
<b>agriculture</b>	The science or practice of farming, including cultivation of the soil for the growing of crops and the rearing of animals to provide food, wool, and other products.
<b>agronomy</b>	The application of soil and plant sciences to land management and crop production.
<b>apiary</b>	A shed containing a number of beehives.



<b>apple</b>	Used in names of unrelated fruits or other plant growths that resemble apples in some way e g custard apple oak apple.
<b>arable</b>	Of crops able to be grown on arable land. <b>Arable</b> crops.
<b>arboriculture</b>	The cultivation of tree for the production of timber.
<b>botany</b>	All the plant life in a particular region or period. <i>The <b>botany</b> of China.</i>
<b>conservatory</b>	A schoolhouse with special facilities for fine arts. <i>Keep plant cuttings in a frost free <b>conservatory</b> or greenhouse.</i>
<b>cornfield</b>	A field in which corn is being grown.
<b>cow</b>	Subdue, restrain, or overcome by affecting with a feeling of awe; frighten (as with threats). <i>Moo <b>cow</b> is a child s term.</i>
<b>crop</b>	Prepare for crops. <i>She <b>cropped</b> her long golden hair.</i>
<b>cultivate</b>	Try to improve or develop (one's mind). <i>Walnuts were <b>cultivated</b> for salad oil.</i>
<b>cultivation</b>	Production of food by preparing the land to grow crops (especially on a large scale). <i>The <b>cultivation</b> of good staff management relations.</i>
<b>farm</b>	Be a farmer work as a farmer. <i>My son is <b>farming</b> in California.</i>
<b>farming</b>	Relating to farming or agriculture. <i>Land was enclosed for arable <b>farming</b>.</i>
<b>farmland</b>	A rural area where farming is practiced.
<b>fruit</b>	Bear fruit. <i>The trees <b>fruited</b> early this year.</i>
<b>garden</b>	Work in the garden. <i>She wrote books kept journals and <b>gardened</b>.</i>
<b>gardening</b>	The activity of tending and cultivating a garden, especially as a pastime. <b>Gardening</b> gloves.
<b>grove</b>	A small growth of trees without underbrush. <i>An olive <b>grove</b>.</i>
<b>horticulture</b>	The art or practice of garden cultivation and management. <i>Maize and manioc <b>horticulture</b>.</i>
<b>hothouse</b>	Educate or teach (a child) to a high level at an earlier age than is usual. <b>Hothouse</b> plants.

<b>maize</b>	Tall annual cereal grass bearing kernels on large ears: widely cultivated in America in many varieties; the principal cereal in Mexico and Central and South America since pre-Columbian times.
<b>mechanize</b>	Make mechanical in character. <i><b>Mechanize</b> armies.</i>
<b>orchard</b>	A piece of enclosed land planted with fruit trees. <i>An apple <b>orchard</b>.</i>
<b>tilth</b>	Arable land that is worked by plowing and sowing and raising crops. <i>The final levelling of a <b>tilth</b>.</i>
<b>vegetable</b>	A person who is incapable of normal mental or physical activity, especially through brain damage. <i>A <b>vegetable</b> garden.</i>
<u><b>vine</b></u>	A climbing or trailing woody stemmed plant related to the grapevine. <i>The <b>vines</b> of a vast wisteria.</i>
