- *A main course of a meal, served on one plate.*
- *The thin under portion of the forequarter.*
- *A light horseshoe for a racehorse.*
- *The quantity contained in a plate.*

- *A thin, flat organic structure or formation.*
- *A printed photograph, picture, or illustration, especially one on superior-quality paper in a book.*
- *A plate of food contributed by a guest to a social gathering.*
- *Dishes, bowls, cups, and other utensils made of gold, silver, or other metal.*
- *A horizontal timber laid along the top of a wall to support the ends of joists or rafters.*
- *An amount of food on a plate.*
- *Structural member consisting of a horizontal beam that provides bearing and anchorage.*

- *A thin sheet of metal, glass, or other substance coated with a light-sensitive film on which an image is formed, used in larger or older types of camera.*

- *A metal sheathing of uniform thickness (such as the shield attached to an artillery piece to protect the gunners).*

<u>dish</u>	The quantity that a dish will hold. <i>Marriage was scarcely his dish.</i>
door plate	Anything providing a means of access (or escape).
engraving	A print made from an engraving. <i>The quality of his engraving established new standards.</i>
helping	A portion of food served to one person at one time. <i>The helpings were all small.</i>
home	A match played or won by a team on their own ground. <i>Montana is home to a surprising number of rare mammals.</i>
home base	An institution where people are cared for.
home plate	An environment offering affection and security.
illustration	A picture illustrating a book, newspaper, etc. <i>This accident is a graphic illustration of the disaster that is waiting to happen.</i>
lamina	A thin plate or layer (especially of bone or mineral).
<u>layer</u>	Single thickness of usually some homogeneous substance. <i>They can be increased from cuttings and layers.</i>
<u>leaf</u>	A thing that resembles a leaf in being flat and thin. <i>Gold leaf.</i>
lithograph	A print produced by lithography.
medallion	An emblem indicating that a taxicab is registered. <i>Medallions of veal.</i>
nameplate	A plate or sign attached to something and bearing the name of the owner, occupier, maker, or the thing itself. <i>A brass nameplate adorned the publisher's desk.</i>
pane	A panel or section of panels in a wall or door.
<u>panel</u>	A small group of people brought together to investigate or decide on a particular matter. <i>The dress has a panel of lace over the bodice.</i>
<u>photo</u>	A photo finish.
photograph	A representation of a person or scene in the form of a print or transparent slide or in digital format. <i>A photograph of her father.</i>

photographic plate	Base consisting of a rubber slab where the batter stands; it must be touched by a base runner in order to score.
picture	A visual representation (of an object or scene or person or abstraction) produced on a surface. <i>How excessively like her brother Miss Morland is The very picture of him indeed.</i>
plaque	A flat counter used in gambling. <i>Plaque around gum margins can lead to gingivitis.</i>
plaquette	A small plaque or ornamental tablet. <i>Bronze plaquettes depicting religious scenes.</i>
plateful	The quantity contained in a plate.
platter	A quantity of food served on a platter. <i>Huge platters of cooked meat.</i>
<u>portion</u>	The part or share of an estate given or descending by law to an heir. <i>She wanted the right to decide how her portion of the allowance should be spent.</i>
print	The text appearing in a book newspaper or other printed publication. <i>I want to see it in print.</i>
salver	A tray, typically one made of silver and used in formal circumstances.
scale	A flattened rigid plate forming part of the body covering of many animals. <i>Banging sounds emanating from the boiler may be caused by a build up of scale.</i>
serving	A quantity of food suitable for or served to one person. <i>There s enough for two servings each.</i>
sheet	A quantity of text or other information contained on a sheet of paper. <i>A sheet of unmarked paper.</i>
<u>shell</u>	Something resembling or likened to a shell because of its shape or its function as an outer case. <i>Baked pastry shells filled with cheese.</i>
sign	A gesture used in a system of sign language. <i>There were no signs of asphyxiation.</i>
slab	A flat, heavy table top or counter, used during the preparation or display of food. <i>A slab of bread and cheese.</i>
<u>tablet</u>	A slab of stone or wood suitable for bearing an inscription. <i>At the corner of the apse is a memorial tablet.</i>

A flat, shallow container with a raised rim, typically used for carrying food and drink, or for holding small items or loose material.

- *Coat with a layer of metal.*
- *Cover (an object) with plates of metal for decoration, protection, or strength.*
- *Score or cause to score (a run or runs).*
- *Cover (a metal object) with a thin coating of a different metal.*
- *Inoculate (cells or infective material) on to a culture plate, especially with the object of isolating a particular strain of microorganisms or estimating viable cell numbers.*

cover	Form a cover over. <i>The horse covers the mare.</i>
dish out	Make concave; shape like a dish.
dish up	Provide (usually but not necessarily food).
distribute	Cause be distributed. <i>The birds are mainly distributed in marshes and river valleys.</i>
give out	Give or convey physically.
ladle out	Put (a liquid) into a container by means of a ladle.
laminate	Create laminate by bonding sheets of material with a bonding material. <i>We will laminate your photos in clear plastic.</i>
overlay	Cover the surface of (something) with a coating. <i>A third screen which will overlay the others.</i>
plate up	Coat with a layer of metal.
set out	Estimate.
spoon out	Snuggle and lie in a position where one person faces the back of the others.
<u>veneer</u>	Cover with veneer. <i>Veneer the furniture to protect it.</i>

chopstick	One of a pair of slender sticks used as oriental tableware to eat food with.
crockery	Tableware (eating and serving dishes) collectively.
cuisine	The practice or manner of preparing food or the food so prepared. <i>We spent the evening sampling the local cuisine.</i>

cup	An ornamental trophy in the form of a cup usually made of gold or silver and having a stem and two handles awarded as a prize in a sports contest. <i>The cup of her bra.</i>
dinner	A party of people assembled to have dinner together. <i>Dinner will be at 8.</i>
dish	The quantity that a dish will hold. <i>We gave them a set of dishes for a wedding present.</i>
earthenware	Pottery made of clay fired to a porous state which can be made impervious to liquids by the use of a glaze. <i>An earthenware jug.</i>
figurine	A small carved or molded figure.
furbish	Give a fresh look to (something old or shabby); renovate. <i>Old arms duly furbished.</i>
glassy	(of a person's eyes or expression) showing no interest or animation. <i>The glassy surface of the lake.</i>
gourmet	Of a kind or standard suitable for a gourmet. <i>A gourmet meal.</i>
meal	The food eaten during a meal. <i>A bar serving light meals.</i>
porcelain	An article made of porcelain. <i>The paintings porcelains and prints that go on the block.</i>
potluck	Whatever happens to be available especially when offered to an unexpected guest or when brought by guests and shared by all. <i>Having arrived unannounced we had to take potluck.</i>
pottery	The area around Stoke on Trent Staffordshire where the English pottery industry is based. <i>An extensive collection of nineteenth century pottery.</i>
scale	Especially of the skin form scales. <i>The scale of the map.</i>
serve	Act as a server at the celebration of the Eucharist. <i>Cornish homeowners wonder if they are being fairly served.</i>
silverware	Tableware made of silver or silver plate or pewter or stainless steel.
spoon	Put food into or on something with a spoon. <i>He spooned his shot high over the bar.</i>
tableware	Crockery, cutlery, and glassware used for serving and eating meals at a table.

tray

A flat, shallow container with a raised rim, typically used for carrying food and drink, or for holding small items or loose material.

*Seed **trays**.*

tureen

A deep covered dish from which soup is served.

utensil

A tool, container, or other article, especially for household use.

*Kitchen **utensils**.*

vase

An open jar of glass or porcelain used as an ornament or to hold flowers.

vitreous

Of or relating to or constituting the vitreous humor of the eye.

***Vitreous** china.*

vitriify

Change into glass or a glass-like substance by applying heat.

*The option of **vitriifying** nuclear waste presents problems.*
