actor	A person whose profession is acting on the stage, in films, or on television. <i>He s a principal actor in this affair.</i>
actress	A female actor. <i>She is one of the great actresses of her generation.</i>
artist	A person who habitually practises a specified reprehensible activity. <i>A surgeon who is an artist with the scalpel.</i>
artiste	A public performer (a dancer or singer). <i>Cabaret artistes.</i>
competitor	An organization or country engaged in commercial or economic competition with others. <i>Our main industrial competitors.</i>
contender	A person or group competing with others to achieve something. <i>The major contenders in the football championship.</i>

contestant	A person who takes part in a contest or competition. <i>An anxious contestant on a television quiz show.</i>
entertainer	A person who tries to please or amuse. <i>Street entertainers.</i>
histrion	A theatrical performer.
instrumentalist	An adherent of instrumentalism. <i>Is the skilled pop instrumentalist an endangered species.</i>
<u>musician</u>	Someone who plays a musical instrument (as a profession). <i>Aspiring rock and pop musicians.</i>
participant	A person who participates in or is skilled at some game. <i>Staff are to be active participants in the decision making process.</i>
performer	An entertainer who performs a dramatic or musical work for an audience. <i>A circus performer.</i>
role player	An actor's portrayal of someone in a play.
soloist	A musician who performs a solo. <i>He appears as a concerto soloist with all the great British orchestras.</i>
team member	A cooperative unit (especially in sports).
thespian	A theatrical performer. <i>An ageing thespian.</i>
trouper	An actor who travels around the country presenting plays. <i>An old trouper out for one last look at his adoring public.</i>
virtuoso	A musician who is a consummate master of technique and artistry. <i>A celebrated clarinet virtuoso.</i>

football	The playing of football especially in a stylish and entertaining way. <i>His team played some impressive football.</i>
game	A score of 100 points for tricks bid and made the best of three games constituting a rubber. <i>They played word games.</i>
hexad	The cardinal number that is the sum of five and one. <i>Each segment down to the tiniest hexad of cilia is practically identical in shape.</i>
inning	One of nine divisions of play during which each team has a turn at bat.
pentad	A group or set of five.
quartet	A composition for a quartet. <i>A quartet of comfortable armchairs.</i>
quintet	A musical composition for a quintet. <i>A jazz quintet played hypnotic Chicago blues.</i>
quintuple	Increase fivefold. <i>The company's revenues would quintuple over the next decade.</i>
rugby	A form of football played with an oval ball.
seven	One of four playing cards in a deck with seven pips on the face.
sextet	A composition for a sextet. <i>The Jazz Club presents a new sextet.</i>
six	A playing card or domino or die whose upward face shows six pips.
soccer	A form of football played by two teams of eleven players with a round ball which may not be handled during play except by the goalkeepers.
team	Form a team. <i>He teamed up with the band to produce the disc.</i>
thespian	Relating to drama and the theatre. <i>Thespian talents.</i>
thirty	The cardinal number that is the product of ten and three.
three	One of four playing cards in a deck having three pips.
triad	A set of three similar things considered as a unit. <i>The triad of medication diet and exercise are necessary in diabetes care.</i>
trio	Three people considered as a unit. <i>The hotel was run by a trio of brothers.</i>
triple	Hit a triple. <i>The party more than tripled its share of the vote.</i>

violinist A person who plays the violin.
*The most renowned virtuoso **violinist** of his time.*

woodwind Wind instruments other than brass instruments forming a section of an orchestra, including flutes, oboes, clarinets, and bassoons.
*Striking passages for **woodwind** and brass.*
