
Pleading as a Noun

Definitions of "Pleading" as a noun

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "pleading" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- The action of making an emotional or earnest appeal to someone.
- (law) a statement in legal and logical form stating something on behalf of a party to a legal proceeding.
- A formal statement of the cause of an action or defence.





Synonyms of "Pleading" as a noun (5 Words)

appeal

plea

A legal proceeding in which the appellant resorts to a higher court for the purpose of obtaining a review of a lower court decision and a reversal of the lower court's judgment or the granting of a new trial.

He has 28 days in which to lodge an **appeal**.

cry from the heart

A loud utterance; often in protest or opposition.

Reverent petition to a deity.

petition She was asked to sign a **petition** against plans to build on the local playing

fields.

A claim that a circumstance means that one should not be blamed for or

should not be forced to do something.

He made a dramatic **plea** for disarmament.

request

A formal message requesting something that is submitted to an authority.

The computer is busy servicing **request**s from other processes.



implore Call upon in supplication; entreat.

He **implore**d her to change her mind.
