- *(of persons) having pleasing manners or behavior.*
- *Giving a sense of happy satisfaction or enjoyment.*
- *(of a person or their manner) friendly and considerate; likeable.*

<b>affable</b>	Diffusing warmth and friendliness. <i>An <b>affable</b> and agreeable companion.</i>
<b>agreeable</b>	In keeping. <i>They were <b>agreeable</b> to its publication.</i>
<b>amiable</b>	Disposed to please. <i>The <b>amiable</b> young man greeted me enthusiastically.</i>
<b>amicable</b>	Characterized by friendship and good will. <i>An <b>amicable</b> settlement of the dispute.</i>
<b>approachable</b>	Friendly and easy to talk to. <i>A site <b>approachable</b> from a branch of the Niger.</i>
<b>companionable</b>	Suggestive of companionship. <i>A <b>companionable</b> pet.</i>

<b><u>congenial</u></b>	Suitable to your needs. <i>He went back to a climate more <b>congenial</b> to his cold stony soul.</i>
<b>enjoyable</b>	(of an activity or occasion) giving delight or pleasure. <i>They had an <b>enjoyable</b> afternoon.</i>
<b>friendly</b>	Easy to understand or use. <i>A reader <b>friendly</b> novel.</i>
<b><u>genial</u></b>	Of or relating to the chin or median part of the lower jaw. <i>A <b>genial</b> host.</i>
<b>good</b>	Tending to promote physical well-being; beneficial to health. <i>The meat is still <b>good</b>.</i>
<b>good-humoured</b>	Disposed to please- Hal Hinson.
<b>good-natured</b>	Having an easygoing and cheerful disposition.
<b>gratifying</b>	Affording satisfaction or pleasure. <i>The results were <b>gratifying</b>.</i>
<b><u>hospitable</u></b>	Disposed to treat guests and strangers with cordiality and generosity. <i>A <b>hospitable</b> act.</i>
<b>likeable</b>	(of characters in literature or drama) evoking empathic or sympathetic feelings. <i>A very <b>likeable</b> young woman.</i>
<b>lovely</b>	Appealing to the emotions as well as the eye. <i>We ve had a <b>lovely</b> day.</i>
<b>nice</b>	Fastidious; scrupulous. <i>We had a very <b>nice</b> time.</i>
<b><u>personable</u></b>	(of persons) pleasant in appearance and personality. <i>She is quite a <b>personable</b> young woman.</i>
<b>pleasing</b>	Giving pleasure and satisfaction. <i>The <b>pleasing</b> austerity of the surroundings.</i>
<b><u>pleasurable</u></b>	Pleasing; enjoyable. <i>I arrived in a mood of <b>pleasurable</b> anticipation.</i>
<b><u>satisfying</u></b>	Providing freedom from worry. <i>These are very <b>satisfying</b> books.</i>
<b>welcome</b>	Allowed or invited to do a specified thing. <i>Made the children feel <b>welcome</b>.</i>

<b>congenial</b>	(used of plants) capable of cross-fertilization or of being grafted. <i>He went back to a climate more <b>congenial</b> to his cold stony soul.</i>
<b>cordial</b>	Sincerely or intensely felt. <i>I earned his <b>cordial</b> loathing.</i>
<b>delightful</b>	Causing delight; charming. <i>A <b>delightful</b> surprise.</i>
<b>enjoyable</b>	Affording satisfaction or pleasure. <i>They had an <b>enjoyable</b> afternoon.</i>
<b>euphoria</b>	A feeling of great (usually exaggerated) elation. <i>In his <b>euphoria</b> he had become convinced he could defeat them.</i>
<b>favorable</b>	Occurring at a convenient or suitable time. <i>A <b>favorable</b> reply.</i>
<b>glad</b>	Causing happiness. <i>Heard the <b>glad</b> news.</i>
<b>gladden</b>	Become glad or happy. <i>The high childish laugh was a sound that <b>gladdened</b> her heart.</i>
<b>gratifying</b>	Pleasing to the mind or feeling. <i>Found her praise <b>gratifying</b>.</i>
<b>happiness</b>	The state of being happy. <i>She struggled to find <b>happiness</b> in her life.</i>
<b>happy</b>	Willing to do something. <i>They are <b>happy</b> to see me doing well.</i>
<b>intriguing</b>	Arousing one's curiosity or interest; fascinating. <i>It s an <b>intriguing</b> possibility.</i>
<b>joy</b>	Feel happiness or joy. <i>The <b>joys</b> of country living.</i>
<b>joyful</b>	Feeling, expressing, or causing great pleasure and happiness. <i>A <b>joyful</b> heart.</i>
<b>nice</b>	Giving pleasure or satisfaction; pleasant or attractive. <i>A <b>nice</b> shot.</i>
<b>pleasantness</b>	The quality of giving pleasure. <i>The <b>pleasantness</b> of a cool breeze on a hot summer day.</i>
<b>pleasing</b>	The act of one who pleases. <i>The <b>pleasing</b> austerity of the surroundings.</i>
<b>pleasurable</b>	Pleasing; enjoyable. <i><b>Pleasurable</b> activities.</i>

<b>pleasure</b>	A feeling of happy satisfaction and enjoyment. <i>He serves at the <b>pleasure</b> of the President.</i>
<b>relaxing</b>	Reducing tension or anxiety. <i>A <b>relaxing</b> massage with aromatherapy oils.</i>
<b>rewarding</b>	Providing satisfaction; gratifying. <i>Skiing can be hugely <b>rewarding</b>.</i>
<b>satisfying</b>	Providing abundant nourishment. <i>These are very <b>satisfying</b> books.</i>
<b>serendipity</b>	The occurrence and development of events by chance in a happy or beneficial way. <i>A fortunate stroke of <b>serendipity</b>.</i>
<b>surprise</b>	Cause to be surprised. <i>Joe was <b>surprised</b> that he enjoyed the journey.</i>
<b>thrilled</b>	Feeling intense pleasurable excitement.
