| <u>congenial</u> | (used of plants) capable of cross-fertilization or of being grafted. <i>He went back to a climate more congenial to his cold stony soul.</i> |
| cordial | Sincerely or intensely felt. <i>I earned his cordial loathing.</i> |
| <u>delightful</u> | Causing delight; charming. <i>A delightful surprise.</i> |
| enjoyable | Affording satisfaction or pleasure. <i>They had an enjoyable afternoon.</i> |
| <u>euphoria</u> | A feeling of great (usually exaggerated) elation. <i>In his euphoria he had become convinced he could defeat them.</i> |
| <u>favorable</u> | Occurring at a convenient or suitable time. <i>A favorable reply.</i> |
| <u>glad</u> | Causing happiness. <i>Heard the glad news.</i> |
| gladden | Become glad or happy. <i>The high childish laugh was a sound that gladdened her heart.</i> |
| gratifying | Pleasing to the mind or feeling. <i>Found her praise gratifying.</i> |
| happiness | The state of being happy. <i>She struggled to find happiness in her life.</i> |
| happy | Willing to do something. <i>They are happy to see me doing well.</i> |
| intriguing | Arousing one's curiosity or interest; fascinating. <i>It s an intriguing possibility.</i> |
