charming Very pleasant or attractive.
*Endowed with **charming** manners.*

delightful Greatly pleasing or entertaining.
*The comedy was **delightful**.*

engaging Charming and attractive.
*An **engaging** smile.*

enjoyable (of an activity or occasion) giving delight or pleasure.
*The company was **enjoyable**.*

fine Characterized by elegance or refinement or accomplishment.
*He said such a solution would be **fine**.*

gratifying Affording satisfaction or pleasure.
*Found her praise **gratifying**.*

nice Giving pleasure or satisfaction; pleasant or attractive.
*We had a very **nice** time.*

pleasant Giving a sense of happy satisfaction or enjoyment.
*They found him **pleasant** and cooperative.*

pleasing Giving pleasure and satisfaction.
A **pleasing** aroma.

satisfying Giving fulfilment or the pleasure associated with this.
These are very **satisfying** books.



Usage Examples of "Pleasurable" as an adjective

- *Good printing makes a book more pleasurable to read.*
- *I arrived in a mood of pleasurable anticipation.*
- *Full of happiness and pleasurable excitement.*
- *Pleasurable activities.*

agreeable	Willing to agree to something. <i>A cheerful and agreeable companion.</i>
blessedness	A state of supreme happiness.
contentment	A state of happiness and satisfaction. <i>He found contentment in living a simple life in the country.</i>
delighted	Greatly pleased. <i>A delighted smile.</i>
delightful	Greatly pleasing or entertaining. <i>A delightful secluded garden.</i>
elated	Ecstatically happy. <i>After the concert I felt elated.</i>
enjoy	Derive or receive pleasure from get enjoyment from take pleasure in. <i>I enjoy watching good films.</i>

enjoyable	(of an activity or occasion) giving delight or pleasure. <i>They had an enjoyable afternoon.</i>
euphoria	A feeling of great (usually exaggerated) elation. <i>In his euphoria he had become convinced he could defeat them.</i>
euphoric	Exaggerated feeling of well-being or elation. <i>A euphoric sense of freedom.</i>
exult	To express great joy. <i>Exulting in her escape Lisa closed the door behind her.</i>
exultant	Triumphantly happy. <i>He waved to the exultant crowds.</i>
glad	Make happy; please. <i>A glad smile.</i>
gladden	Make glad. <i>The high childish laugh was a sound that gladdened her heart.</i>
gratify	Indulge or satisfy (a desire). <i>Not all the sexual impulses can be gratified.</i>
gratifying	Affording satisfaction or pleasure. <i>The results were gratifying.</i>
happiness	State of well-being characterized by emotions ranging from contentment to intense joy. <i>She struggled to find happiness in her life.</i>
intriguing	Capable of arousing interest or curiosity. <i>The food is an intriguing combination of German and French.</i>
joy	Feel happiness or joy. <i>You ll get no joy out of her.</i>
joyful	Feeling, expressing, or causing great pleasure and happiness. <i>Joyful music.</i>
jubilant	Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success. <i>A large number of jubilant fans ran on to the pitch.</i>
laughing	Showing or feeling mirth or pleasure or happiness. <i>Laughing children.</i>
pleasant	(of a person or their manner) friendly and considerate; likeable. <i>A pleasant scene.</i>
pleasantness	The quality of giving pleasure. <i>The pleasantness of a cool breeze on a hot summer day.</i>
pleased	Proud of one's achievements, especially excessively so; self-satisfied. <i>We will be pleased to provide an independent appraisal.</i>

pleasing	Satisfying or appealing. <i>A pleasing aroma.</i>
pleasure	Sensual gratification. <i>He serves at the pleasure of the President.</i>
rapture	A state of being carried away by overwhelming emotion- Charles Dickens. <i>People will be raptured out of automobiles as they are driving along.</i>
rewarding	Providing satisfaction; gratifying. <i>A rewarding career as a paramedic.</i>
<u>thrilled</u>	Feeling intense pleasurable excitement.
