<b>working-class person</b>	A human body (usually including the clothing).

<b>ignoble</b>	Of humble origin or social status. <i>Something cowardly and <b>ignoble</b> in his attitude.</i>
<b><u>low</u></b>	Very low in volume. <i>A <b>low</b> bow.</i>
<b>low-class</b>	Occupying the lowest socioeconomic position in a society.
<b>lowbrow</b>	Characteristic of a person who is not cultivated or does not have intellectual tastes. <i><b>Lowbrow</b> tastes.</i>
<b>lower-class</b>	Occupying the lowest socioeconomic position in a society.
<b><u>lowly</u></b>	Of low birth or station ('base' is archaic in this sense). <i>A <b>lowly</b> corporal.</i>
<b>mean</b>	Excellent. <i>In a <b>mean</b> mood.</i>
<b>of low birth</b>	Subdued or brought low in condition or status.
<b>philistine</b>	Smug and ignorant and indifferent or hostile to artistic and cultural values. <i>There were displays to inspire even the most <b>philistine</b> of visitors.</i>
<b>proletarian</b>	Belonging to or characteristic of the proletariat. <i>A <b>proletarian</b> ideology.</i>
<b><u>provincial</u></b>	Of or concerning the regions outside the capital city of a country, especially when regarded as unsophisticated or narrow-minded. <i><b>Provincial</b> elections.</i>
<b><u>rustic</u></b>	Having a simplicity and charm that is considered typical of the countryside. <i><b>Rustic</b> pottery.</i>
<b>uncultivated</b>	(of land) not used for growing crops. <i><b>Uncultivated</b> land.</i>
<b><u>uncultured</u></b>	Not characterized by good taste, manners, or education. <i>To my <b>uncultured</b> palate most of the wines were good.</i>
<b>undistinguished</b>	Not worthy of notice. <i>An <b>undistinguished</b> career.</i>
<b>uneducated</b>	Not having a good education. <i>Women from <b>uneducated</b> backgrounds.</i>
<b>unpolished</b>	Not carefully reworked or perfected or made smooth by polishing. <i>His work is <b>unpolished</b> and sometimes incoherent.</i>
<b><u>unrefined</u></b>	Not processed to remove impurities or unwanted elements. <i><b>Unrefined</b> sugar.</i>

<b>unwashed</b>	Not having been washed. <i>The <b>unwashed</b> masses.</i>
<b>working-class</b>	Working for hourly wages rather than fixed (e.g. annual) salaries.

<b>acceptation</b>	A particular sense or the generally recognized meaning common acceptance of a word or phrase.
<b>accustomed</b>	In the habit of or adapted to. <i>His <b>accustomed</b> thoroughness.</i>
<b>bourgeois</b>	A bourgeois person. <i><b>Bourgeois</b> society took for granted the sanctity of property.</i>
<b>centurion</b>	The commander of a century in the ancient Roman army.
<b>citizen</b>	A legally recognized subject or national of a state or commonwealth, either native or naturalized. <i>A British <b>citizen</b>.</i>
<b>civil</b>	Relating to civil law. <i>They try to work out their differences in a <b>civil</b> manner.</i>
<b>civilian</b>	Relating to civilians. <i><b>Civilian</b> clothing.</i>
<b>common</b>	Having no special distinction or quality widely known or commonly encountered average or ordinary or usual. <i>We spent the morning tramping over the <b>common</b> looking for flowers.</i>
<b>commoner</b>	A person who has a right over another's land, e.g. for pasturage or mineral extraction. <i><b>Commoners</b> centuries old grazing rights.</i>
<b>commonplace</b>	A notable passage in a work copied into a commonplace book. <i>Unemployment was <b>commonplace</b> in his trade.</i>
<b>consular</b>	Relating to the ancient Roman consuls, two annually elected chief magistrates who jointly ruled the republic. <i>Rome once again held <b>consular</b> elections.</i>

<b>customary</b>	Commonly used or practiced; usual. <i>It is <b>customary</b> to mark an occasion like this with a toast.</i>
<b>inveterate</b>	(of a feeling or habit) long-established and unlikely to change. <i>An <b>inveterate</b> gambler.</i>
<b>leader</b>	A person who rules or guides or inspires others. <i>A <b>leader</b> in the use of video conferencing.</i>
<b>legion</b>	A vast multitude. <i>Her fans are <b>legion</b>.</i>
<b>legionary</b>	Of an ancient Roman legion. <i>The <b>legionary</b> fortress of Isca.</i>
<b>mundane</b>	Relating to or denoting the branch of astrology that deals with the prediction of earthly events. <i>Not a fairy palace yet a <b>mundane</b> wonder of unimagined kind.</i>
<b>nonentity</b>	Non-existence. <i>A political <b>nonentity</b>.</i>
<b>normal</b>	Conforming with or constituting a norm or standard or level or type or social norm not abnormal. <i>Her temperature was above <b>normal</b>.</i>
<b>ordinary</b>	Any of several conventional figures used on shields. <i>Not out of the <b>ordinary</b>.</i>
<b>populous</b>	Densely populated. <i>The <b>populous</b> city of Shanghai.</i>
<b>prevail</b>	Be larger in number, quantity, power, status or importance. <i>He <b>prevailed</b> upon her to visit his parents.</i>
<b>prevalent</b>	Predominant; powerful. <i>The social ills <b>prevalent</b> in society today.</i>
<b>quotidian</b>	Of or occurring every day; daily. <i>His story is an aching human one mired in <b>quotidian</b> details.</i>
<b>resident</b>	A person who lives somewhere permanently or on a long-term basis. <i>An intangible computer program <b>resident</b> on a magnetic disk.</i>
<b>routine</b>	Organize according to a routine. <i>I settled down into a <b>routine</b> of work and sleep.</i>
<b>tribune</b>	The apse of a Christian church that contains the bishop's throne.
<b>unexceptional</b>	Not special in any way; lacking distinction. <i>An <b>unexceptional</b> movie.</i>
<b>usual</b>	Commonly encountered. <i>Their room was a shambles as <b>usual</b>.</i>
