- *Shake or pat (a cushion or pillow) to adjust its stuffing and make it rounded and soft.*
- *Become rounder and fatter.*
- *Give support (to) or make a choice (of) one out of a group or number.*
- *Make fat or plump.*
- *Drop sharply.*

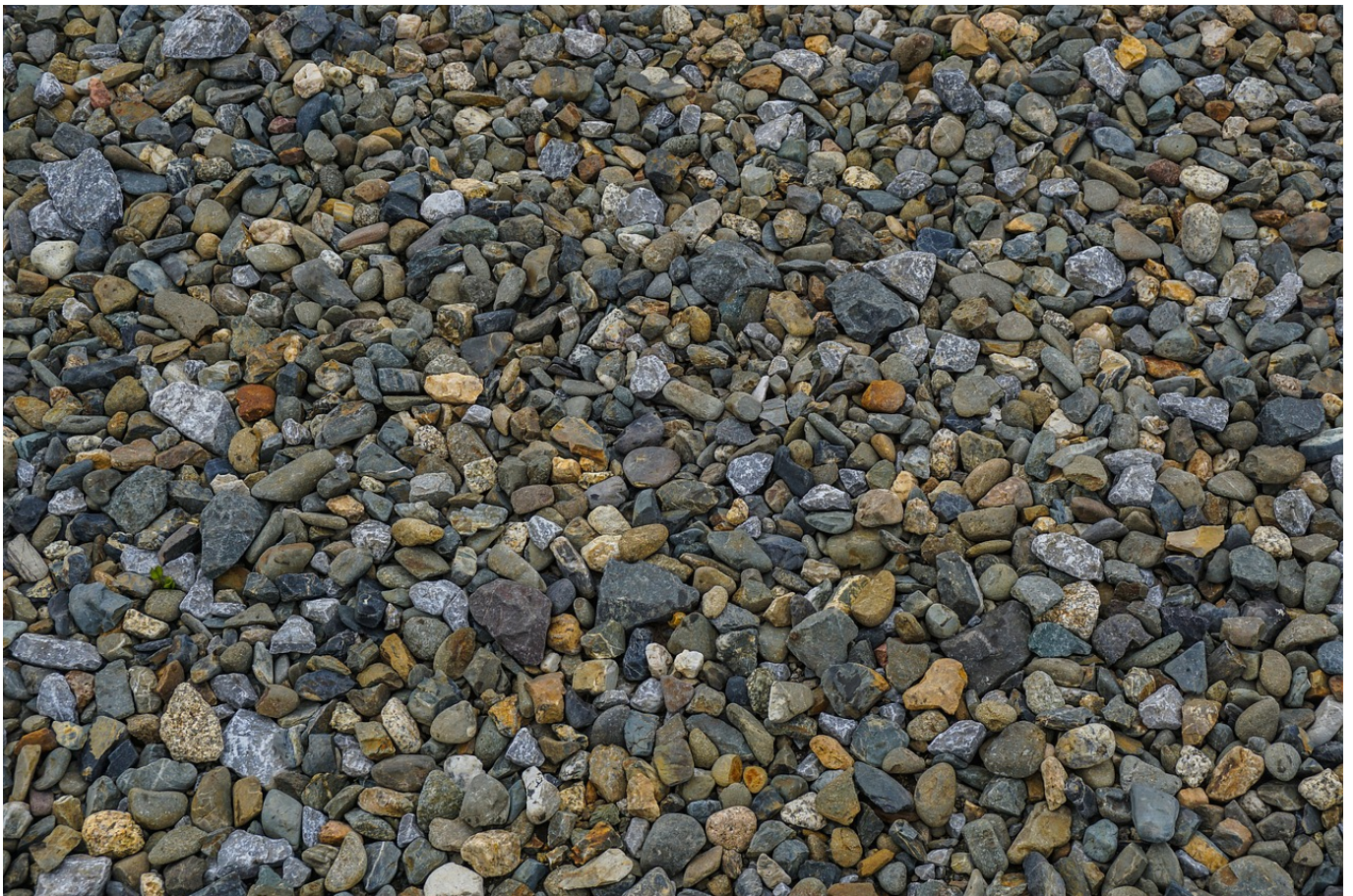
fat	Make fat or plump. <i>Numbers of black cattle are fatted here.</i>
fatten	Make or become fat or fatter. <i>Irish cattle fatten up quickly.</i>
fatten out	Make fat or plump.
fatten up	Make fat or plump.
fill out	Assume, as of positions or roles.
flesh out	Remove adhering flesh from (hides) when preparing leather manufacture.
flump	Set (something or oneself) down with or as if with a noise. <i>Ellie flumped her hands down on her sewing.</i>
go	Go through in search of something search through someone s belongings in an unauthorized way. <i>Rosemary goes with roast lamb.</i>

- plank** Cook and serve on a plank.
*He **planked** himself into the sofa.*
- plonk** Sit down heavily and without ceremony.
*People **plonking** around on expensive instruments.*
- plop** Fall or cause to fall with a plop.
*The stone **plopped** into the pond.*
- plummet** Fall or drop straight down at high speed.
*The stock market **plummeted**.*
- plump down** Make fat or plump.
- plump out** Set (something or oneself) down with or as if with a noise.
- plunk** Set down heavily or abruptly.
*She **plunked** her pack on top of the bar.*
- plunk down** Bring down or defeat (an opponent).



Usage Examples of "Plump" as a verb

- *Stew the dried fruits gently until they plump up.*
- *We will plump out that poor starving child.*
- *I plumped for the losing candidates.*
- *She plumped up her pillows.*
- *I was running from the kitchen to the living room, plumping the cushions and getting drinks in place.*

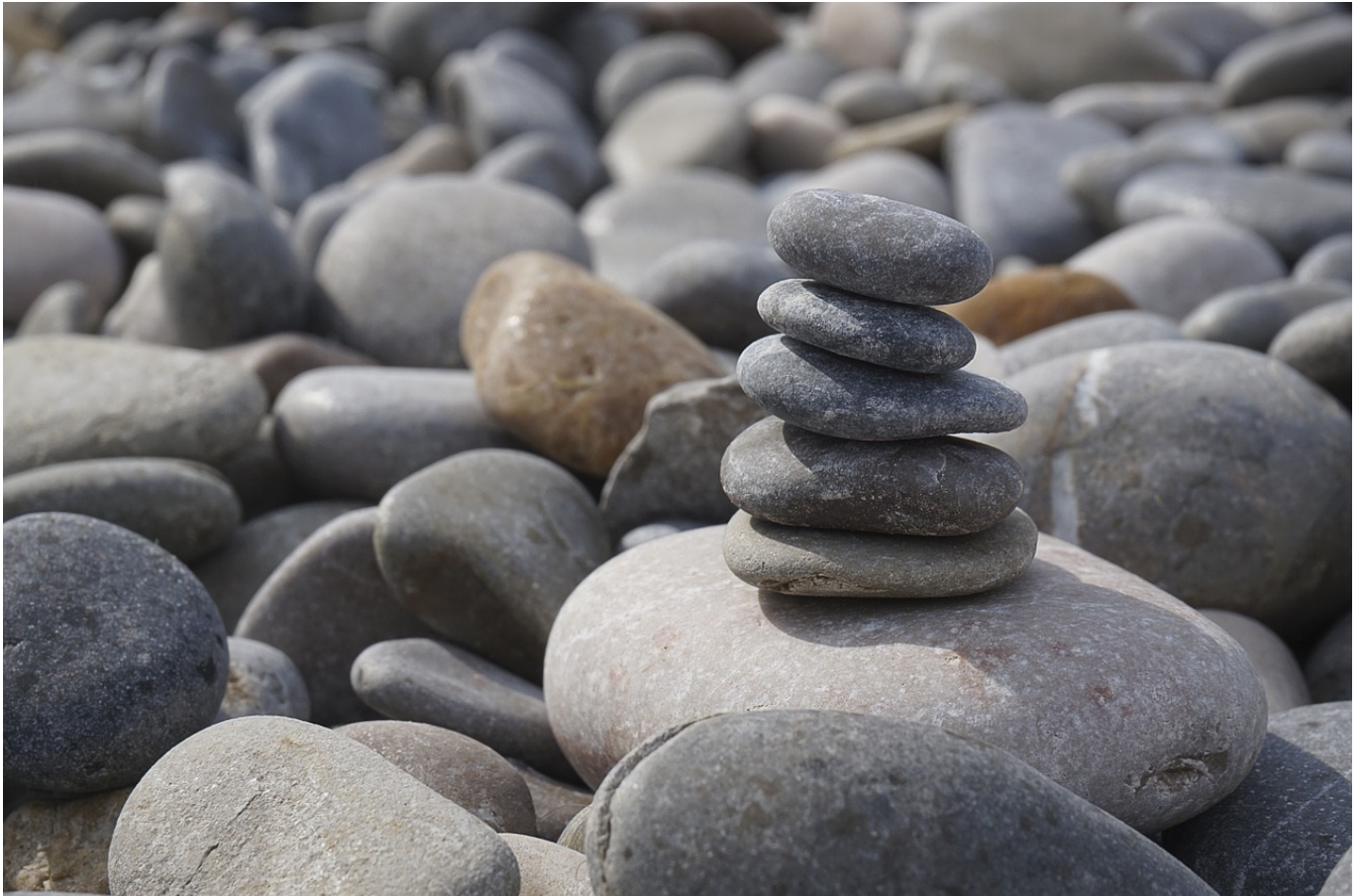


Plump as an Adjective

ample	Enough or more than enough; plentiful. <i>An ample supply of consumer goods.</i>
broad in the beam	Broad in scope or content- T.G.Winner.
bulky	Of large size for its weight. <i>A bulky carrier bag.</i>
<u>buxom</u>	Having a large bosom and pleasing curves. <i>A generation ago buxom actresses were popular.</i>
<u>chubby</u>	Sufficiently fat so as to have a pleasing fullness of figure. <i>A pretty child with chubby cheeks.</i>

chunky

Short and thick; as e.g. having short legs and heavy musculature.
*A **chunky** bracelet.*

dumpy

(of a person) short and stout.
*A **dumpy** little dumpling of a woman.*

embonpoint

Sufficiently fat so as to have a pleasing fullness of figure.

fat

Containing or composed of fat.
*A **fat** cigarette.*

fattish

Somewhat fat.

fleshy

(of plant or fruit tissue) soft and thick.
***Fleshy** greeny grey leaves.*

full

Constituting the full quantity or extent complete.
*They had their photographs taken and he was **full** of it.*

of ample proportions

More than enough in size or scope or capacity.

overweight

Above an allowed weight.
*An **overweight** lorry.*

paunchy

Having a large belly.
*A slightly **paunchy** balding middle aged man.*

portly

Of a stately or dignified appearance and manner.
*A **portly** little man with a bowler hat.*

roly-poly

Short and plump.

rotund

(of speech or literary style) sonorous; grandiloquent.
*The **rotund** and reverberating phrase.*

round

(of a person's shoulders) bent forward from the line of the back.
*His rich **round** voice went down well with the listeners.*

rounded

Curving and somewhat round in shape rather than jagged.
*Low **rounded** hills.*

stout

(of a person) rather fat or of heavy build.
***Stout** walking boots.*

well covered

Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.

well padded

Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.

well rounded

In good health especially after having suffered illness or injury.

well upholstered

In good health especially after having suffered illness or injury.

- avaricious** Having or showing an extreme greed for wealth or material gain.
*A corrupt and **avaricious** government.*

*His fat **belly** stuck out over his trousers.*
- blubber** (of a person's lips) swollen or protruding.
*My six pack is quickly being covered in **blubber**.*
- buxom** (of a woman) plump, with a full figure and large breasts.
*A **buxom** blonde.*

calorific	Relating to the amount of energy contained in food or fuel. <i>She knew the calorific contents of every morsel.</i>
chubby	Sufficiently fat so as to have a pleasing fullness of figure. <i>A chubby child.</i>
dietary	A regulated or restricted diet. <i>Dietary restrictions.</i>
fat	Make or become fat. <i>A nice fat job.</i>
fatten	Make or become fat or fatter. <i>He could do with some good food to fatten him up.</i>
fatty	Containing or composed of fat. <i>Fatty foods.</i>
feed	Feed into supply. <i>Cow feed.</i>
fleshy	Resembling flesh in appearance or texture. <i>Normally the tissue is fleshy pink.</i>
gobble	(of a large organization) incorporate or take over (a smaller one). <i>He gobbled up the rest of his sandwich.</i>
heavy	Large and powerful especially designed for heavy loads or rough work. <i>Steering that is heavy when parking.</i>
hypodermic	A hypodermic syringe or injection. <i>Hypodermic needle.</i>
nutrient	Of or providing nourishment. <i>Fish is a source of many important nutrients including protein vitamins and minerals.</i>
nutritious	Of or providing nourishment. <i>Home cooked burgers make a nutritious meal.</i>
obese	Excessively fat. <i>A hugely obese young man.</i>
obesity	The state of being grossly fat or overweight. <i>The problem of obesity among children.</i>
overeat	Overeat or eat immodestly make a pig of oneself. <i>If your friends overeat you re more likely to overeat too.</i>
overweight	Having more investment in a particular area than is normal or desirable. <i>We were overweighted in technology last year.</i>
paunch	Disembowel (an animal). <i>His body was powerful and square with the beginnings of a paunch.</i>

paunchy	Having a large belly. <i>A slightly paunchy balding middle aged man.</i>
portly	Having a stout body; somewhat fat (used especially of a man). <i>He was a man of portly presence.</i>
pudgy	Short and plump. <i>His pudgy fingers.</i>
rotund	Excessively fat. <i>Rotund tones.</i>
stout	Having or showing courage and determination. <i>Stout middle aged men.</i>
tubby	Short and plump. <i>Historic classical recordings with a tubby overall sound.</i>
