### Definitions of "Plump" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “plump” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Set (something or oneself) down with or as if with a noise.*
- *Shake or pat (a cushion or pillow) to adjust its stuffing and make it rounded and soft.*
- *Become rounder and fatter.*
- *Give support (to) or make a choice (of) one out of a group or number.*
- *Make fat or plump.*
- *Drop sharply.*

<b>fatten</b>	Make or become fat or fatter. <i>Irish cattle <b>fatten</b> up quickly.</i>
<b>fatten out</b>	Make fat or plump.
<b>fatten up</b>	Make fat or plump.
<b>fill out</b>	Assume, as of positions or roles.
<b>flesh out</b>	Remove adhering flesh from (hides) when preparing leather manufacture.
<b>flump</b>	Set (something or oneself) down with or as if with a noise. <i>Ellie <b>flumped</b> her hands down on her sewing.</i>
<b>go</b>	Go through in search of something search through someone s belongings in an unauthorized way. <i>Rosemary <b>goes</b> with roast lamb.</i>



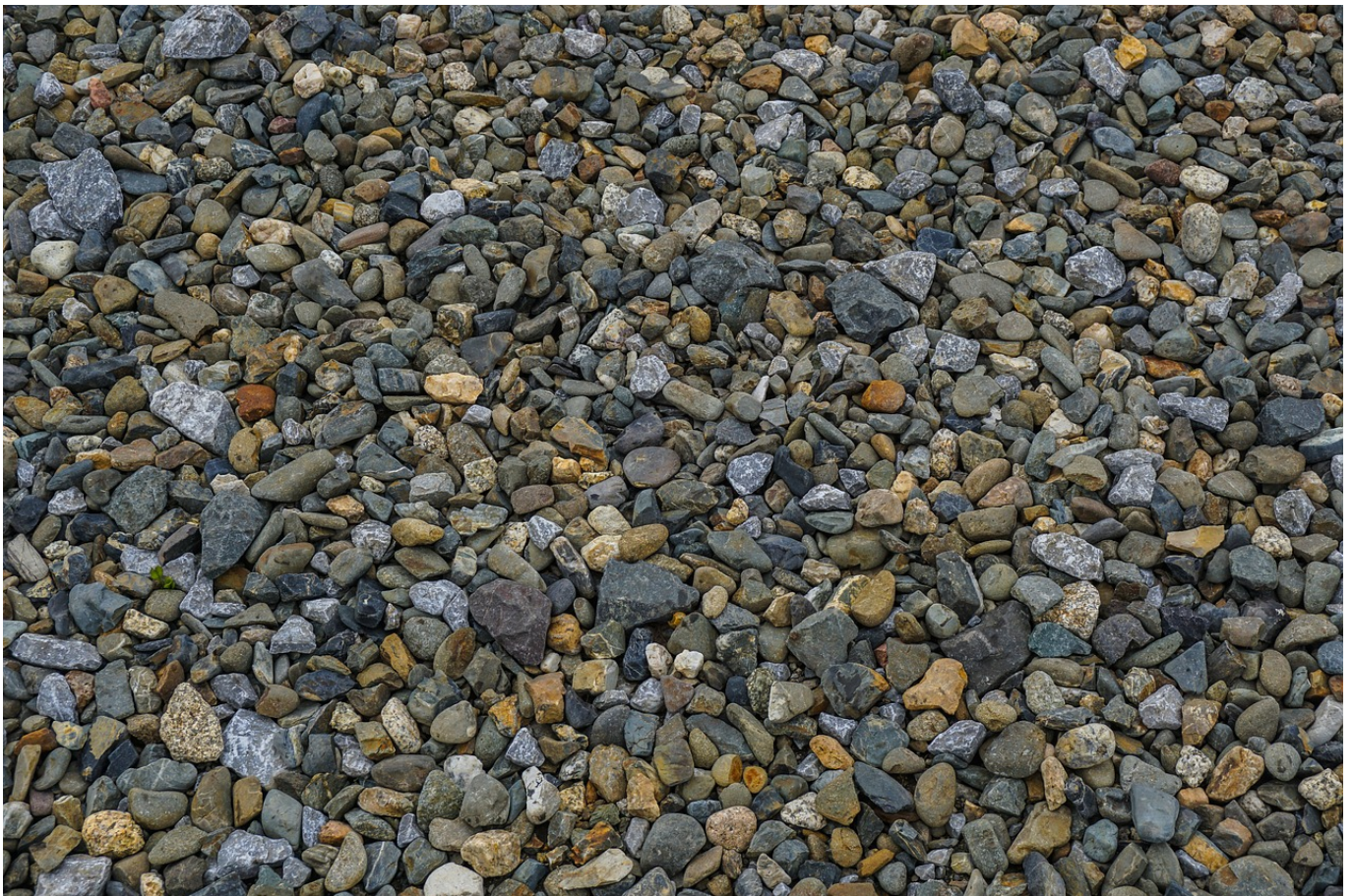
- plank** Cook and serve on a plank.  
*He **planked** himself into the sofa.*
- plonk** Sit down heavily and without ceremony.  
*People **plonking** around on expensive instruments.*
- plop** Fall or cause to fall with a plop.  
*The stone **plopped** into the pond.*
- plummet** Fall or drop straight down at high speed.  
*The stock market **plummeted**.*
- plump down** Make fat or plump.
- plump out** Set (something or oneself) down with or as if with a noise.
- plunk** Set down heavily or abruptly.  
*She **plunked** her pack on top of the bar.*
- plunk down** Bring down or defeat (an opponent).





## Usage Examples of "Plump" as a verb

- *Stew the dried fruits gently until they plump up.*
- *We will plump out that poor starving child.*
- *I plumped for the losing candidates.*
- *She plumped up her pillows.*
- *I was running from the kitchen to the living room, plumping the cushions and getting drinks in place.*

<b>ample</b>	Enough or more than enough; plentiful. <i>An <b>ample</b> supply of consumer goods.</i>
<b>broad in the beam</b>	Broad in scope or content- T.G.Winner.
<b>bulky</b>	Of large size for its weight. <i>A <b>bulky</b> carrier bag.</i>
<b><u>buxom</u></b>	Having a large bosom and pleasing curves. <i>A generation ago <b>buxom</b> actresses were popular.</i>
<b><u>chubby</u></b>	Sufficiently fat so as to have a pleasing fullness of figure. <i>A pretty child with <b>chubby</b> cheeks.</i>

<b>chunky</b>	Short and thick; as e.g. having short legs and heavy musculature. <i>A <b>chunky</b> bracelet.</i>
<b>dummy</b>	(of a person) short and stout. <i>A <b>dummy</b> little dumpling of a woman.</i>
<b>embonpoint</b>	Sufficiently fat so as to have a pleasing fullness of figure.
<b>fat</b>	Containing or composed of fat. <i>A <b>fat</b> cigarette.</i>
<b>fattish</b>	Somewhat fat.
<b>fleshy</b>	(of plant or fruit tissue) soft and thick. <i><b>Fleshy</b> greeny grey leaves.</i>
<b>full</b>	Constituting the full quantity or extent complete. <i>They had their photographs taken and he was <b>full</b> of it.</i>
<b>of ample proportions</b>	More than enough in size or scope or capacity.
<b>overweight</b>	Above an allowed weight. <i>An <b>overweight</b> lorry.</i>
<b>paunchy</b>	Having a large belly. <i>A slightly <b>paunchy</b> balding middle aged man.</i>
<b>portly</b>	Of a stately or dignified appearance and manner. <i>A <b>portly</b> little man with a bowler hat.</i>
<b>roly-poly</b>	Short and plump.
<b>rotund</b>	(of speech or literary style) sonorous; grandiloquent. <i>The <b>rotund</b> and reverberating phrase.</i>
<b>round</b>	(of a person's shoulders) bent forward from the line of the back. <i>His rich <b>round</b> voice went down well with the listeners.</i>
<b>rounded</b>	Curving and somewhat round in shape rather than jagged. <i>Low <b>rounded</b> hills.</i>
<b>stout</b>	(of a person) rather fat or of heavy build. <i><b>Stout</b> walking boots.</i>
<b>well covered</b>	Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.
<b>well padded</b>	Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.
<b>well rounded</b>	In good health especially after having suffered illness or injury.
<b>well upholstered</b>	In good health especially after having suffered illness or injury.

- *Pleasingly plump.*

- avaricious** Having or showing an extreme greed for wealth or material gain.  
*A corrupt and **avaricious** government.*
- belly** A pig's belly as food especially as a traded commodity.  
*His fat **belly** stuck out over his trousers.*
- blubber** (of a person's lips) swollen or protruding.  
*My six pack is quickly being covered in **blubber**.*
- buxom** (of a woman) plump, with a full figure and large breasts.

<b>calorific</b>	Relating to the amount of energy contained in food or fuel. <i>She knew the <b>calorific</b> contents of every morsel.</i>
<b>chubby</b>	Sufficiently fat so as to have a pleasing fullness of figure. <i>A <b>chubby</b> child.</i>
<b>dietary</b>	A regulated or restricted diet. <i><b>Dietary</b> restrictions.</i>
<b>fat</b>	Make or become fat. <i>A nice <b>fat</b> job.</i>
<b>fatten</b>	Make or become fat or fatter. <i>He could do with some good food to <b>fatten</b> him up.</i>
<b>fatty</b>	Containing or composed of fat. <i><b>Fatty</b> foods.</i>
<b>feed</b>	Feed into supply. <i>Cow <b>feed</b>.</i>
<b>fleshy</b>	Resembling flesh in appearance or texture. <i>Normally the tissue is <b>fleshy</b> pink.</i>
<b>gobble</b>	(of a large organization) incorporate or take over (a smaller one). <i>He <b>gobbled</b> up the rest of his sandwich.</i>
<b>heavy</b>	Large and powerful especially designed for heavy loads or rough work. <i>Steering that is <b>heavy</b> when parking.</i>
<b>hypodermic</b>	A hypodermic syringe or injection. <i><b>Hypodermic</b> needle.</i>
<b>nutrient</b>	Of or providing nourishment. <i>Fish is a source of many important <b>nutrients</b> including protein vitamins and minerals.</i>
<b>nutritious</b>	Of or providing nourishment. <i>Home cooked burgers make a <b>nutritious</b> meal.</i>
<b>obese</b>	Excessively fat. <i>A hugely <b>obese</b> young man.</i>
<b>obesity</b>	The state of being grossly fat or overweight. <i>The problem of <b>obesity</b> among children.</i>
<b>overeat</b>	Overeat or eat immodestly make a pig of oneself. <i>If your friends <b>overeat</b> you re more likely to <b>overeat</b> too.</i>
<b>overweight</b>	Having more investment in a particular area than is normal or desirable. <i>We were <b>overweighted</b> in technology last year.</i>
<b>paunch</b>	Disembowel (an animal). <i>His body was powerful and square with the beginnings of a <b>paunch</b>.</i>

- paunchy** Having a large belly.  
*A slightly **paunchy** balding middle aged man.*
- portly** Having a stout body; somewhat fat (used especially of a man).  
*He was a man of **portly** presence.*
- pudgy** Short and plump.  
*His **pudgy** fingers.*
- rotund** Excessively fat.  
***Rotund** tones.*
- stout** Having or showing courage and determination.  
***Stout** middle aged men.*
- tubby** Short and plump.  
*Historic classical recordings with a **tubby** overall sound.*
