
Plump as a Verb

- Set (something or oneself) down with or as if with a noise.
- Shake or pat (a cushion or pillow) to adjust its stuffing and make it rounded and soft.
- Become rounder and fatter.
- Give support (to) or make a choice (of) one out of a group or number.
- Make fat or plump.
- Drop sharply.

<u>plummet</u>	Fall or drop straight down at high speed. The stock market plummet ed.
plump down Make fat or plump.	
plump out	Set (something or oneself) down with or as if with a noise.
plunk	Set down heavily or abruptly. She plunk ed her pack on top of the bar.

plunk down Bring down or defeat (an opponent.

- I plumped for the losing candidates.
- She plumped up her pillows.
- I was running from the kitchen to the living room, plumping the cushions and getting drinks in place.




Plump as an Adjective

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "plump" as an adjective can have the following definitions:



- Sufficiently fat so as to have a pleasing fullness of figure.
- (of a person) rather fat.
- Sufficiently fat so as to have a pleasing fullness of figure.
- Having a full rounded shape.

bulky	Of large size for its weight. A bulky carrier bag.

full	Constituting the full quantity or extent complete. They had their photographs taken and he was full of it.	
of ample proportions More than enough in size or scope or capacity.		
overweight	Above an allowed weight. An overweight lorry.	
<u>paunchy</u>	Having a large belly. A slightly paunchy balding middle aged man.	
portly	Of a stately or dignified appearance and manner. A portly little man with a bowler hat.	
roly-poly	Short and plump.	
rotund	(of speech or literary style) sonorous; grandiloquent. <i>The rotund and reverberating phrase.</i>	
round	(of a person's shoulders) bent forward from the line of the back. His rich round voice went down well with the listeners.	
rounded	Curving and somewhat round in shape rather than jagged. Low rounded hills.	
<u>stout</u>	(of a person) rather fat or of heavy build. <i>Stout</i> walking boots.	
well covered	Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.	
well padded	Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.	
well rounded	In good health especially after having suffered illness or injury.	
well upholstered	In good health especially after having suffered illness or injury.

calorific	Relating to the amount of energy contained in food or fuel. She knew the calorific contents of every morsel.
<u>chubby</u>	Sufficiently fat so as to have a pleasing fullness of figure. A chubby child.
dietary	A regulated or restricted diet. <i>Dietary</i> restrictions.
fat	Make or become fat. A nice fat job.
fatten	Make or become fat or fatter. <i>He could do with some good food to fatten him up.</i>
fatty	Containing or composed of fat. <i>Fatty foods</i> .
feed	Feed into supply. <i>Cow feed</i> .
fleshy	Resembling flesh in appearance or texture. Normally the tissue is fleshy pink.
gobble	(of a large organization) incorporate or take over (a smaller one. <i>He gobbled up the rest of his sandwich.</i>
heavy	Large and powerful especially designed for heavy loads or rough work. <i>Steering that is heavy when parking.</i>
hypodermic	A hypodermic syringe or injection. <i>Hypodermic needle.</i>
nutrient	Of or providing nourishment. Fish is a source of many important nutrient s including protein vitamins and minerals.
<u>nutritious</u>	Of or providing nourishment. Home cooked burgers make a nutritious meal.
<u>obese</u>	Excessively fat. A hugely obese young man.
obesity	The state of being grossly fat or overweight. The problem of obesity among children.
overeat	Overeat or eat immodestly make a pig of oneself. If your friends overeat you re more likely to overeat too.
overweight	Having more investment in a particular area than is normal or desirable. We were overweight ed in technology last year.
paunch	Disembowel (an animal. His body was powerful and square with the beginnings of a paunch .



<u>paunchy</u>	Having a large belly. A slightly paunchy balding middle aged man.
portly	Having a stout body; somewhat fat (used especially of a man. <i>He was a man of portly presence.</i>
pudgy	Short and plump. His pudgy fingers.
rotund	Excessively fat. O rotund tones.
<u>stout</u>	Having or showing courage and determination. <i>Stout middle aged men.</i>
tubby	Short and plump. Historic classical recordings with a tubby overall sound.
