## Associations of "Pluralistic" (30 Words)

<a href="#">assorted</a>	Consisting of a haphazard assortment of different kinds. <i>Bowls in <b>assorted</b> colours.</i>
<b>assortment</b>	The act of distributing things into classes or categories of the same type. <i>The room was filled with an <b>assortment</b> of clothes.</i>
<b>classification</b>	The basic cognitive process of arranging into classes or categories. <i>The <b>classification</b> of the platypus was one of the critical issues of the 1830s.</i>
<a href="#">deflection</a>	A turning aside (of your course or attention or concern). <i>A <b>deflection</b> from his goal.</i>
<a href="#">dissimilar</a>	Marked by dissimilarity. <i>The pleasures of the romance novel are not <b>dissimilar</b> from those of the chocolate bar.</i>
<b>diverse</b>	Showing a great deal of variety; very different. <i>A person of <b>diverse</b> talents.</i>
<b>diversity</b>	The practice or quality of including or involving people from a range of different social and ethnic backgrounds and of different genders, sexual orientations, etc. <i>There was considerable <b>diversity</b> in the style of the reports.</i>
<b>eclectic</b>	Someone who selects according to the eclectic method. <i>Her musical tastes are <b>eclectic</b>.</i>
<a href="#">horde</a>	A small loosely knit social group typically consisting of about five families. <i>Tartar <b>hordes</b>.</i>
<b>lot</b>	Divide items into lots for sale at an auction. <i>It s just one <b>lot</b> of rich people stealing from another.</i>
<b>manifold</b>	A lightweight paper used with carbon paper to make multiple copies. <i>The implications of this decision were <b>manifold</b>.</i>

<b>many</b>	A quantifier that can be used with count nouns and is often preceded by `as' or `too' or `so' or `that'; amounting to a large but indefinite number. <i>Music for the <b>many</b>.</i>
<b>miscellaneous</b>	Consisting of a haphazard assortment of different kinds. <i>A <b>miscellaneous</b> collection of well known ne er do wells.</i>
<b>miscellany</b>	A group or collection of different items; a mixture. <i>A <b>miscellany</b> of houses.</i>
<b>motley</b>	A garment made of motley especially a court jester s costume. <i>A jester dressed in <b>motley</b>.</i>
<b>multifaceted</b>	Having many aspects. <i>A <b>multifaceted</b> undertaking.</i>
<b>multifarious</b>	Having many aspects or qualities. <i><b>Multifarious</b> interests.</i>
<b>multiplicity</b>	A large number. <i>The demand for higher education depends on a <b>multiplicity</b> of factors.</i>
<b>multitude</b>	The state of being numerous. <i>Placing ultimate political power in the hands of the <b>multitude</b>.</i>
<b>numerous</b>	Amounting to a large indefinite number. <i>The family was <b>numerous</b>.</i>
<b>pastiche</b>	Imitate the style of (an artist or work). <i>A <b>pastiche</b> of literary models and sources.</i>
<b>plurality</b>	The number by which plurality exceeds the number of votes cast for the candidate placed second. <i>To mark <b>plurality</b> one language may add an extra syllable to the word whereas another may simply change the vowel in the existing final syllable.</i>
<b>plus</b>	A mathematical operation of addition. <i><b>Plus</b> 60 degrees centigrade.</i>
<b>potpourri</b>	A collection containing a variety of sorts of things. <i>He played a <b>potpourri</b> of tunes from Gilbert and Sullivan.</i>
<b>protean</b>	Tending or able to change frequently or easily. <i>It is difficult to comprehend the whole of this <b>protean</b> subject.</i>
<b>sundry</b>	Various items not important enough to be mentioned individually. <i><b>Sundry</b> sciences commonly known as social.</i>
<b>varied</b>	Characterized by variety. <i>Immigrants <b>varied</b> ethnic and religious traditions.</i>
<b>variety</b>	A collection containing a variety of sorts of things. <i>The range and <b>variety</b> of his work is amazing.</i>

vary

Be subject to change in accordance with a variable.  
*His moods **vary** depending on the weather.*
