Associations of "Pluralistic" (30 Words)

assorted	Consisting of a haphazard assortment of different kinds. <i>Bowls in assorted colours.</i>
assortment	The act of distributing things into classes or categories of the same type. <i>The room was filled with an assortment of clothes.</i>
classification	The basic cognitive process of arranging into classes or categories. <i>The classification of the platypus was one of the critical issues of the 1830s.</i>
deflection	A turning aside (of your course or attention or concern). <i>A deflection from his goal.</i>
dissimilar	Marked by dissimilarity. <i>The pleasures of the romance novel are not dissimilar from those of the chocolate bar.</i>
diverse	Showing a great deal of variety; very different. <i>A person of diverse talents.</i>
diversity	The practice or quality of including or involving people from a range of different social and ethnic backgrounds and of different genders, sexual orientations, etc. <i>There was considerable diversity in the style of the reports.</i>
eclectic	Someone who selects according to the eclectic method. <i>Her musical tastes are eclectic.</i>
horde	A small loosely knit social group typically consisting of about five families. <i>Tartar hordes.</i>
lot	Divide items into lots for sale at an auction. <i>It s just one lot of rich people stealing from another.</i>
manifold	A lightweight paper used with carbon paper to make multiple copies. <i>The implications of this decision were manifold.</i>

many	A quantifier that can be used with count nouns and is often preceded by `as' or `too' or `so' or `that'; amounting to a large but indefinite number. <i>Music for the many.</i>
miscellaneous	Consisting of a haphazard assortment of different kinds. <i>A miscellaneous collection of well known ne er do wells.</i>
miscellany	A group or collection of different items; a mixture. <i>A miscellany of houses.</i>
motley	A garment made of motley especially a court jester s costume. <i>A jester dressed in motley.</i>
multifaceted	Having many aspects. <i>A multifaceted undertaking.</i>
multifarious	Having many aspects or qualities. <i>Multifarious interests.</i>
multiplicity	A large number. <i>The demand for higher education depends on a multiplicity of factors.</i>
multitude	The state of being numerous. <i>Placing ultimate political power in the hands of the multitude.</i>
numerous	Amounting to a large indefinite number. <i>The family was numerous.</i>
pastiche	Imitate the style of (an artist or work). <i>A pastiche of literary models and sources.</i>
plurality	The number by which plurality exceeds the number of votes cast for the candidate placed second. <i>To mark plurality one language may add an extra syllable to the word whereas another may simply change the vowel in the existing final syllable.</i>
plus	A mathematical operation of addition. <i>Plus 60 degrees centigrade.</i>
potpourri	A collection containing a variety of sorts of things. <i>He played a potpourri of tunes from Gilbert and Sullivan.</i>
protean	Tending or able to change frequently or easily. <i>It is difficult to comprehend the whole of this protean subject.</i>
sundry	Various items not important enough to be mentioned individually. <i>Sundry sciences commonly known as social.</i>
varied	Characterized by variety. <i>Immigrants varied ethnic and religious traditions.</i>
variety	A collection containing a variety of sorts of things. <i>The range and variety of his work is amazing.</i>

Having great diversity or variety.
*Their environments are locally **various**.*

vary

Be subject to change in accordance with a variable.
*His moods **vary** depending on the weather.*
