Plurality as a Noun

Definitions of "Plurality" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “plurality” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The state of being plural.*
- *The fact or state of being plural.*
- *A large number of people or things.*
- *The number of votes cast for a candidate who receives more than any other but does not receive an absolute majority.*
- *(in an election with more than 2 options) the number of votes for the candidate or party receiving the greatest number (but less than half of the votes).*
- *A large indefinite number.*
- *The number by which plurality exceeds the number of votes cast for the candidate placed second.*
- *The number of votes for the candidate or party receiving the greatest number (but less than half of the votes).*



Synonyms of "Plurality" as a noun (8 Words)

battalion	An army unit usually consisting of a headquarters and three or more companies. <i>A battalion of ants.</i>
diversity	The condition or result of being changeable. <i>Newspapers were obliged to allow a diversity of views to be printed.</i>
large number	A garment size for a large person.
lot	A plot of land assigned for sale or for a particular use. <i>A vacant lot.</i>
<u>multitude</u>	The mass of ordinary people without power or influence. <i>Father Peter addressed the multitude.</i>
<u>pack</u>	A quantity of fish fruit or other foods packed or canned in a particular season. <i>A pack of wolves will encircle an ailing prey.</i>
range	An open or enclosed area with targets for shooting practice. <i>These rockets have a range of 30 to 40 miles.</i>
relative majority	A person related by blood or marriage.



Usage Examples of "Plurality" as a noun

- *To mark plurality, one language may add an extra syllable to the word whereas another may simply change the vowel in the existing final syllable.*
- *Some languages add an extra syllable to mark plurality.*
- *He obtained dispensations to hold several benefices in plurality.*
- *A plurality of critical approaches.*
- *A plurality of religions.*

abundance

The property of a more than adequate quantity or supply.
*The growth of industry promised wealth and **abundance**.*

assorted

Of various sorts put together; miscellaneous.
*An arrangement of **assorted** spring flowers.*

batch	Batch together assemble or process as a batch. <i>A batch of bread.</i>
battalion	A large indefinite number. <i>A battalion of ants.</i>
<u>commander</u>	A rank of naval officer above lieutenant commander and below captain. <i>The commander of a paratroop regiment.</i>
considerably	By a notably large amount or to a notably large extent; greatly. <i>The house has fallen considerably in value.</i>
<u>countless</u>	Too many to be counted; very many. <i>She d apologized countless times before.</i>
crowd	Cause to herd drive or crowd together. <i>They played before a 25 000 crowd.</i>
diversity	The state of being diverse; variety. <i>Equality and diversity should be supported for their own sake.</i>
dozen	A group or set of twelve. <i>She has dozens of admirers.</i>
galore	Existing in abundance. <i>Whiskey galore.</i>
grenadier	A reddish-brown African waxbill with a red bill and a bright blue rump.
<u>horde</u>	A moving crowd. <i>A horde of beery rugby fans.</i>
<u>innumerable</u>	Too many to be counted (often used hyperbolically). <i>Innumerable difficulties.</i>
<u>legion</u>	A large military unit. <i>Her fans are legion.</i>
lot	Divide items into lots for sale at an auction. <i>They were an angry lot.</i>
many	The majority of people. <i>Never saw so many people.</i>
much	To a great extent; a great deal. <i>Thanks very much.</i>
multiplicity	The property of being multiple. <i>The demand for higher education depends on a multiplicity of factors.</i>
<u>multitude</u>	The state of being numerous. <i>Placing ultimate political power in the hands of the multitude.</i>
numerous	Amounting to a large indefinite number. <i>She had complained to the council on numerous occasions.</i>

plenty	A large number or amount or extent. <i>There was plenty of food for everyone.</i>
pluralism	A political theory or system of power-sharing among a number of political parties.
plus	(after a grade) rather better than. <i>A grade of C plus.</i>
simultaneously	At the same instant. <i>The telethon was broadcast simultaneously on 31 US networks.</i>
swarm	Of flying insects move in or form a swarm. <i>The bees had swarmed and left the hive.</i>
teem	Be teeming be abuzz. <i>Every garden is teeming with wildlife.</i>
ton	A unit of weight or volume of sea cargo equal to a metric ton 1 000 kg or 40 cu ft. <i>He scored 102 not out his third ton of the tour.</i>
variety	A collection containing a variety of sorts of things. <i>He had a variety of disorders.</i>
various	Having or showing different properties or qualities. <i>Cited various reasons for his behavior.</i>
