## Plurality as a Noun

### Definitions of "Plurality" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “plurality” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The state of being plural.*
- *The fact or state of being plural.*
- *A large number of people or things.*
- *The number of votes cast for a candidate who receives more than any other but does not receive an absolute majority.*
- *(in an election with more than 2 options) the number of votes for the candidate or party receiving the greatest number (but less than half of the votes).*
- *A large indefinite number.*
- *The number by which plurality exceeds the number of votes cast for the candidate placed second.*
- *The number of votes for the candidate or party receiving the greatest number (but less than half of the votes).*



## Synonyms of "Plurality" as a noun (8 Words)

<b>battalion</b>	An army unit usually consisting of a headquarters and three or more companies. <i>A <b>battalion</b> of ants.</i>
<b>diversity</b>	The condition or result of being changeable. <i>Newspapers were obliged to allow a <b>diversity</b> of views to be printed.</i>
<b>large number</b>	A garment size for a large person.
<b>lot</b>	A plot of land assigned for sale or for a particular use. <i>A vacant <b>lot</b>.</i>
<u><b>multitude</b></u>	The mass of ordinary people without power or influence. <i>Father Peter addressed the <b>multitude</b>.</i>
<u><b>pack</b></u>	A quantity of fish fruit or other foods packed or canned in a particular season. <i>A <b>pack</b> of wolves will encircle an ailing prey.</i>
<b>range</b>	An open or enclosed area with targets for shooting practice. <i>These rockets have a <b>range</b> of 30 to 40 miles.</i>
<b>relative majority</b>	A person related by blood or marriage.





## Usage Examples of "Plurality" as a noun

- *To mark plurality, one language may add an extra syllable to the word whereas another may simply change the vowel in the existing final syllable.*
- *Some languages add an extra syllable to mark plurality.*
- *He obtained dispensations to hold several benefices in plurality.*
- *A plurality of critical approaches.*
- *A plurality of religions.*



## Associations of "Plurality" (30 Words)

### **abundance**

The property of a more than adequate quantity or supply.  
*The growth of industry promised wealth and **abundance**.*

### **assorted**

Of various sorts put together; miscellaneous.  
*An arrangement of **assorted** spring flowers.*

<b>batch</b>	Batch together assemble or process as a batch. <i>A <b>batch</b> of bread.</i>
<b>battalion</b>	A large indefinite number. <i>A <b>battalion</b> of ants.</i>
<u>commander</u>	A rank of naval officer above lieutenant commander and below captain. <i>The <b>commander</b> of a paratroop regiment.</i>
<b>considerably</b>	By a notably large amount or to a notably large extent; greatly. <i>The house has fallen <b>considerably</b> in value.</i>
<u>countless</u>	Too many to be counted; very many. <i>She d apologized <b>countless</b> times before.</i>
<b>crowd</b>	Cause to herd drive or crowd together. <i>They played before a 25 000 <b>crowd</b>.</i>
<b>diversity</b>	The state of being diverse; variety. <i>Equality and <b>diversity</b> should be supported for their own sake.</i>
<b>dozen</b>	A group or set of twelve. <i>She has <b>dozens</b> of admirers.</i>
<b>galore</b>	Existing in abundance. <i>Whiskey <b>galore</b>.</i>
<b>grenadier</b>	A reddish-brown African waxbill with a red bill and a bright blue rump.
<u>horde</u>	A moving crowd. <i>A <b>horde</b> of beery rugby fans.</i>
<u>innumerable</u>	Too many to be counted (often used hyperbolically). <i><b>Innumerable</b> difficulties.</i>
<u>legion</u>	A large military unit. <i>Her fans are <b>legion</b>.</i>
<b>lot</b>	Divide items into lots for sale at an auction. <i>They were an angry <b>lot</b>.</i>
<b>many</b>	The majority of people. <i>Never saw so <b>many</b> people.</i>
<b>much</b>	To a great extent; a great deal. <i>Thanks very <b>much</b>.</i>
<b>multiplicity</b>	The property of being multiple. <i>The demand for higher education depends on a <b>multiplicity</b> of factors.</i>
<u>multitude</u>	The state of being numerous. <i>Placing ultimate political power in the hands of the <b>multitude</b>.</i>
<b>numerous</b>	Amounting to a large indefinite number. <i>She had complained to the council on <b>numerous</b> occasions.</i>

<b>plenty</b>	A large number or amount or extent. <i>There was <b>plenty</b> of food for everyone.</i>
<b>pluralism</b>	A political theory or system of power-sharing among a number of political parties.
<b>plus</b>	(after a grade) rather better than. <i>A grade of C <b>plus</b>.</i>
<b>simultaneously</b>	At the same instant. <i>The telethon was broadcast <b>simultaneously</b> on 31 US networks.</i>
<b>swarm</b>	Of flying insects move in or form a swarm. <i>The bees had <b>swarmed</b> and left the hive.</i>
<b>teem</b>	Be teeming be abuzz. <i>Every garden is <b>teeming</b> with wildlife.</i>
<b>ton</b>	A unit of weight or volume of sea cargo equal to a metric ton 1 000 kg or 40 cu ft. <i>He scored 102 not out his third <b>ton</b> of the tour.</i>
<b>variety</b>	A collection containing a variety of sorts of things. <i>He had a <b>variety</b> of disorders.</i>
<b>various</b>	Having or showing different properties or qualities. <i>Cited <b>various</b> reasons for his behavior.</i>
