Definitions of "Plurality" as a noun

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "plurality" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- The state of being plural.
- The fact or state of being plural.
- A large number of people or things.
- The number of votes cast for a candidate who receives more than any other but does not receive an absolute majority.
- (in an election with more than 2 options) the number of votes for the candidate or party receiving the greatest number (but less that half of the votes.
- A large indefinite number.
- The number by which plurality exceeds the number of votes cast for the candidate placed second.
- The number of votes for the candidate or party receiving the greatest number (but less that half of the votes.

pack season.


A **pack** of wolves will encircle an ailing prey.

relative majority A person related by blood or marriage.








Usage Examples of "Plurality" as a noun
