Definitions of "Podium" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “podium” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *(in some sporting events) a structure consisting of three adjacent platforms of different heights, on which the competitors finishing in first, second, and third places receive their awards.*
- *A lectern.*
- *A small platform on which a person may stand to be seen by an audience, as when making a speech or conducting an orchestra.*
- *A platform raised above the surrounding level to give prominence to the person on it.*
- *A continuous projecting base or pedestal under a building.*
- *A projecting lower structure around the base of a tower block.*
- *A raised platform surrounding the arena in an ancient amphitheatre.*



Synonyms of "Podium" as a noun (21 Words)

ambo	A platform raised above the surrounding level to give prominence to the person on it.
<u>base</u>	A known line used as a geometrical base for trigonometry. <i>Everything she cooked seemed to have rice as the base.</i>
bed	A place on the seabed where shellfish especially oysters or mussels breed or are bred. <i>The unit has 20 geriatric beds.</i>
bottom	The fleshy part of the human body that you sit on. <i>Whatever his faults he possesses that old fashioned quality bottom.</i>
<u>column</u>	Anything that approximates the shape of a column or tower. <i>I ve been reading your column for five years.</i>
dais	A low platform for a lectern or throne.
foot	A member of a surveillance team who works on foot or rides as a passenger. <i>The foot of the page.</i>

foundation	The basis on which something is grounded. <i>A foundation brush.</i>
mounting	The action of mounting something. <i>He pulled the curtain rail from its mounting.</i>
pier	The pillar of an arch or supporting a bridge.
pillar	Something shaped like a pillar. <i>Science eroded the pillars of superstition.</i>
platform	A document stating the aims and principles of a political party. <i>Their candidate simply ignored the party platform.</i>
plinth	An architectural support or base (as for a column or statue). <i>Busts of the King and Queen on marble plinths.</i>
pulpit	A raised enclosed platform in a church or chapel from which the preacher delivers a sermon. <i>Many ministers delivered political guidance from their pulpits.</i>
rostrum	A raised platform on which a person stands to make a public speech, receive an award or medal, play music, or conduct an orchestra. <i>The composer moved from keyboard to rostrum.</i>
soapbox	Used with reference to a situation in which someone expresses strong opinions about a particular subject. <i>A soapbox orator.</i>
stage	A stagecoach. <i>I was in the early stages of pregnancy.</i>
stand	The position where a thing or person stands. <i>A taxi stand.</i>
stump	Used in relation to political campaigning. <i>His jibes at his opponents may have won him some support on the stump early in his campaign.</i>
substructure	The basic structure or features of a system or organization. <i>Here is a Roman theatre built over barrel vaulted substructures.</i>
support	A musical part vocal or instrumental that supports or provides background for other musical parts. <i>She's been through a bad time and needs our support.</i>



Usage Examples of "Podium" as a noun

- *A six columned portico raised on a podium.*
- *He was at the podium facing an expectant conference crowd.*
- *I took the score out of my briefcase and put it on the podium.*
- *It was more than I could imagine to be up on the podium and singing the national anthem.*

altar	A table or flat-topped block used as the focus for a religious ritual, especially for making sacrifices or offerings to a deity.
baptismal	Of or relating to baptism. <i>Baptismal rites.</i>
chalice	A bowl-shaped drinking vessel; especially the Eucharistic cup.
confessional	Relating to religious confession. <i>Tabloid confessionals.</i>
course	A pursuit of game (especially hares) with greyhounds by sight rather than scent. <i>The course of history.</i>
dais	A platform raised above the surrounding level to give prominence to the person on it.
goblet	A drinking glass with a foot and a stem. <i>A beautifully engraved crystal goblet.</i>
homework	Schoolwork that a pupil is required to do at home. <i>He always helps his daughter with her homework.</i>
homiletics	The art of preaching.
homily	A sermon on a moral or religious topic. <i>She delivered her homily about the need for patience.</i>
lear	The hero of William Shakespeare's tragedy who was betrayed and mistreated by two of his scheming daughters.
lectern	A tall stand with a sloping top to hold a book or notes, from which someone, typically a preacher or lecturer, can read while standing up.
lecture	Deliver an educational lecture or lectures. <i>In each course there are supporting lectures and tutorials.</i>
monitory	Serving to warn. <i>The chill monitory wail of an air raid siren.</i>
oratory	Addressing an audience formally (usually a long and rhetorical address and often pompous). <i>He loved the sound of his own oratory.</i>
preach	Used to affirm one's approval of or support for a stated opinion, advocated course of action, etc. <i>Our pastor will preach the sermon.</i>

pulpit	A guard rail enclosing a small area at the bow of a yacht. <i>The movies could rival the pulpit as an agency moulding the ideas of the mass public.</i>
read	Of a piece of writing convey a specified impression to the reader. <i>It s the best novel I ve ever read.</i>
reliquary	A container for holy relics.
rostrum	A raised platform supporting a film or television camera. <i>Speaker after speaker stepped up to the rostrum.</i>
sacrifice	An animal person or object offered in the act of sacrifice. <i>He had to sell his car at a considerable sacrifice.</i>
sacrificial	Designed to be used up or destroyed in fulfilling a purpose or function. <i>An altar for sacrificial offerings.</i>
<u>sermon</u>	An address of a religious nature (usually delivered during a church service). <i>I preached my first sermon on original sin.</i>
speech	The expression of or the ability to express thoughts and feelings by articulate sounds. <i>She wouldn t accept his correction of her speech.</i>
<u>stage</u>	Perform a play especially on a stage. <i>I ve always wanted to go on the stage.</i>
stand	The position where a thing or person stands. <i>The hotel stands in three acres of gardens.</i>
stump	Remove tree stumps from. <i>This problem stumped her.</i>
teach	A teacher. <i>She came to say Hi to her old teach.</i>
uproot	Move (someone) from their home or a familiar location. <i>A revolution is necessary to uproot the social order.</i>
valedictorian	(in North America) a student who delivers the valedictory at a graduation ceremony.
