
## Poem as a Noun

#### Definitions of "Poem" as a noun

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "poem" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- A piece of writing in which the expression of feelings and ideas is given intensity by particular attention to diction (sometimes involving rhyme), rhythm, and imagery.
- A composition written in metrical feet forming rhythmical lines.





# Synonyms of "Poem" as a noun (6 Words)

piece of poetry	A serving that has been cut from a larger portion.
rhyme	Correspondence in the sounds of two or more lines (especially final sounds. Harriet sang Ben little <b>rhyme</b> s.
song	A musical composition suggestive of a song. A pop <b>song</b> .
verse	A versicle. We were each required to recite a Bible <b>verse</b> from memory.
verse composition	A line of metrical text.
verse form	A line of metrical text.





## Usage Examples of "Poem" as a noun

- Lyric poems.
- A poem in terza rima.





# Associations of "Poem" (30 Words)

<u>anthology</u>	A collection of songs or musical compositions issued in one album. An <b>anthology</b> of European poetry.
antiphon	A musical setting of an antiphon.
<u>aphorism</u>	A pithy observation which contains a general truth. The debate begins and ends at the level of <b>aphorism</b> with commentators saying that something must be done.
assonant	Having the same sound (especially the same vowel sound) occurring in successive stressed syllables. Note the <b>assonant</b> words and syllables in tilting at windmills.
<u>bard</u>	Shakespeare. Our national <b>bard</b> Robert Burns.
<u>cadence</u>	Rhythm. The final <b>cadence</b> s of the Prelude.



canto	The highest part (usually the melody) in a piece of choral music. Dante s Divine Comedy has 100 <b>canto</b> s.
couplet	A pair of successive lines of verse, typically rhyming and of the same length.
doggerel	Comic verse composed in irregular rhythm. <i>Doggerel</i> verses.
<u>epic</u>	Constituting or having to do with or suggestive of a literary epic. A Hollywood biblical <b>epic</b> .
epigram	A pithy saying or remark expressing an idea in a clever and amusing way. A Wildean <b>epigram</b> .
fiction	A deliberately false or improbable account. The notion of the country being a democracy is a polite <b>fiction</b> .
literature	The humanistic study of a body of literature. <i>Her place in <b>literature</b> is secure.</i>
lyric	Write lyrics for a song. A <b>lyric</b> soprano with a light clear timbre.
minstrel	A performer in a minstrel show. They listened to the <b>minstrel</b> s singing songs of knightly prowess.
missive	A letter, especially a long or official one. Yet another <b>missive</b> from the Foreign Office.
<u>ode</u>	A lyric poem with complex stanza forms.
poesy	Literature in metrical form. <i>The genius of <b>poesy</b></i> .
<u>poetic</u>	Written in verse rather than prose. A <b>poetic</b> drama.
poetry	Something regarded as comparable to poetry in its beauty. <i>The music department is housed in a building which is pure <b>poetry</b>.</i>
<u>prose</u>	Compose in or convert into prose. Closely typed in best office <b>prose</b> .
quatrain	A stanza of four lines.
rhapsody	(in ancient Greece) an epic poem adapted for recitation. <i>Rhapsodies of praise.</i>
rhyme	Compose rhymes. The clues were written in <b>rhyme</b> .
sentence	Pronounce a sentence on somebody in a court of law. <i>Ten army officers were <b>sentence</b>d to life imprisonment.</i>
sonnet	Praise in a sonnet. He <b>sonnet</b> ed his hostess now.



- **stanza** A group of lines forming the basic recurring metrical unit in a poem; a verse.
- **syllable** A character or characters representing a syllable.
- *synable* The word pocket has two *syllable*s.
- Compose verses or put into verse.
- verse The second verse.
- A device that writes data to a storage medium.
- **writer** A device that writes data A writer of short stories.
