Associations of "Point of view" (30 Words)

anthropocentric	Regarding humankind as the central or most important element of existence, especially as opposed to God or animals. <i>When we assess animal intelligence we tend to take a very anthropocentric view.</i>
aspect	Of a planet form an aspect with another celestial body. <i>From every aspect theirs was a changing world.</i>
<u>backdrop</u>	The setting or background for a scene, event, or situation. <i>The rolling hills that backdropped our camp.</i>
<u>background</u>	Form a background to. <i>When the rain came he could hear the sound of thunder in the background.</i>
bias	Cause to be biased. <i>There was evidence of bias against foreign applicants.</i>
diorama	A scenic painting, viewed through a peephole, in which changes in colour and direction of illumination simulate changes in the weather, time of day, etc.
<u>facet</u>	One side of something many-sided, especially of a cut gem. <i>A blue and green jewel that shines from a million facets.</i>
foreground	Move into the foreground to make more visible or prominent. <i>The intricate garden depicted in the foreground.</i>
homocentric	Having the same centre.
jaundiced	Showing or affected by prejudice or envy or distaste. <i>They looked on politicians with a jaundiced eye.</i>
<u>landscape</u>	The genre of landscape painting. <i>The soft colours of the Northumbrian landscape.</i>
<u>mentality</u>	Mental ability. <i>Machines can possess mentality.</i>

mindset	A habitual or characteristic mental attitude that determines how you will interpret and respond to situations. <i>The region seems stuck in a medieval mindset.</i>
objectively	With objectivity. <i>The researchers are objectively assessing risk factors.</i>
<u>objectivity</u>	The quality of being objective. <i>The piece lacked any objectivity.</i>
<u>outlook</u>	A habitual or characteristic mental attitude that determines how you will interpret and respond to situations. <i>The pleasant outlook from the club window.</i>
panorama	An unbroken view of the whole region surrounding an observer. <i>The tower offers a wonderful panorama of Prague.</i>
panoramic	(of a view or picture) with a wide view surrounding the observer; sweeping. <i>On a clear day there are panoramic views.</i>
<u>personally</u>	As an individual rather than indirectly. <i>Nothing had gone well personally or politically.</i>
perspective	A particular attitude towards or way of regarding something; a point of view. <i>We must keep a sense of perspective about what he s done.</i>
perspicacity	Intelligence manifested by being astute (as in business dealings). <i>The perspicacity of her remarks.</i>
prejudiced	Being biased or having a belief or attitude formed beforehand. <i>A prejudiced judge.</i>
prospect	The possibility of future success. <i>Some training which offered a prospect of continuous employment.</i>
<u>scene</u>	The pieces of scenery used in a play or opera. <i>A scene from Tarantino s latest movie.</i>
scenic	Of or relating to the stage or stage scenery. <i>The scenic route from Florence to Siena.</i>
setting	The set of facts or circumstances that surround a situation or event. <i>If you find the room getting too hot check the thermostat setting.</i>
<u>standpoint</u>	The position from which someone is able to view a scene or an object. <i>She writes on religion from the standpoint of a believer.</i>
tableau	A group of models or motionless figures representing a scene from a story or from history a tableau vivant. <i>In the first act the action is presented in a series of tableaux.</i>

values

Beliefs of a person or social group in which they have an emotional investment (either for or against something).

*He has very conservatives **values**.*

vista

A long, narrow view as between rows of trees or buildings, especially one closed by a building or other structure.

***Vistas** of freedom seemed to open ahead of him.*
