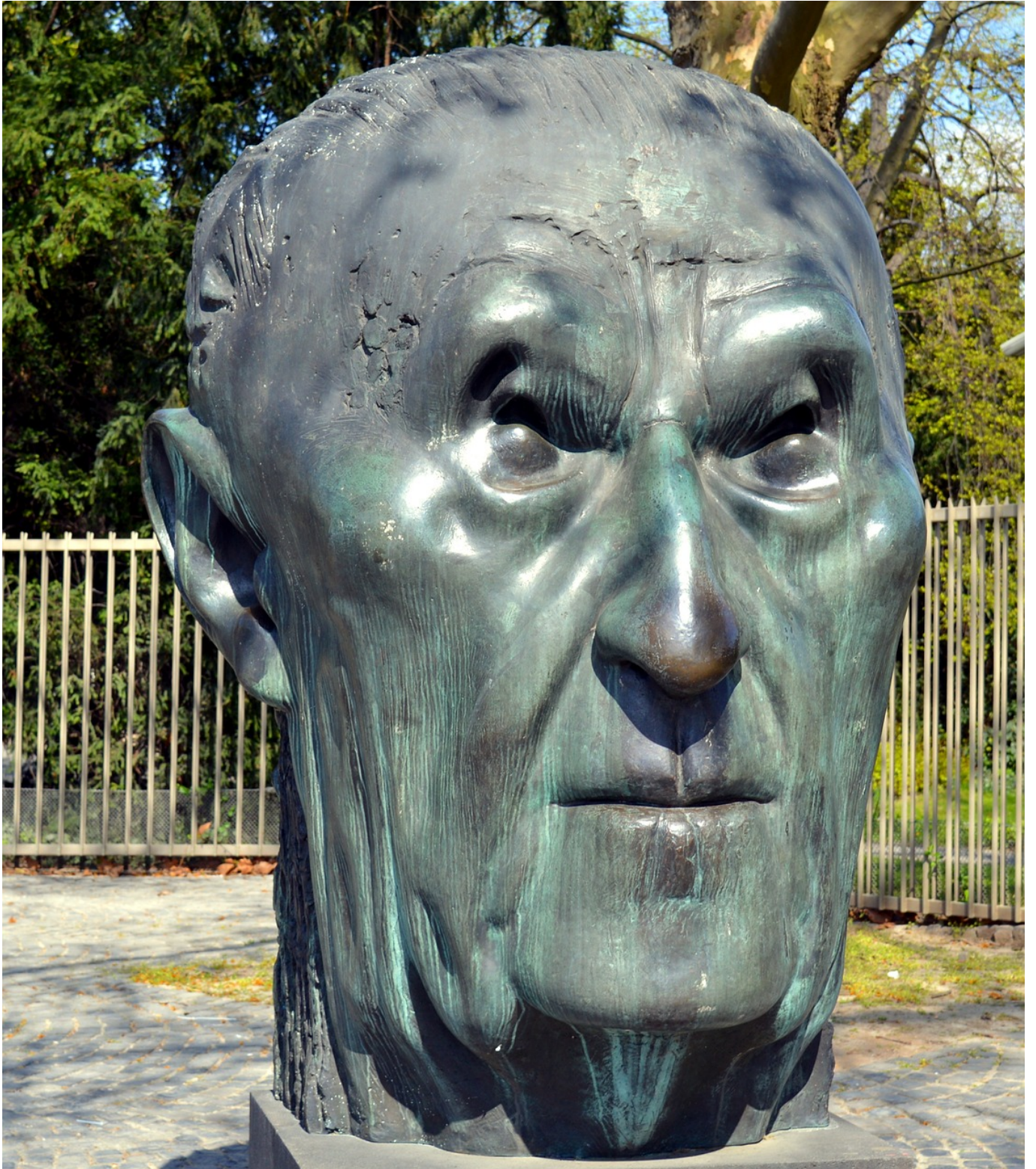

## Politician as a Noun

### Definitions of "Politician" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “politician” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A person who is professionally involved in politics, especially as a holder of an elected office.*
- *A schemer who tries to gain advantage in an organization in sly or underhanded ways.*
- *A person who acts in a manipulative and devious way, typically to gain advancement within an organization.*
- *A leader engaged in civil administration.*
- *A person active in party politics.*



## Synonyms of "Politician" as a noun (12 Words)

<b>lawmaker</b>	A legislator. <i>The game s official <b>lawmakers</b> are preparing the new legislation.</i>
<b>legislator</b>	A person who makes laws; a member of a legislative body. <i>Statutes went unread by the <b>legislators</b> who passed them.</i>
<b>member of parliament</b>	An external body part that projects from the body.
<b>minister</b>	A person or thing used to achieve or convey something. <i>A <b>minister</b> of the Lutheran church.</i>
<b>mp</b>	A member of the military police who polices soldiers and guards prisoners.
<b>office-bearer</b>	The person who holds an office.
<b>pol</b>	A person active in party politics. <i>He was the kind of <b>pol</b> you could understand.</i>
<b>politico</b>	A politician or person with strong political views. <i>An opponent of trendy left <b>politicos</b>.</i>
<b>public servant</b>	A body of people sharing some common interest.
<b>representative</b>	A delegate who attends a conference, negotiations, etc., so as to represent the interests of another person or group. <i>A sales <b>representative</b> for Norwich Union.</i>
<b>statesman</b>	A skilled, experienced, and respected political leader or figure. <i>Guests included members of the European royal families, diplomats, and statesmen.</i>
<b>stateswoman</b>	A skilled, experienced, and respected female political leader or figure. <i>A senior <b>stateswoman</b>.</i>

## Associations of "Politician" (30 Words)

### **anarchist**

A person who advocates or promotes anarchism or anarchy.  
*An **anarchist** newspaper.*

### **businessman**

A man who works in commerce, especially at executive level.

### **capitalist**

Of or relating to capitalism or capitalists.  
***Capitalistic** methods and incentives.*

### **chauvinist**

A person displaying aggressive or exaggerated patriotism.  
*I asked him what he thought about women s capabilities knowing his **chauvinist** tendencies.*

<b>communist</b>	A member of the communist party. <i>I was very left wing but I was never a <b>communist</b>.</i>
<b>consul</b>	(in ancient Rome) each of the two annually elected chief magistrates who jointly ruled the republic. <i>The British <b>consul</b> in Israel.</i>
<b>coup</b>	(among some North American Indian peoples) an act of touching an armed enemy in battle as a deed of bravery, or an act of first touching an item of the enemy's in order to claim it. <i>It was a major <b>coup</b> to get such a prestigious contract.</i>
<b>demagogue</b>	Rhetorically exploit (an issue) for political purposes in a way calculated to appeal to the desires and prejudices of ordinary people. <i>The Athenian <b>demagogues</b> had definite and valuable functions within the state.</i>
<b>democratic</b>	(in the US) relating to the Democratic Party. <i>A <b>democratic</b> scorn for bloated dukes and lords.</i>
<b>devoted</b>	Zealous in devotion or affection. <i><b>Devoted</b> friends.</i>
<b>diplomat</b>	A person who can deal with others in a sensitive and tactful way.
<b>diplomatic</b>	Using or marked by tact in dealing with sensitive matters or people. <i>A <b>diplomatic</b> transcription.</i>
<b>diplomatist</b>	An official engaged in international negotiations.
<b>entrepreneur</b>	Someone who organizes a business venture and assumes the risk for it. <i>Many <b>entrepreneurs</b> see potential in this market.</i>
<b>freemason</b>	A member of a widespread secret fraternal order pledged to mutual assistance and brotherly love.
<b>industrialist</b>	Someone who manages or has significant financial interest in an industrial enterprise. <i>The exploitation of child labour by nineteenth century <b>industrialists</b>.</i>
<b>jingo</b>	A vociferous supporter of policy favouring war, especially in the name of patriotism. <i>The feverish excitement of the <b>jingo</b> crowds.</i>
<b>libertarian</b>	An advocate of libertarianism. <i>He holds <b>libertarian</b> views on most social issues.</i>
<b>mason</b>	A Freemason. <i>The chief <b>mason</b> at Westminster Abbey.</i>
<b>nation</b>	The people who live in a nation or country. <i>The Shawnee <b>nation</b>.</i>

<b>nationalist</b>	Relating to nationalists or nationalism. <i>Minor <b>nationalistic</b> differences.</i>
<b>nihilist</b>	Someone who rejects all theories of morality or religious belief. <i>It is impossible to argue against a <b>nihilist</b>.</i>
<b>official</b>	Of a church given official status as a national or state institution. <i>A union <b>official</b>.</i>
<b>patriot</b>	A person who vigorously supports their country and is prepared to defend it against enemies or detractors. <i>A true <b>patriot</b>.</i>
<b>patriotic</b>	Having or expressing devotion to and vigorous support for one's country. <i>Today's game will be played before a fiercely <b>patriotic</b> crowd.</i>
<b>revolutionary</b>	Relating to a particular revolution, especially the War of American Independence. <i>The <b>revolutionary</b> army.</i>
<b>socialist</b>	Advocating or following the socialist principles. <i><b>Socialistic</b> government.</i>
<b>statesman</b>	A skilled, experienced, and respected political leader or figure. <i>Guests included members of the European royal families, diplomats, and statesmen.</i>
<b>subversive</b>	A subversive person. <i><b>Subversive</b> literature.</i>
<b>successful</b>	Having succeeded or being marked by a favorable outcome. <i>A <b>successful</b> actor.</i>
