- *The combined stakes of the betters.*
- *Any of various games played on a pool table having 6 pockets.*
- *A small body of standing water (rainwater) or other liquid.*
- *A shallow patch of liquid lying on a surface.*
- *A small lake.*
- *Any communal combination of funds.*
- *An excavation that is (usually) filled with water.*
- *A small area of still water, typically one formed naturally.*
- *A swimming pool.*
- *Something resembling a pool of liquid.*
- *A deep place in a river.*



## Synonyms of "Pool" as a noun (11 Words)

<b>baths</b>	A relatively large open container that you fill with water and use to wash the body.
<b><u>consortium</u></b>	The right of association and companionship with one's husband or wife. <i>The amount awarded for loss of <b>consortium</b> must be included.</i>
<b>kitty</b>	A fund of money for communal use, made up of contributions from a group of people.
<b>lido</b>	A public open-air swimming pool or bathing beach.
<b>piscina</b>	A stone basin near the altar in Catholic and pre-Reformation churches for draining water used in the Mass.
<b>plunge pool</b>	A steep and rapid fall.
<b>pocket billiards</b>	The space between the headpin and the pins behind it on the right or left.
<b>pond</b>	A small body of still water formed naturally or by artificial means. <i>A garden <b>pond</b>.</i>



**puddle**

Something resembling a pool of liquid.  
*A little **puddle** of light.*

**swimming pool** The act of swimming.

**syndicate**

An association of companies for some definite purpose.  
*Large scale buyouts involving a **syndicate** of financial institutions.*

## Associations of "Pool" (30 Words)

<b>amphibian</b>	Relating to amphibians. <i><b>Amphibian</b> eggs.</i>
<b>aquatic</b>	An aquatic plant or animal especially one suitable for a pond or aquarium. <i>Water lilies are <b>aquatic</b> plants.</i>
<u><b>backwater</b></u>	A place or condition in which no development or progress is occurring. <i>The country is an economic <b>backwater</b>.</i>
<b>bathing</b>	The act of washing yourself (or another person).
<u><b>cavern</b></u>	Hollow out as if making a cavern. <i>A dark <b>cavern</b> of a shop.</i>
<u><b>dive</b></u>	A sudden movement in a specified direction. <i>She walked to the deep end then she <b>dived</b> in.</i>

<b>divers</b>	Many and different. <i>A person of <b>diverse</b> talents.</i>
<b>fish</b>	Catch or try to catch fish typically by using a net or hook and line. <i>Many of the lochs we used to <b>fish</b> are now affected by forestry.</i>
<b>frog</b>	Hunt frogs for food.
<b>gully</b>	A fielder at gully. <i>He was caught in the <b>gully</b> by Jones.</i>
<b>lagoon</b>	A body of water cut off from a larger body by a reef of sand or coral.
<b>marine</b>	Relating to or found in the sea. <i><b>Marine</b> plants and animals such as seaweed and whales.</i>
<b>pond</b>	Hold back or dam up flowing water or another liquid to form a pond. <i>The lava can't flow away and gets <b>ponded</b> up in the crater.</i>
<b>puddle</b>	Knead clay and sand into puddle. <i><b>Puddled</b> mire.</i>
<b>reef</b>	Reduce a sail by taking in a reef. <i><b>Reef</b> the sailboat's mast.</i>
<b>scuba</b>	A device trade name Aqua Lung that lets divers breathe under water scuba is an acronym for self contained underwater breathing apparatus. <i>I want to do some <b>scuba</b>.</i>
<b>sea</b>	A roughly definable area of the sea. <i>Rocky bays lapped by vivid blue <b>sea</b>.</i>
<b>seabed</b>	The ground under the sea; the ocean floor.
<b>soggy</b>	Slow and apathetic. <i>The chorus sing powerfully but the interpretation is ultimately <b>soggy</b>.</i>
<b>springboard</b>	A platform fixed to the side of a tree and used by a lumberjack when working at some height from the ground. <i>An economic plan that may be the <b>springboard</b> for recovery.</i>
<b>stagnant</b>	Not growing or changing; without force or vitality. <i>A <b>stagnant</b> ditch.</i>
<b>swampy</b>	(of soil) soft and watery. <i><b>Swampy</b> bayous.</i>
<b>swim</b>	The act of swimming. <i>We went for a <b>swim</b> in the river.</i>
<b>swimmer</b>	A sperm cell. <i>The fastest freestyle <b>swimmer</b> in the world.</i>
<b>swimming</b>	The act of swimming. <i><b>Swimming</b> eyes.</i>



<b>swimsuit</b>	A woman's one-piece swimming costume.
<b>tadpole</b>	The tailed aquatic larva of an amphibian (frog, toad, newt, or salamander), breathing through gills and lacking legs until the later stages of its development.
<b>tarn</b>	A mountain lake (especially one formed by glaciers). <i>Malham <b>Tarn</b>.</i>
<b>terrapin</b>	A freshwater turtle, especially one of the smaller kinds of the Old World.
<b>toad</b>	A contemptible or detestable person (used as a general term of abuse). <i>You re an arrogant little <b>toad</b>.</i>
