bide	Remain or stay somewhere. <i>How long must I bide here to wait for the answer.</i>
burgher	(in southern Africa) an Afrikaans citizen of a Boer Republic. <i>The poem is not the sort of thing the sturdy burghers of Manchester would wish to read.</i>
census	Conduct a census. <i>They censused the deer in the forest.</i>
citizen	A native or naturalized member of a state or other political community. <i>The good citizens of Edinburgh.</i>
colonial	A house built in colonial style. <i>A rebellion by Dutch speaking colonials.</i>
county	Relating to or characteristic of aristocratic people with an ancestral home in a particular county. <i>The county plans to build a new road.</i>
denizen	A plant or animal naturalized in a region. <i>Denizens of field and forest.</i>
domicile	Law the residence where you have your permanent home or principal establishment and to where whenever you are absent you intend to return every person is compelled to have one and only one domicile at a time. <i>His wife has a domicile of origin in Germany.</i>
dwell	A slight regular pause in the motion of a machine. <i>Groups of people still dwell in these caves.</i>
dweller	A person who inhabits a particular place. <i>City dwellers.</i>
dwelling	A house, flat, or other place of residence. <i>He built a modest dwelling near the pond.</i>

french	The people of France.
habitant	An inhabitant. <i>The habitant farmhouses of old Quebec.</i>
habitat	The natural home or environment of an animal, plant, or other organism. <i>Wild chimps in their natural habitat.</i>
immigrant	A person who comes to a country where they were not born in order to settle there. <i>Immigrant workers.</i>
inhabit	Be an inhabitant of or reside in. <i>Strange notions inhabited her mind.</i>
inhabitant	A person who fulfils the residential or legal requirements for being a member of a state or parish.
life	A sentence of imprisonment for life. <i>He appointed himself emperor for life.</i>
lifelong	Lasting or remaining in a particular state throughout a person's life. <i>A lifelong Conservative.</i>
live	Be alive at a specified time. <i>The doctors said she had only six months to live.</i>
living	Of a place used for living rather than working in. <i>The Wollemi pine found in Australia is a surviving specimen of a conifer thought to have been long extinct and therefore known as a living fossil.</i>
native	Used in names of animals or plants resembling others familiar elsewhere e.g native bee. <i>A native of Montreal.</i>
occupy	Occupy the whole of. <i>The young prince will soon occupy the throne.</i>
population	A community of animals, plants, or humans among whose members interbreeding occurs. <i>Areas of sparse population.</i>
reside	Be inherent or innate in. <i>The paintings now reside on the walls of a restaurant.</i>
resident	Living in a particular place. <i>Resident farm workers.</i>
stay	A period of staying somewhere in particular of living somewhere temporarily as a visitor or guest. <i>Minton invited him to stay the night.</i>
