Definitions of "Population" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “population” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *Each of three groups (designated I, II, and III) into which stars can be approximately divided on the basis of their manner of formation.*
- *A finite or infinite collection of items under consideration.*
- *The entire aggregation of items from which samples can be drawn.*
- *A group of organisms of the same species inhabiting a given area.*
- *The act of populating (causing to live in a place).*
- *The number of inhabitants (either the total number or the number of a particular race or class) in a given place (country or city etc).*
- *A community of animals, plants, or humans among whose members interbreeding occurs.*
- *The people who inhabit a territory or state.*
- *The action of populating a place.*
- *A particular group or type of people living in a place.*
- *(statistics) the entire aggregation of items from which samples can be drawn.*
- *The extent to which an area is or has been populated.*

- *All the inhabitants of a particular place.*

residents	A physician (especially an intern) who lives in a hospital and cares for hospitalized patients under the supervision of the medical staff of the hospital. <i>The resident was receiving special clinical training at the hospital.</i>
society	A specified section of society. <i>She shunned the society of others.</i>
universe	All existing matter and space considered as a whole the cosmos The universe is believed to be at least 10 billion light years in diameter and contains a vast number of galaxies it has been expanding since its creation in the Big Bang about 13 billion years ago. <i>The front parlour was the hub of her universe.</i>

community	A group of nations having common interests. <i>They shared a community of possessions.</i>
denseness	The quality of being mentally slow and limited.
density	The quantity of mass per unit volume of a substance. <i>A reduction in bone density.</i>

deport	Hand over to the authorities of another country. <i>He was deported for violation of immigration laws.</i>
deportation	The action of deporting a foreigner from a country. <i>His deportation to a penal colony.</i>
exile	The act of expelling a person from their native land. <i>Men in exile dream of hope.</i>
expatriate	Move away from one's native country and adopt a new residence abroad. <i>Candidates should be willing to expatriate.</i>
extradite	Hand over to the authorities of another country. <i>Brazil refused to extradite him to Britain.</i>
frontier	An undeveloped field of study; a topic inviting research and development. <i>The individualism of the frontier in Andrew Jackson's day.</i>
ghetto	Any segregated mode of living or working that results from bias or stereotyping. <i>The Warsaw ghetto.</i>
hamlet	The hero of William Shakespeare's tragedy who hoped to avenge the murder of his father.
intern	Serve as an intern. <i>The young doctor is interning at the Medical Center this year.</i>
metropolitan	Relating to or denoting a metropolitan or his see. <i>A metropolitan bishop.</i>
municipal	Of or relating to the government of a municipality J L kuntz. <i>National and municipal elections.</i>
municipality	The governing body of a municipality. <i>Voters in each municipality choose between four candidates.</i>
neighborhood	An area within a city or town that has some distinctive features (especially one forming a community). <i>He always blames someone else in the immediate neighborhood.</i>
outskirts	Outlying areas (as of a city or town). <i>He built a new factory on the outskirts of Birmingham.</i>
populous	Having a large population; densely populated. <i>The populous city of Shanghai.</i>
resident	Living in a particular place. <i>An intangible computer program resident on a magnetic disk.</i>

- slum** Spend time at a lower socio-economic level than one's own, motivated by curiosity or desire for adventure; usage considered condescending and insensitive.
*The area was fast becoming a **slum** for the destitute.*
- suburban** Of or characteristic of a suburb.
*Elizabeth despised Ann's house proudness as deeply **suburban**.*
- town** The chief city or town of a region.
*Rachel left to drive back into **town**.*
- underpopulated** Having an insufficient or very small population.
*The rocky and **underpopulated** west coast.*
- village** A self-contained district or community within a town or city regarded as having features characteristic of village life.
*The **village** hall.*
- villager** One who has lived in a village most of their life.
*Jose married a fellow **villager**.*
- westerner** An inhabitant of a western area; especially of the U.S.
