### Definitions of "Population" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “population” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *Each of three groups (designated I, II, and III) into which stars can be approximately divided on the basis of their manner of formation.*
- *A finite or infinite collection of items under consideration.*
- *The entire aggregation of items from which samples can be drawn.*
- *A group of organisms of the same species inhabiting a given area.*
- *The act of populating (causing to live in a place).*
- *The number of inhabitants (either the total number or the number of a particular race or class) in a given place (country or city etc).*
- *A community of animals, plants, or humans among whose members interbreeding occurs.*
- *The people who inhabit a territory or state.*
- *The action of populating a place.*
- *A particular group or type of people living in a place.*
- *(statistics) the entire aggregation of items from which samples can be drawn.*
- *The extent to which an area is or has been populated.*

- *All the inhabitants of a particular place.*

<b>populace</b>	People in general considered as a whole. <i>The party misjudged the mood of the <b>populace</b>.</i>
<b>public</b>	The people who watch or are interested in an artist, writer, or performer. <i>The general <b>public</b> have a right to know.</i>
<b>residents</b>	A physician (especially an intern) who lives in a hospital and cares for hospitalized patients under the supervision of the medical staff of the hospital. <i>The resident was receiving special clinical training at the hospital.</i>
<b>society</b>	A specified section of society. <i>She shunned the <b>society</b> of others.</i>
<b>universe</b>	All existing matter and space considered as a whole the cosmos The universe is believed to be at least 10 billion light years in diameter and contains a vast number of galaxies it has been expanding since its creation in the Big Bang about 13 billion years ago. <i>The front parlour was the hub of her <b>universe</b>.</i>

<b>city</b>	A town created a city by charter and usually containing a cathedral. <i>The <b>city</b> voted for Republicans in 1994.</i>
<b>community</b>	A group of nations having common interests. <i>They shared a <b>community</b> of possessions.</i>
<b>denseness</b>	The quality of being mentally slow and limited.
<b>density</b>	The quantity of mass per unit volume of a substance. <i>A reduction in bone <b>density</b>.</i>

<b>deport</b>	Hand over to the authorities of another country. <i>He was <b>deported</b> for violation of immigration laws.</i>
<b>deportation</b>	The action of deporting a foreigner from a country. <i>His <b>deportation</b> to a penal colony.</i>
<b>exile</b>	The act of expelling a person from their native land. <i>Men in <b>exile</b> dream of hope.</i>
<b>expatriate</b>	Move away from one's native country and adopt a new residence abroad. <i>Candidates should be willing to <b>expatriate</b>.</i>
<b>extradite</b>	Hand over to the authorities of another country. <i>Brazil refused to <b>extradite</b> him to Britain.</i>
<b>frontier</b>	An undeveloped field of study; a topic inviting research and development. <i>The individualism of the <b>frontier</b> in Andrew Jackson's day.</i>
<b>ghetto</b>	Any segregated mode of living or working that results from bias or stereotyping. <i>The Warsaw <b>ghetto</b>.</i>
<b>hamlet</b>	The hero of William Shakespeare's tragedy who hoped to avenge the murder of his father.
<b>intern</b>	Serve as an intern. <i>The young doctor is <b>interning</b> at the Medical Center this year.</i>
<b>metropolitan</b>	Relating to or denoting a metropolitan or his see. <i>A <b>metropolitan</b> bishop.</i>
<b>municipal</b>	Of or relating to the government of a municipality J L kuntz. <i>National and <b>municipal</b> elections.</i>
<b>municipality</b>	The governing body of a municipality. <i>Voters in each <b>municipality</b> choose between four candidates.</i>
<b>neighborhood</b>	An area within a city or town that has some distinctive features (especially one forming a community). <i>He always blames someone else in the immediate <b>neighborhood</b>.</i>
<b>outskirts</b>	Outlying areas (as of a city or town). <i>He built a new factory on the <b>outskirts</b> of Birmingham.</i>
<b>populous</b>	Having a large population; densely populated. <i>The <b>populous</b> city of Shanghai.</i>
<b>resident</b>	Living in a particular place. <i>An intangible computer program <b>resident</b> on a magnetic disk.</i>



<b><u>slum</u></b>	Spend time at a lower socio-economic level than one's own, motivated by curiosity or desire for adventure; usage considered condescending and insensitive. <i>The area was fast becoming a <b>slum</b> for the destitute.</i>
<b>suburban</b>	Of or characteristic of a suburb. <i>Elizabeth despised Ann s house proudness as deeply <b>suburban</b>.</i>
<b><u>town</u></b>	The chief city or town of a region. <i>Rachel left to drive back into <b>town</b>.</i>
<b>underpopulated</b>	Having an insufficient or very small population. <i>The rocky and <b>underpopulated</b> west coast.</i>
<b><u>village</u></b>	A self contained district or community within a town or city regarded as having features characteristic of village life. <i>The <b>village</b> hall.</i>
<b>villager</b>	One who has lived in a village most of their life. <i>Jose married a fellow <b>villager</b>.</i>
<b>westerner</b>	An inhabitant of a western area; especially of the U.S.
