Definitions of "Porch" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “porch” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A covered shelter projecting in front of the entrance of a building.*
- *A structure attached to the exterior of a building often forming a covered entrance.*
- *A veranda.*



Synonyms of "Porch" as a noun (9 Words)

- anteroom** A large room in an officers' mess, typically adjacent to the dining room.
- entrance** The act of entering.
An **entrance** hall.
- entrance hall** The act of entering.
- entry** An item written or printed in a diary, list, account book, or reference book.
*The diamonds are still not established so South must gamble on finding an extra **entry** to the dummy.*
- foyer** An entrance hall or other open area in a building used by the public, especially a hotel or theatre.
*The **foyer** of the concert hall.*
- lobby** In the UK lobby correspondents collectively.
*Members of the anti abortion **lobby**.*
- portal** A site that the owner positions as an entrance to other sites on the internet.
*The **portals** of success.*

portico A porch or entrance to a building consisting of a covered and often columned area.

vestibule A large entrance or reception room or area.



Usage Examples of "Porch" as a noun

- *The north porch of Hereford Cathedral.*
- *Daniel and Lydia sat out on the porch for many hours.*



Associations of "Porch" (30 Words)

- aisle** (in a church) a lower part parallel to the nave, choir, or transept, from which it is divided by pillars.
*The musical had the audience dancing in the **aisles**.*
- antechamber** A small room leading to a main one.
*The **antechamber** to an interview room.*
- anteroom** A large entrance or reception room or area.
- brink** A region marking a boundary.
*On the **brink** of bankruptcy.*
- bungalow** (in SE Asia) a large detached house with more than one storey.
- ceiling** The maximum altitude that a particular aircraft can reach.
*The aircraft's quoted **ceiling** of 24 000 feet.*
- cottage** Perform homosexual acts in a public toilet.
*Farm **cottages**.*

<u>door</u>	The entrance the space in a wall through which you enter or leave a room or building the space that a door can close. <i>He knocked on the door.</i>
doorstep	(of a journalist) wait uninvited outside the home of (someone) in order to obtain an interview or photograph. <i>He put his foot on the doorstep of the cottage.</i>
<u>doorway</u>	The entrance (the space in a wall) through which you enter or leave a room or building; the space that a door can close. <i>The doorway to success.</i>
<u>exit</u>	A departure of an actor from the stage. <i>She slipped out by the rear exit.</i>
<u>facade</u>	The principal front of a building, that faces on to a street or open space. <i>The house has a half timbered facade.</i>
foyer	A large entrance or reception room or area. <i>The foyer of the concert hall.</i>
<u>hall</u>	A large building used by a college or university for teaching or research. <i>Lecture hall.</i>
hallway	An interior passage or corridor onto which rooms open.
house	The management of a gambling house or casino. <i>Help yourself to a drink compliments of the house.</i>
jamb	A side post or surface of a doorway, window, or fireplace. <i>He leaned against the door jamb.</i>
latticed	Decorated with or in the form of a lattice. <i>A latticed screen.</i>
lintel	Horizontal beam used as a finishing piece over a door or window.
<u>lobby</u>	In the UK lobby correspondents collectively. <i>They went into the hotel lobby.</i>
nave	The central area of a church.
rafter	Provide a ceiling with rafters. <i>A vaulted hall with exposed rafters.</i>
<u>roof</u>	Function as the roof of. <i>A range of childcare facilities all under one roof.</i>
skylight	A window in a roof to admit daylight.
terrace	Provide a house with a terrace. <i>The Incas terraced their mountainous land.</i>

- threshold** The beginning of an airport runway on which an aircraft is attempting to land.
*Their water would meet the safety **threshold** of 50 milligrams of nitrates per litre.*
- treetop** The uppermost part of a tree.
- vaulted** Having a hemispherical vault or dome.
*A **vaulted** arcade.*
- verge** A region marking a boundary.
*I was on the **verge** of tears.*
- window** A pane of glass filling a window.
*The ball shattered the **window**.*
