Definitions of "Portfolio" as a noun

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "portfolio" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- The role of the head of a government department.
- A range of investments held by a person or organization.
- A list of the financial assets held by an individual or a bank or other financial institution.
- A varied set of photographs of a model or actor intended to be shown to a potential employer.
- A large, flat, thin case for carrying loose papers or drawings or maps; usually leather.
- The position and duties of a Minister or Secretary of State.
- Denoting or engaged in an employment pattern which involves a succession of shortterm contracts and part-time work, rather than the more traditional model of a single job for life.
- A large, thin, flat case for loose sheets of paper such as drawings or maps.
- A set of pieces of creative work collected to be shown to potential customers or employers.
- A range of products or services offered by an organization.
- A set of pieces of creative work intended to demonstrate a person's ability to a



potential employer.

ring binder	A platform usually marked off by ropes in which contestants box or wrestle.
securities	Defense against financial failure; financial independence. <i>His pension gave him security in his old age.</i>
shares	The effort contributed by a person in bringing about a result. <i>He bought 100 shares of IBM at the market price.</i>

<u>file</u>	Smooth with a file. MI5 were keeping a file on him.
importer	Someone whose business involves importing goods from outside (especially from a foreign country. <i>The EU is the largest</i> importer <i>of agricultural products from developing</i> <i>countries.</i>
infomercial	A television commercial presented in the form of a short documentary.
investment	The act of putting on robes or vestments. A total investment of 50 000.
item	Used to introduce each item in a list. An item of clothing.
management	The people managing a company or organization, regarded collectively. <i>He alleges that staff have been victims of</i> management <i>bullying</i> .
manufacturer	Someone who manufactures something. The manufacturer s supply the goods to the distribution centre.
marketable	Being in demand by especially employers. <i>Marketable</i> skills.
marketing	Shopping at a market. Does the weekly marketing at the supermarket.



merchandise	Commodities offered for sale. Shops which offered an astonishing range of merchandise .
owned	Having an owner; often used in combination. State owned railways.
product	A chemical substance formed as a result of a chemical reaction. <i>Her perpetual suntan was the product of a solarium.</i>
<u>proprietary</u>	Behaving as if one owned something or someone. Tylenol is a proprietary drug of which acetaminophen is the generic form.
sale	The exchange of a commodity for money; the action of selling something. They had to complete the sale before the banks closed.
salesclerk	A salesperson in a store.
salesperson	A person employed to represent a business and to sell its merchandise (as to customers in a store or to customers who are visited.
<u>sponsorship</u>	Financial support received from a sponsor. <i>We raised about 6 000 in sponsorship.</i>
<u>trade</u>	Be traded at a certain price or under certain conditions. They trade mud shark livers for fish oil.
trading	Buying or selling securities or commodities. <i>Trading</i> profits leapt.
warranty	A written guarantee, issued to the purchaser of an article by its manufacturer, promising to repair or replace it if necessary within a specified period of time. <i>As your machine is under warranty I suggest getting it checked.</i>
