<u>destiny</u>	The hidden power believed to control future events; fate. <i>She was unable to control her own destiny.</i>
division	Biology a group of organisms forming a subdivision of a larger category. <i>No multiplication or division is necessary.</i>
dower	Money or property brought by a woman to her husband at marriage. <i>A dower house.</i>
dowery	Money or property brought by a woman to her husband at marriage.
dowry	Money or property brought by a woman to her husband at marriage. <i>Elizabeth s dowry was to be 45 000 in diamonds.</i>
<u>fate</u>	Three goddesses who presided over the birth and life of humans. Each person's destiny was thought of as a thread spun, measured, and cut by the three Fates, Clotho, Lachesis, and Atropos. <i>He stared at the faces of the committee trying to guess his fate.</i>
<u>fortune</u>	Luck, especially good luck. <i>Whatever my fortune may be.</i>
<u>fraction</u>	A component of a mixture that has been separated by a fractional process. <i>He hesitated for a fraction of a second.</i>
fragment	An incomplete piece. <i>Small fragments of pottery.</i>

helping	A portion of food served to one person at one time. <i>There will be enough for six helpings.</i>
kismet	The will of Allah. <i>What chance did I stand against kismet.</i>
lot	A plot of land assigned for sale or for a particular use. <i>They drew lots for it.</i>
luck	An unknown and unpredictable phenomenon that leads to a favorable outcome. <i>They say luck is a lady.</i>
measure	Measuring instrument having a sequence of marks at regular intervals used as a reference in making measurements. <i>Cost cutting measures.</i>
parcel	An extended area of land. <i>A parcel of rogues.</i>
part	The appropriate or expected behaviour in a particular role or situation one's duty. <i>Those of you who jet off to foreign parts for your holidays.</i>
percentage	Any proportion or share in relation to a whole. <i>I hope to be on a percentage.</i>
piece	An instance or example. <i>A haunting piece of music.</i>
quantity	The figure or symbol representing a quantity. <i>The quantity and quality of the fruit can be controlled.</i>
quota	A prescribed number. <i>The country may be exceeding its OPEC quota of 1 100 000 barrels of oil per day.</i>
ration	An amount of food supplied on a regular basis, especially to members of the armed forces during a war. <i>Refugees queued for their meagre rations.</i>
section	(geometry) the area created by a plane cutting through a solid. <i>A residential section of the capital.</i>
segment	The part of a line included between two points. <i>Finished the final segment of the road.</i>
serving	The act of delivering a writ or summons upon someone. <i>There's enough for two servings each.</i>

share	Assets belonging to or due to or contributed by an individual person or group. <i>There have been 25 000 shares on Twitter and 117 likes on Facebook as of 7 30 p m.</i>
slice	A thin flat piece cut off of some object. <i>A slice of bread.</i>
subdivision	An area of land divided into plots for sale. <i>The Birkenhead police subdivision.</i>

hand out	Place into the hands or custody of.
measure out	Express as a number or measure or quantity.
parcel out	Make into a wrapped container.
share out	Have, give, or receive a share of.

fragmentary	Consisting of small disconnected parts. <i>Excavations have revealed fragmentary remains of masonry.</i>
fragmentation	The condition of a file that is broken up and stored in many different locations on a magnetic disk. <i>Fragmentation slows system performance because it takes extra time to locate and assemble the parts of the fragmented file.</i>

moiety	A part or portion, especially a lesser share. <i>The enzyme removes the sulphate moiety.</i>
mote	A tiny piece of a substance; a speck. <i>The tiniest mote of dust.</i>
<u>overlap</u>	A part or amount which overlaps. <i>The roofs of the houses overlap in this crowded city.</i>
part	A melody or other constituent of harmony assigned to a particular voice or instrument in a musical work. <i>My dog swallowed a Lego part.</i>

scrap	Make into scrap or refuse. <i>Scraps of information.</i>
section	Divide into sections. <i>I unscrewed every section of copper pipe from the roof tank to the hot water cylinder.</i>
sector	The minimum track length that can be assigned to store information unless otherwise specified a sector of data consists of 512 bytes. <i>The government aimed to reassure the industrial and commercial sector.</i>
segment	Divide into segments. <i>The market for private cars can be broken down into several segments.</i>
segmentation	(embryology) the repeated division of a fertilised ovum. <i>The segmentation of society means that often we don't have arguments across the political divide.</i>
share	Have give or receive a share of. <i>All members of the band equally share the band's profits.</i>
slat	Close the slats of windows. <i>Sunlight filtered dustily through the slats of the door.</i>
some	To some extent quite a lot. <i>Some forty people came.</i>
splinter	Divide into slivers or splinters. <i>The soap box splintered.</i>
