**brighten up** Make lighter or brighter.

**decorate** Confer an award or medal on (a member of the armed forces).  
*He was **decorated** for outstanding bravery.*

**enhance** Increase.  
*This sauce will **enhance** the flavor of the meat.*

**improve** To make better.  
*The weather **improved** toward evening.*

**make over** Achieve a point or goal.

**modernize** Become technologically advanced.  
*He **modernized** the health service.*

**prettify** Make more beautiful.  
*Nothing has been done to **prettify** the site.*

- redecorate** Apply paint or wallpaper in (a room or building) again, typically differently.  
*You will have to **redecorate** the room afterwards.*
- refit** Replace or repair machinery, equipment, and fittings in (a ship, building, etc.).  
*A lucrative contract to **refit** a submarine fleet.*
- refurbish** Make brighter and prettier.  
*We **refurbished** the guest wing.*
- renovate** Give new life or energy to.  
*They **renovated** the ceiling of the Sistine Chapel.*
- restore** Restore by replacing a part or putting together what is torn or broken.  
*The week at the spa **restored** me.*
- revamp** Provide (a shoe) with a new vamp.  
*They **revamped** their old house before selling it.*
- smarten up** Raise.
- spruce up** Dress and groom with particular care, as for a special occasion.

<b>elegant</b>	Refined and tasteful in appearance or behavior or style. <i>Small churches with <b>elegant</b> white spires.</i>
<b>exclusive</b>	(of an item or story) not published or broadcast elsewhere. <i>An <b>exclusive</b> restaurants and shops.</i>
<b>fancy</b>	(of a flower) of two or more colours. <i>A <b>fancy</b> computerized system.</i>
<b>fashionable</b>	Popular and considered appealing or fashionable at the time. <i>The <b>fashionable</b> side of town.</i>
<b>grand</b>	Of the highest rank (used especially in official titles). <i><b>Grand</b> ballroom.</i>
<b>high-class</b>	Pretentiously elegant.
<b>home counties</b>	Used of your own ground.
<b>lavish</b>	Spent or given in profusion. <i>A <b>lavish</b> banquet.</i>
<b>luxurious</b>	Giving self-indulgent or sensual pleasure. <i>The island s most <b>luxurious</b> hotel.</i>
<b>luxury</b>	Luxurious or of the nature of a luxury. <i><b>Luxury</b> goods.</i>
<b>opulent</b>	Wealthy. <i>The <b>opulent</b> comfort of a limousine.</i>
<b>ornate</b>	Elaborately or highly decorated. <i>An <b>ornate</b> wrought iron railing.</i>
<b>ostentatious</b>	(of a display) tawdry or vulgar. <i>An <b>ostentatious</b> sable coat.</i>
<b>rich</b>	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. <i>A <b>rich</b> ruby port.</i>
<b>select</b>	Selected or chosen for special qualifications. <i>The opera was seen by a small and highly <b>select</b> audience.</i>
<b>showy</b>	Marked by ostentation but often tasteless. <i><b>Showy</b> flowers.</i>



<b>smart</b>	Showing impertinence by making clever or sarcastic remarks. <i>A <b>smart</b> green van.</i>
<b>stylish</b>	Being or in accordance with current social fashions. <i>The <b>stylish</b> resort of Gstaad.</i>
<b>sumptuous</b>	Splendid and expensive-looking. <i>The banquet was a <b>sumptuous</b> luxurious meal.</i>
<b>swish</b>	Elegant and fashionable. <i>A <b>swish</b> pastry shop on the Rue du Bac.</i>
<b>upmarket</b>	Designed for consumers with high incomes. <i>He turned up in well cut clothes and <b>upmarket</b> felt hats.</i>
<b>upper-class</b>	Occupying the highest socioeconomic position in a society.
