#### Definitions of "Possible" as an adjective

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "possible" as an adjective can have the following definitions:



- That may exist or happen, but that is not certain or probable.
- Capable of happening or existing.
- Able to be done or achieved.
- Existing in possibility.
- Having as much or as little of a specified quality as can be achieved.
- Able to be or become; potential.
- (of a number or score) as high as is achievable in a test, competition, or game.



### Synonyms of "Possible" as an adjective (23 Words)

able to be done	Having inherent physical or mental ability or capacity.
<u>achievable</u>	Able to be brought about or reached successfully. <i>He broke the climb into small <b>achievable</b> stages.</i>
<u>aspiring</u>	Desiring or striving for recognition or advancement. An <b>aspiring</b> artist.



<u>attainable</u>	Capable of being attained or accomplished. <i>Choose an <b>attainable</b> goal.</i>
<u>believable</u>	Able to be believed; credible. She felt that Dawn s story was not quite <b>believable</b> .
<u>conceivable</u>	Capable of being imagined. A mass uprising was entirely <b>conceivable</b> .
<u>credible</u>	Capable of being believed. Few people found his story <b>credible</b> .
feasible	Likely; probable. The most <b>feasible</b> explanation.
imaginable	Capable of being imagined. The most spectacular views <b>imaginable</b> .
likely	Likely but not certain to be or become true or real. <i>She is <b>likely</b> to forget.</i>
<u>manageable</u>	Capable of being managed or controlled. Her long hair was black wavy and <b>manageable</b> .
odds-on	Having a better than even chance of success.
plausible	Apparently reasonable and credible, and therefore convincing. <i>A <b>plausible</b> liar.</i>
potential	Having or showing the capacity to develop into something in the future. A <i>potential</i> problem.
practicable	Capable of being done with means at hand and circumstances as they are. <i>A practicable</i> solution.
<u>probable</u>	Likely to happen or be the case. It is <b>probable</b> that the economic situation will deteriorate further.
prospective	Likely to happen at a future date. A <b>prospective</b> mother.
realizable	Capable of existing or taking place or proving true; possible to do. <i>The need to define <b>realizable</b> targets.</i>
tenable	Based on sound reasoning or evidence. A scholarship of 200 per annum <b>tenable</b> for three years.
thinkable	Capable of being conceived or imagined or considered. Something that was barely <b>thinkable</b> just 70 years ago.
viable	(of a plant, animal, or cell) capable of surviving or living successfully, especially under particular environmental conditions. <i>The proposed investment was economically viable</i> .



workable	Able to be worked, fashioned, or manipulated. A <b>workable</b> peace settlement.
would-be	Unfulfilled or frustrated in realizing an ambition.




#### Usage Examples of "Possible" as an adjective

actually	Used when expressing a contradictory or unexpected opinion or correcting someone. <i>He had a thick Cockney accent he sounded like my grandad <b>actually</b>.</i>
as	A United States territory on the eastern part of the island of Samoa. <i>Birds were singing and the child sang</i> <b>as</b> <i>sweetly.</i>
