| adolescence | The time period between the beginning of puberty and adulthood. <i>Mary spent her childhood and adolescence in Europe.</i> |
| adolescent | Relating to or peculiar to or suggestive of an adolescent. <i>Adolescent problems.</i> |
| boy | A friendly form of address from one man to another, especially from an older man to a young man. <i>The school provides education for both boys and girls.</i> |
| boyish | Of, like, or characteristic of a male child or young man. <i>She looked boyish and defiant.</i> |
| cub | Give birth to cubs. <i>His sons are as yet mere cubs.</i> |
| dad | An informal term for a father; probably derived from baby talk. <i>His dad was with him.</i> |
| daddy | The best or most successful person. <i>It s you who s calling the shots now you re the daddy.</i> |
| daughter | A thing personified as a daughter in relation to its origin or source. <i>We are the sons and daughters of Adam.</i> |
| foster | Bring up under fosterage of children. <i>Foster parent.</i> |
| girl | A girl or young woman with whom a man is romantically involved. <i>I haven t got the time to meet girls.</i> |
| grandchild | A child of one’s son or daughter. |
| juvenile | An actor playing a juvenile role. <i>The law relating to the sentencing of juveniles.</i> |
| kid | Leather made from a young goat’s skin. <i>Milk fever usually occurs in heavy milkers shortly after kidding.</i> |

| maidenhood | The fact or condition of being a young, unmarried woman. <i>Most brides wear white to symbolize maidenhood.</i> |
| mommy | One's mother (chiefly as a child's term). |
| mummy | Informal terms for a mother. <i>The mummy of Tutankhamen.</i> |
| offspring | Any immature animal. <i>She was the mother of many offspring.</i> |
| orphan | Make a child an orphan. <i>An orphan girl.</i> |
| parent | Be or act as a parent to a child. <i>His adoptive parents.</i> |
| plaything | A person treated as amusing but unimportant by someone else. <i>She was the mistress and plaything of a wealthy businessman.</i> |
| procreate | (of people or animals) produce young; reproduce. <i>Species that procreate by copulation.</i> |
| progeny | The immediate descendants of a person. <i>Shorthorn cattle are highly effective in bestowing their characteristics on their progeny.</i> |
| scion | A young shoot or twig of a plant, especially one cut for grafting or rooting. <i>A scion of royal stock.</i> |
| son | Used by an older person as a form of address for a boy or young man. <i>The sons of Adam.</i> |
| stripling | A juvenile between the onset of puberty and maturity. <i>He s a mere stripling.</i> |
| teen | Relating to teenagers. <i>A teen idol.</i> |
| young | Having the qualities associated with young people such as enthusiasm and optimism. <i>A young girl.</i> |
| youngster | A young person of either sex. <i>Tiddler is a British term for youngster.</i> |
| youth | An early stage in the development of something. <i>He was attacked by a gang of youths.</i> |
