## Associations of "Poster child" (30 Words)

<b>adolescence</b>	The time period between the beginning of puberty and adulthood. <i>Mary spent her childhood and <b>adolescence</b> in Europe.</i>
<b>adolescent</b>	Relating to or peculiar to or suggestive of an adolescent. <i><b>Adolescent</b> problems.</i>
<b>boy</b>	A friendly form of address from one man to another, especially from an older man to a young man. <i>The school provides education for both <b>boys</b> and girls.</i>
<b>boyish</b>	Of, like, or characteristic of a male child or young man. <i>She looked <b>boyish</b> and defiant.</i>
<b>cub</b>	Give birth to cubs. <i>His sons are as yet mere <b>cubs</b>.</i>
<b>dad</b>	An informal term for a father; probably derived from baby talk. <i>His <b>dad</b> was with him.</i>
<b>daddy</b>	The best or most successful person. <i>It s you who s calling the shots now you re the <b>daddy</b>.</i>
<b>daughter</b>	A thing personified as a daughter in relation to its origin or source. <i>We are the sons and <b>daughters</b> of Adam.</i>
<b>foster</b>	Bring up under fosterage of children. <i><b>Foster</b> parent.</i>
<b>girl</b>	A girl or young woman with whom a man is romantically involved. <i>I haven t got the time to meet <b>girls</b>.</i>
<b>grandchild</b>	A child of one’s son or daughter.
<b>juvenile</b>	An actor playing a juvenile role. <i>The law relating to the sentencing of <b>juveniles</b>.</i>
<b>kid</b>	Leather made from a young goat’s skin. <i>Milk fever usually occurs in heavy milkers shortly after <b>kidding</b>.</i>

<b>maidenhood</b>	The fact or condition of being a young, unmarried woman. <i>Most brides wear white to symbolize <b>maidenhood</b>.</i>
<b>mommy</b>	One's mother (chiefly as a child's term).
<b>mummy</b>	Informal terms for a mother. <i>The <b>mummy</b> of Tutankhamen.</i>
<b>offspring</b>	Any immature animal. <i>She was the mother of many <b>offspring</b>.</i>
<b>orphan</b>	Make a child an orphan. <i>An <b>orphan</b> girl.</i>
<b>parent</b>	Be or act as a parent to a child. <i>His adoptive <b>parents</b>.</i>
<b>plaything</b>	A person treated as amusing but unimportant by someone else. <i>She was the mistress and <b>plaything</b> of a wealthy businessman.</i>
<b>procreate</b>	(of people or animals) produce young; reproduce. <i>Species that <b>procreate</b> by copulation.</i>
<b>progeny</b>	The immediate descendants of a person. <i>Shorthorn cattle are highly effective in bestowing their characteristics on their <b>progeny</b>.</i>
<b>scion</b>	A young shoot or twig of a plant, especially one cut for grafting or rooting. <i>A <b>scion</b> of royal stock.</i>
<b>son</b>	Used by an older person as a form of address for a boy or young man. <i>The <b>sons</b> of Adam.</i>
<b>stripling</b>	A juvenile between the onset of puberty and maturity. <i>He s a mere <b>stripling</b>.</i>
<b>teen</b>	Relating to teenagers. <i>A <b>teen</b> idol.</i>
<b>young</b>	Having the qualities associated with young people such as enthusiasm and optimism. <i>A <b>young</b> girl.</i>
<b>youngster</b>	A young person of either sex. <i>Tiddler is a British term for <b>youngster</b>.</i>
<b>youth</b>	An early stage in the development of something. <i>He was attacked by a gang of <b>youths</b>.</i>
