adjourn	(of a group of people) go somewhere for rest or refreshment. Sentence was <b>adjourn</b> ed for a social inquiry report.
carry over	Continue or extend.
defer	(of a judge) postpone (a sentence) so that the circumstances or conduct of the defendant can be further assessed. <i>They defer</i> red the decision until February.
delay	Cause to be slowed down or delayed. Time being of the essence they <b>delay</b> ed no longer.
hold off	Drink alcohol without showing ill effects.
hold over	Bind by an obligation; cause to be indebted.
keep in abeyance	e Retain possession of.
mothball	Store clothes with mothballs. It would cost the company a lot of money just to <b>mothball</b> the mine.
pigeonhole	Put a document in a pigeonhole. I was <b>pigeonhole</b> d as a youth writer.
prorogue	Discontinue a session of (a parliament or other legislative assembly) without dissolving it. James <b>prorogue</b> d this Parliament never to call another one.
put back	Cause to be in a certain state; cause to be in a certain relation.
put off	Make an investment.
put over	Put into a certain place or abstract location.
<u>remit</u>	Consign again to a previous state. God s act of <b>remit</b> ting the sins of guilty men.
reschedule	Change the time of (a planned event. The concert has been <b>reschedule</b> d for September.
set back	Disappear beyond the horizon.
shelve	Fit with shelves. One whole long wall was <b>shelve</b> d.
stand over	Withstand the force of something.
stay	Stay the same remain in a certain state. There are some cases the Crown feels so serious they don t want to <b>stay</b> the charges.
suspend	Hang freely. <b>Suspend</b> payments on the loan.

ambiguously	So as to be open to doubt or uncertainty. The new clause is <b>ambiguously</b> worded.
cancellation	The act of cancelling; calling off some arrangement. All <b>cancellation</b> s on documents must be made indelibly.
continued	Without a break in continuity; ongoing. <i>To insure the <b>continued</b> success of the war.</i>
dangle	Cause to dangle or hang freely. The defence portfolio could be the carrot to <b>dangle</b> before him.
defer	(of a judge) postpone (a sentence) so that the circumstances or conduct of the defendant can be further assessed. <i>The judge <b>defer</b>red sentence until 5 April for background reports.</i>
delay	An electronic device which introduces a delay especially in an audio signal. <i>The train was <b>delay</b>ed</i> .
extended	Fully extended or stretched forth. His <b>extended</b> legs reached almost across the small room.
<u>fidget</u>	A person who fidgets. The child is always <b>fidget</b> ing in his seat.
hinder	Hinder or prevent the progress or accomplishment of. <i>Language barriers <b>hinder</b>ed communication between scientists.</i>
impede	Be a hindrance or obstacle to. The sap causes swelling which can <b>impede</b> breathing.
indefinitely	To an indefinite extent; for an indefinite time. An <b>indefinitely</b> large number of channels.



<u>infinite</u>	A space or quantity that is infinite. <i>Infinite</i> verb form.
jitter	Of a signal or device suffer from jitter. An anxious student who <b>jitter</b> ed at any provocation.
perfectible	Capable of becoming or being made perfect.
postdate	Establish something as being later relative to something else.
postponement	The action of postponing something; deferral. After repeated <b>postponement</b> s the new museum is officially open.
<u>procrastinate</u>	Postpone doing what one should be doing. <i>He did not want to write the letter and <b>procrastinate</b>d for days.</i>
procrastination	The action of delaying or postponing something. <i>Your first tip is to avoid <b>procrastination</b>.</i>
prolongation	The act of prolonging something. An agreement on further <b>prolongation</b> of the boundary proved difficult.
prorogue	Hold back to a later time. James <b>prorogue</b> d this Parliament never to call another one.
<u>remit</u>	Law the act of remitting especially the referral of a law case to another court. <i>The excess of the sentence over 12 months was <b>remit</b>ted.</i>
reschedule	Assign a new time and place for an event. The concert has been <b>reschedule</b> d for September.
shelve	Fit with shelves. One whole long wall was <b>shelve</b> d.
suspend	(of a judge or court) cause (an imposed sentence) not to be enforced as long as no further offence is committed within a specified period. <i>Work on the dam was</i> <b>suspend</b> ed.
tarry	Having the characteristics of pitch or tar. A length of <b>tarry</b> rope.
temporize	Draw out a discussion or process in order to gain time. The speaker <b>temporize</b> d in order to delay the vote.
unlimited	(of a problem) having an infinite number of solutions. To start with a theory of <b>unlimited</b> freedom is to end up with <b>unlimited</b> despotism.
vaguely	In a way that is unfocused or lacks attention; absent-mindedly. <i>He nodded vaguely</i> .
