### Definitions of "Potato" as a noun

- *Annual native to South America having underground stolons bearing edible starchy tubers; widely cultivated as a garden vegetable; vines are poisonous.*
- *The plant of the nightshade family which produces potatoes on underground runners.*
- *A large hole in a sock or stocking, especially one in the heel.*
- *An edible tuber native to South America; a staple food of Ireland.*
- *A starchy plant tuber which is one of the most important food crops, cooked and eaten as a vegetable.*



## Synonyms of "Potato" as a noun (7 Words)

<b>irish potato</b>	An edible tuber native to South America; a staple food of Ireland.
<b>murphy</b>	A potato.
<b>solanum tuberosum</b>	Annual native to South America having underground stolons bearing edible starchy tubers; widely cultivated as a garden vegetable; vines are poisonous.
<b>spud</b>	An edible tuber native to South America; a staple food of Ireland. A <i>spud washer</i> .
<b>tater</b>	An edible tuber native to South America; a staple food of Ireland. A dish of boiled <i>taters</i> .
<b>white potato</b>	A member of the Caucasoid race.
<b>white potato vine</b>	A member of the Caucasoid race.

## Associations of "Potato" (30 Words)

- agriculture** The science or practice of farming, including cultivation of the soil for the growing of crops and the rearing of animals to provide food, wool, and other products.
- apple** The tree bearing apples with hard pale timber that is used in carpentry and to smoke food.
- baked** (bread and pastries) cooked by dry heat (as in an oven).  
***Baked** apples.*
- barley** The grain of barley.
- bean** A leguminous plant that bears beans in pods.  
*I didn't know **beans** about being a step parent.*
- cabbage** Any of various types of cabbage.  
*I was becoming a 27 year old **cabbage**.*

<b>carrot</b>	A cultivated plant of the parsley family with feathery leaves which yields carrots. <i>Used the <b>carrot</b> of subsidized housing for the workers to get their vote.</i>
<b>chard</b>	Long succulent whitish stalks with large green leaves.
<b>corn</b>	Feed cattle with corn. <i><b>Corned</b> beef.</i>
<b>crop</b>	Prepare for crops. <i>The annual <b>crop</b> of students brings a new <b>crop</b> of ideas.</i>
<b>eggplant</b>	The purple egg-shaped fruit of a tropical Old World plant, which is eaten as a vegetable; an aubergine.
<b>farmhouse</b>	A house attached to a farm, especially the main house in which the farmer lives. <i>A <b>farmhouse</b> kitchen.</i>
<b>farming</b>	Relating to farming or agriculture. <i><b>Farming</b> communities.</i>
<b>fritter</b>	Divide (something) into small pieces. <i>They become <b>frittered</b> into minute tatters.</i>
<b>harvest</b>	Gather a crop as a harvest. <i>They gathered a <b>harvest</b> of examples.</i>
<b>husbandry</b>	Management and conservation of resources. <i>All aspects of animal <b>husbandry</b>.</i>
<b>legume</b>	The fruit or seed of any of various bean or pea plants consisting of a case that splits along both sides when ripe and having the seeds attach to one side of the case. <i>He sows a mixture of grasses and <b>legumes</b>.</i>
<b>maize</b>	Tall annual cereal grass bearing kernels on large ears: widely cultivated in America in many varieties; the principal cereal in Mexico and Central and South America since pre-Columbian times.
<b>munch</b>	Norwegian painter (1863-1944). <i>He tried to talk between <b>munches</b> on the sandwich.</i>
<b>murphy</b>	A potato.
<b>pea</b>	The fruit or seed of a pea plant. <i>Steak and ale pie with <b>peas</b> and new potatoes.</i>
<b>peanut</b>	Pod of the peanut vine containing usually 2 nuts or seeds groundnut and monkey nut are British terms. <i><b>Peanut</b> politicians.</i>
<b>radish</b>	The plant of the cabbage family which yields the radish.



- rice** Force cooked potatoes or other vegetables through a sieve or ricer.  
*Riced* boiled potatoes.
- seed** Of a plant reproduce itself by means of its own seeds.  
*Seed* capsules.
- soybean** The most highly proteinaceous vegetable known the fruit of the soybean plant is used in a variety of foods and as fodder especially as a replacement for animal protein.
- starch** Food containing starch.  
*Crisp linen stiff with starch.*
- tortilla** (in Mexican cooking) a thin, flat pancake made from maize flour, eaten hot or cold, typically with a savoury filling.
- turnip** The European plant of the cabbage family which produces the turnip.
- wheat** Grains of common wheat sometimes cooked whole or cracked as cereal usually ground into flour.
