pragmatical	Of, relating to, or dealing with practice, practicalities, or fact, as opposed to theory, speculation, or ideals; practical, realistic.
real	Coinciding with reality F A Olafson. <i>Life is real Life is earnest.</i>

down-to-earth	Hide in the earth like a hunted animal.
facilitation	Phenomenon that occurs when two or more neural impulses that alone are not enough to trigger a response in a neuron combine to trigger an action potential. <i>The response is dependent on the frequency of stimulation and on neuromuscular facilitation.</i>
feasible	Likely; probable. <i>It is not feasible to put most finds from excavations on public display.</i>
functional	Designed for or capable of a particular function or use. <i>A functional set of brakes.</i>

illiteracy	Ignorance resulting from not reading. <i>His economic illiteracy.</i>
likelihood	The state or fact of something's being likely; probability. <i>Young people who can see no likelihood of finding employment.</i>
positivistic	Of or relating to positivism.
practical	Guided by practical experience and observation rather than theory. <i>He is a very practical person.</i>
pragmatist	A person who takes a practical approach to problems and is concerned primarily with the success or failure of her actions. <i>Hardheaded pragmatists firmly rooted in the real world.</i>
real	Used as intensifiers real is sometimes used informally for really rattling is informal. <i>It s time he had a real job.</i>
realistic	Representing things in a way that is accurate and true to life. <i>The actors tried to create a realistic portrayal of the Africans.</i>
