<b><u>experimental</u></b>	Relating to or based on experiment. <i>An <b>experimental</b> drug.</i>
<b>hands-on</b>	Involving active participation.
<b>hard-nosed</b>	Guided by practical experience and observation rather than theory.
<b>hardheaded</b>	Unreasonably rigid in the face of argument or entreaty or attack. <i>A <b>hardheaded</b> appraisal of our position.</i>
<b>in the field</b>	Currently fashionable.
<b><u>practical</u></b>	Guided by practical experience and observation rather than theory. <i>Neither of these strategies are <b>practical</b> for smaller businesses.</i>
<b>pragmatical</b>	Of, relating to, or dealing with practice, practicalities, or fact, as opposed to theory, speculation, or ideals; practical, realistic.
<b>real</b>	Coinciding with reality F A Olafson. <i>Life is <b>real</b> Life is earnest.</i>

<b>available</b>	Not currently involved in a sexual or romantic relationship. <i>The list of <b>available</b> candidates is unusually long.</i>
<b>conceivably</b>	It is conceivable or imaginable that. <i>It may <b>conceivably</b> cause liver disease.</i>
<b>convenient</b>	Large and roomy convenient is archaic in this sense. <i>The new car park will make shopping much more <b>convenient</b>.</i>
<b>cyberspace</b>	A computer network consisting of a worldwide network of computer networks that use the TCP/IP network protocols to facilitate data transmission and exchange. <i>I stayed in <b>cyberspace</b> for just a few minutes.</i>
<b>down-to-earth</b>	Hide in the earth like a hunted animal.
<b>facilitation</b>	Phenomenon that occurs when two or more neural impulses that alone are not enough to trigger a response in a neuron combine to trigger an action potential. <i>The response is dependent on the frequency of stimulation and on neuromuscular <b>facilitation</b>.</i>
<b>feasible</b>	Likely; probable. <i>It is not <b>feasible</b> to put most finds from excavations on public display.</i>
<b>functional</b>	Designed for or capable of a particular function or use. <i>A <b>functional</b> set of brakes.</i>

<b>illiteracy</b>	Ignorance resulting from not reading. <i>His economic <b>illiteracy</b>.</i>
<b><u>likelihood</u></b>	The state or fact of something's being likely; probability. <i>Young people who can see no <b>likelihood</b> of finding employment.</i>
<b>positivistic</b>	Of or relating to positivism.
<b><u>practical</u></b>	Guided by practical experience and observation rather than theory. <i>He is a very <b>practical</b> person.</i>
<b>pragmatist</b>	A person who takes a practical approach to problems and is concerned primarily with the success or failure of her actions. <i>Hardheaded <b>pragmatists</b> firmly rooted in the real world.</i>
<b>real</b>	Used as intensifiers real is sometimes used informally for really rattling is informal. <i>It s time he had a <b>real</b> job.</i>
<b><u>realistic</u></b>	Representing things in a way that is accurate and true to life. <i>The actors tried to create a <b>realistic</b> portrayal of the Africans.</i>
