| <b>elevator</b>            | A shoe with a raised insole designed to make the wearer appear taller.<br><i>In the harbour a giant <b>elevator</b> stores prairie grain.</i> |
| <a href="#">ennoble</a>    | Lend greater dignity or nobility of character to.<br><i>The theatre is a moral instrument to <b>ennoble</b> the mind.</i>                     |
| <a href="#">escalate</a>   | Make or become more intense or serious.<br><i>The disturbance <b>escalated</b> into a full scale riot.</i>                                    |
| <b>high</b>                | High school.<br><i><b>High</b> summer.</i>  |

| <b>hoist</b>      | Raise.<br><i>They <b>hoisted</b> the patient onto the operating table.</i>  |
| <b>ladder</b>     | With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder.<br><i>One of Sally s stockings developed a <b>ladder</b>.</i>   |
| <b>lift</b>       | A wave that lifts the surface of the water or ground.<br><i>He <b>lifted</b> a war whoop.</i>   |
| <b>mounting</b>   | The action of mounting something.<br><i>He pulled the curtain rail from its <b>mounting</b>.</i>  |
| <b>promote</b>    | Of an additive act as a promoter of a catalyst.<br><i>They are using famous personalities to <b>promote</b> the library nationally.</i>   |
| <b>raise</b>      | Multiply a number by itself a specified number of times 8 is 2 raised to the power 3.<br><i><b>Raise</b> the price of bread.</i>  |
| <b>rise</b>       | Rise in rank or status.<br><i>I gained the crest of a <b>rise</b> and saw the plain stretched out before me.</i>  |
| <b>risen</b>      | (of e.g. celestial bodies) above the horizon.<br><i>The <b>risen</b> sun.</i>   |
| <b>soar</b>       | Fly or rise high in the air.<br><i>When she heard his voice her spirits <b>soared</b>.</i>  |
| <b>soaring</b>    | Ascending to a level markedly higher than the usual.<br><i>The coloured trails of <b>soaring</b> rockets.</i>   |
| <b>stepladder</b> | A short folding ladder with flat steps and a small platform.  |
| <b>surge</b>      | (of a crowd or a natural force) move suddenly and powerfully forward or upward.<br><i>Stimulated a <b>surge</b> of speculation.</i>   |
| <b>up</b>         | Denoting a flavour variety of stable quark having relatively low mass and an electric charge of $\frac{2}{3}$ In the Standard Model protons and neutrons are composed of up and down quarks.<br><i>The corn is <b>up</b>.</i> |
| <b>upgrade</b>    | Rate higher; raise in value or esteem.<br><i>I <b>upgraded</b> to First Class when Coach Class was overbooked.</i>  |
| <b>upsurge</b>    | A sudden or abrupt strong increase.<br><i>An <b>upsurge</b> of emotion.</i>   |
| <b>whizz</b>      | An act of urinating.<br><i><b>Whizz</b> the mixture to a smooth paste.</i>  |
| <b>zoom</b>       | Cause a lens or camera to zoom in or out.<br><i>We watched the fly <b>zooming</b> around.</i>   |
