<u>escalate</u>	Make or become more intense or serious. The disturbance escalate d into a full scale riot.
high	High school. High summer.



<u>hoist</u>	Raise. They hoist ed the patient onto the operating table.
ladder	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. One of Sally s stockings developed a ladder .
lift	A wave that lifts the surface of the water or ground. <i>He</i> lift ed a war whoop.
mounting	The action of mounting something. <i>He pulled the curtain rail from its mounting.</i>
promote	Of an additive act as a promoter of a catalyst. They are using famous personalities to promote the library nationally.
raise	Multiply a number by itself a specified number of times 8 is 2 raised to the power 3. Raise the price of bread.
rise	Rise in rank or status. I gained the crest of a rise and saw the plain stretched out before me.
risen	(of e.g. celestial bodies) above the horizon. <i>The risen sun.</i>
<u>soar</u>	Fly or rise high in the air. When she heard his voice her spirits soar ed.
<u>soaring</u>	Ascending to a level markedly higher than the usual. <i>The coloured trails of soaring rockets.</i>
stepladder	A short folding ladder with flat steps and a small platform.
<u>surge</u>	(of a crowd or a natural force) move suddenly and powerfully forward or upward. Stimulated a surge of speculation.
